


ATHLETIC MEDICINE

Myra Tara serves as the athletic trainer for track and field. Prevention of athletic injuries is the number one goal of the WSU staff, along with care and rehabilitation.

The athletic medicine area includes a certified staff of six full-time trainers, two certified graduate assistants, and more than 40 student trainers majoring in athletic medicine. The staff also includes two physicians, one orthopedic surgeon and numerous area specialists.

When injuries do occur, the Cougar athletic medicine staff provides the very best care and use state-of-the-art equipment to return the student-athlete to 100 percent recovery.





TRAINING FACILITIES

To help Cougar Track and Field athletes achieve their potential, Washington State University provides three major athletic facilities. The WSU Strength and Conditioning, pictured on pages 10-11, is considered one of the top collegiate facilities in the nation. The Cougars train and compete during the winter inside the newly constructed Indoor Practice Facility. The IPF (left) features a state-of-the-art Mondo 14mm Super X track surface with a wide radius 200m track. The Mooberry Track and Field Complex, pictured on the back cover, features recently resurfaced stateof-the-art track, throwing circles and jumping surfaces. The rolling hills on and around the campus provide a great venue for strength and conditioning training in a beautiful environment.
















OUTDOOR RECREATION

Numerous parks, lakes, rivers and outdoor recreation activities, such as Hell's Canyon, Boyer Park, and the Snake River.




Chipman Trail—an 8-mile trail between Pullman and Moscow is a great place to bike, jog, walk and rollerblade.

CONFERENCE OF CHAMPIONS

PACIFIC-10

Washington State University is proud to be a member of the nation's number one conference, the Pacific-10 Conference.

Entering the 2006-07 season, the Pac-10 continues to uphold its tradition as the "Conference of Champions." Pac-10 members have claimed an incredible 138 NCAA team titles over the past 16 seasons; an average of more than eight national championships per academic year. The Pac-10 has now led the nation in NCAA Championships 40 of the last 46 years and finished second five times.

Even more impressive is the breadth of the Pac-10's success, as those 138 team titles have come in 24 different men's and women's sports. Spanning nearly a century of outstanding athletic achievement, the Pac-10 has captured 351 NCAA titles (251 men's, 100 women's), far outdistancing the runner-up Big Ten Conference's 205 titles.

Participation in postseason was a common occurrence for

the Pac-10 in 2005-06. Of the 22 sports

sponsored by the Pac-10, 18 sports had at least half of the conference teams participating in the postseason. The men sent 56 of a possible 92 teams into the postseason (60.8 percent) while the women sent 61 of a possible 100 teams (61 percent) into NCAA Tournament action.

Since the NCAA began conducting women's championships 25 years ago, Pac-10 members have claimed 100 crowns, with at least four national titles in one year on 17 occasions. Pac-10

members have dominated a number of sports, winning 18 softball titles, 17 tennis crowns, 12 of the last 16 volleyball titles, 11 of the last 17 trophies in golf, and eight in swimming
