Elson S. Floyd

President



Elson S. Floyd is Washington State University's 10th president. He took office in May of 2007 after serving as president of the four-campus University of Missouri during 2002-2007.

"Excellence, quality, and accountability" are keystones to his administration leading WSU. He puts high priority on WSU being a research leader and having a global presence. Furthermore, he endorses diversity of thought, opinion, perspective, viewpoints, race and ethnicity as characteristics of a world-class university.

Floyd served as president of Western Michigan University from 1999 to 2002, and held several administrative positions at the University of North Carolina Chapel Hill, including deanships in student affairs and the College of Arts and Sciences.

Previously, he spent two years as executive director of the state of Washington Higher Education Coordinating Board, the agency responsible for statewide coordination, planning, oversight, policy analysis and student financial aid programs for Washington's post-secondary education system. From 1990 to 1993, he served as vice president for student services, vice president for administration and executive vice president at Eastern Washington University.

He began his career in 1978 at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, where he held deanships in the Division of Student Affairs, the General College and the College of Arts and Sciences. From 1988 to 1990, he was assistant vice president for student services for the UNC system office, where he helped develop and articulate student affairs and academic affairs policy for the 16-campus university system.

A native of Henderson, N.C., Floyd holds a bachelor of arts degree in political science and speech, a master of education degree in adult education, and a doctor of philosophy degree in higher and adult education, all from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill.

Floyd and his wife, Carmento Floyd, have two grown children.

Anne McCoy

Senior Associate Director Of Athletics/SWA (Interim Director of Athletics)



Veteran intercollegiate athletics administrator Anne McCoy has served Washington State University since 2001 and was promoted from associate director to senior associate director of athletics in 2004. Her appointment to senior woman administrator came in the summer of 2007.

In her capacity as senior associate director of athletics, she is charged with overseeing all aspects of WSU's athletic budget and supervises several areas with the department including the business office, equipment, computer and football operations, and event management and facility operations. She also serves as a liaison for men's and women's basketball.

McCoy serves on several Pacific-10 Conference committees, including the Senior Woman Administrator and Television Committees and on the Budget and Finance, Compliance and Enforcement,

Diversity Leadership Initiative Review, Awards Review, Medical Care, and Student-Athlete Advisory committees. She has also been appointed the NCAA Women's Rowing Committee and is past vice president of the Pacific-10 Conference.

A Wisconsin native, McCoy earned a bachelor's degree in sports management in 1989 from the University of Massachusetts. While an undergraduate, she worked for the Pittsburgh Penguins professional hockey organization, expanding the club's season ticket base. McCoy also served an internship as the assistant athletic business manager at the University of Connecticut, and was instrumental in designing and implementing a comprehensive computerized budget-tracking system.

McCoy served in several capacities at the University of Maine from 1989-1995, lastly as associate director of athletics and senior woman administrator. At Maine, she supervised men's basketball, men's and women's soccer, men's and women's swimming and softball in addition to the athletic business office, ticket office, retail store and cheerleading staff and operations. She took a similar administrative positive at St. Louis University from 1995-96.

In 1996, McCoy moved west, joining the staff at Portland State University as associate director of athletics and senior woman administrator, and was promoted to senior associate director of athletics in 1998. At PSU, she managed all internal staff and the daily operations of the department, representing the director of athletics as needed. McCoy also supervised men's and women's golf, cross country/track and field, and women's volleyball, soccer, tennis and softball.

Ken Casavant

Faculty Athletics Representative



Professor Ken Casavant, a member of the Washington State University family since 1967, currently serves as WSU's Faculty Athletics Representative to the Pacific-10 Conference and the National Collegiate Athletic Association. He is a past president of the Pac-10 and most recently served on the NCAA Division I Management Council.

Casavant came to WSU as a graduate research assistant in the Department of Agricultural and Resource Economics. He was named an assistant professor in 1971, an associate professor in 1975 and a full professor in 1980.

In 2004, Casavant received the honor of giving the Distinguished Faculty Address, the University's oldest award and also received the Sahlin Excellence in Public Service award for the University. In 1979, Casavant received the R.M. Wade award for

outstanding teacher in the college of agriculture at WSU, and in 1990, he earned the distinguished WSU Faculty of the Year award. Casavant was elected vice-chair (1991-92) and chair (1992-93) of the WSU Faculty Senate and has been accorded the Distinguished Teacher award by the American Agricultural Economics Association. He was named Distinguished Scholar by the Western Agricultural Economics Association in 2003 for his nationally recognized work as a transportation economist.

During his tenure at WSU, Casavant has served as associate director for the Washington State Transportation Center (1984-87) and the interim Vice-Provost for Academic Affairs and interim Vice-Provost for Research (1998).

The North Dakota native is a 1965 graduate of North Dakota State University, where he earned a bachelor's degree in agricultural economics. He received his master's degree from NDSU, followed by a Ph.D., from WSU in 1971.

Our Student-Athlete Development unit initiates support for academic and personal success during on-campus recruiting visits with prospective student-athletes, and continues providing support and services until student-athletes graduate from WSU. Our student-athlete development staff is committed to developing and implementing comprehensive and effective programs to assist student-athletes in identifying and meeting their academic and career goals leading to graduation and career development. We take a "life skills" approach when assisting student-athletes with class selection, major selection, graduation planning, career development, time management, goal setting, study skills, and learning strategies.

Our focus is the student-athlete and her personal development. We reinforce the value of maximizing the educational and career opportunities at WSU. And, most importantly, our staff emphasizes the importance of student-athletes taking personal responsibility and ownership in developing their academic and career plans. Our 93 percent graduation rate for those seniors who have exhausted their eligibility (over the past 10 years), second among all Pacific-10 Conference schools in that time, reflects our consistent commitment to academic success while striking a balance between academics and athletics.





Danny Gourley Academic Counselor

Danny Gourley is the Academic Counselor for the Cougar track and field team., Danny joined the Cougar family in 2005. He also serves as the Academic Resource Center (ARC) Coordinator, supervising and maintaining the ARC in addition to providing academic support to the track and field student-athletes.

Danny's experience in academics began in 1997, and all but two and a half years of his academic counseling have been in athletics. Starting as a tutor for student-athletes at Middle Tennessee State, Danny progressed to Learning Specialist from 1999-2002. After nearly three years of career development serving soldiers as an intern in the Army Continuing Education System, Danny returned to athletics.

Danny graduated from Middle Tennessee State in 1999 with a Bachelor of Arts in English. He completed his Masters in Education with an emphasis in administration of higher education at MTSU in 2002.

The Mission

The academic support services staff provides comprehensive support for all student-athletes. The type and level of programming, monitoring and support provided to each student-athlete is dependent upon the individual needs of each studentathlete, based on the review of existing academic information and academic assessments administered by the academic support services staff and/or University Testing Services. 


Marco Candido, Strength and Conditioning Coach



Pacific-10 Conference – The Conference of Champions

Washington State University is a proud member of the Pacific-10 Conference. The Pac-10 sponsors 11 men's sports and 11 women's sports. Additionally, the Conference is a member of the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation (MPSF) in four other men's sports and three women's sports, including indoor track and field.

Entering the 2009-10 season, the Pacific-10 Conference continues to uphold its tradition as the "Conference of Champions."® Pac-10 members have claimed an incredible 166 NCAA team titles over the past 19 seasons, for an average of nearly nine championships per academic year.

Even more impressive is the breadth of the Pac-10's success, as those 166 team titles have come in 26 different men's and women's sports. The Pac-10 has led the nation in NCAA Championships 43 of the last 49 years and finished second five times.


Spanning nearly a century of outstanding athletics achievement, the Pac-10 has captured 380 NCAA titles (261 men's, 119 women's), far outdistancing the runner-up Big Ten Conference's 222 titles.



The Pac-10 captured the nation's best 11 NCAA team titles in 2008-09. The total does not include a national title in men's rowing, which is not an NCAA event.

Participation in the postseason was a common occurrence for the Conference in 2008-09. Of the 22 sports sponsored by the Pac-10, 18 witnessed at least half its teams participating in NCAA or other postseason action. The men sent 63 of a possible 93 teams into the postseason (67.7 percent), while the women sent 65

of a possible 101 teams (64.4 percent). Seven of the 10 Conference institutions claimed NCAA team titles in 2008-09. The Pac-10 also had runners-up in nine NCAA Championship events. The Pac-10 Conference had 26 teams finish in the top four at the NCAA Championship events.



Head coach Rick Sloan shares a lifetime of passion for track and field with the student-athletes on the men's and women's teams at Washington State University, and they have found success athletically and academically under his tutelage.

A dynamic coach and skilled technician, Sloan and his Cougar coaching staff have searched far and wide to bring the best student-athletes to Pullman, Washington, and then have worked tirelessly to have each one reach their greatest potential.

The programs' continued success is evident in the consistent accomplishments achieved at the Pacific-10 Conference, NCAA West Regional, NCAA Championships and USA Track and Field levels.

WSU brought home 55 All-America certificates during the past eight indoor and outdoor seasons.

In 2009, Jeshua Anderson repeated at the Pac-10, NCAA West Region and NCAA Outdoor intermediate hurdles champion, breaking his own school record with a time of 48.47 seconds. Trent Arrivey (high jump) and Lorraine King (400m hurdles) also climbed to the top of the victor's stand with Pac-10 titles. The Cougar men finished fourth at the conference meet and third at the NCAA West Regional meet.

The 2008 season was highlighted by two Cougar freshmen earning national titles. Ebba Jungmark won the women's high jump gold medal at the NCAA Indoor Championships, clearing 6-feet, 2 1/2 inches which is the second-best height in WSU history. Jeshua Anderson claimed the men's 400m hurdles title at the NCAA Outdoor Championships after grabbing the Pac-10 crown. He also won the US Junior and World Junior gold medals in the intermediate hurdles and claimed the school record with a time of 48.68 seconds.

Jungmark joined another national high jump champion who thrived under Sloan's mentoring, Whitney Evans. Evans won the 2003 outdoor title and earned eight All-America honors making her the most-decorated woman athlete in Washington State University history.

Recognized internationally as a highly successful multi-event coach, Sloan has directed five Cougars to NCAA top finishes in the past seven years including Julie Pickler's second-place finish in the 2007 heptatathlon, Diana Pickler and Julie Pickler with third and fifth-place heptathlon finishes in 2006, and Rickey Moody's eighth place finish in the 2008 decathlon.

As a Head Coach, Sloan has directed 38 WSU athletes to NCAA Outdoor All-American status 67 times, and directed 29 athletes to NCAA Indoor All-American

In his 15 years as the WSU Track Program's mentor, Sloan has seen Cougar men set 13 school records and Cougar women set 41 school records. Additionally, 20 men's freshmen and 39 women's freshmen records have been rewritten in this time frame.

When Sloan was named the head track and field coach at Washington State in June of 1994, he had already invested 21 years of service to the program and the university as an assistant coach.

From 1973 until the summer of 1994, he was an assistant coach, directing WSU athletes in field events, hurdles, sprints, and decathlon.

Sloan came to coach at Washington State after a highly successful competitive career. An outstanding athlete while at UCLA, Sloan became the first Bruin to clear 7-0 in the high jump and was an All-American in the pole vault as an undergraduate.

He captained the Bruin track team as a senior and became the fourth American to surpass 8,000 points in the decathlon. As a 21-year-old, Sloan finished seventh in the decathlon at the 1968 Olympics in Mexico City. A year later he toured Europe with the U.S. National team.

While competing, Sloan held world decathlon records in the pole vault with a height of 16-7, and the high jump with a leap of 6-11 3/4. As a decathlete, he was ranked second in the United States in 1968 and 1969, and ranked 10th in the world in 1969. Sloan's 8,051 points was the fourth best mark in the world in 1969.

This Cougar mentor began his coaching career at California Institute of Technology and at Pasadena City College in 1972. Sloan also coached at Mt. San Antonio Junior College, home of the respected Mt. SAC Relays in Walnut, Calif., before coming to WSU in 1973.

In September of 1994, USA Track and Field accorded Sloan the title of Master Coach, the highest recognition in coaching education.

Sloan is well-known internationally in the decathlon circuits because of his 14 years as coach for four-time world champion, Olympic champion and American record-holder

Sloan is a much sought-after clinician who is the author of Track and Field Techniques and Training, and has produced nine instructional video tapes. He served as the head coach of the U.S.A. decathlon team which competed in the USSR in 1983. In 1988, he conducted clinics for the International Amateur Athletic Federation (IAAF) in Georgetown, Guyana.

In the fall of 2002, Sloan served as an assistant men's coach for the United States team competing at the International Association of Athletics Federation (IAAF) World Cup in Madrid, Spain.

Debra Farwell

Debra Lombardi Farwell, a 1983 Washington State University graduate, joined the WSU coaching staff in the fall of 1995 and the Cougars throwers have stretched the measuring tape ever since. During Farwell's coaching stint 14 school throwing records have been set.

Farwell's corps threw far again in 2009 with Marissa Tschida breaking the women's javelin record with a toss of 181-feet, 8 inches, and Courtney Kirkwood breaking Tschida's freshman school record with a javelin toss of 170-8. Tschida became an All-America with a sixth-place NCAA finish and Matt Lamb added his third discus All-America certificate with his fifth-place NCAA finish.

The previous year, McKenzie Garberg added two All-America certificates to her resume after NCAA finishes of fifth in the discus and sixth in the hammer and shattered the hammer school record by tossing 210-3. Lamb did not throw during the season but reached a discus PR of 204-7 and won the NACAC U-23 title. Phil MacArthur also broke the 200-foot barrier with a hammer throw of 202-10.

Farwell coached eight-time All-American thrower Ian Waltz throughout his collegiate career as Waltz rewrote Cougar history in the shot put and discus events. Waltz was a member of the 2004 and 2008 US Olympic Teams. He won the discus at the 2008 Trials. Farwell has had two athletes win Pacific-10 championships: in 1999 Waltz won the discus and Molly Monroe won the women's javelin crown. Andrea Thornton achieved All-America status in both the outdoor discus and hammer events in 2001 while Tim Gehring (shot put) and Curt Borland (javelin) earned All-America certificates in 2004. Gehring finished 15th in shot at the 2004 US Olympic Trials. Javelin thrower Jenna Dean broke the school record with a toss of 169-7 in 2005.

Originally from Renton, Wash., Farwell held the WSU women's outdoor shot put record of 14.70m/48-2 3/4 from 1981-86. She was an AIAW national qualifier in the shot put in 1982.

Farwell was also a pioneer in the woman's hammer thrower as one of four Cougars competing against two women from the University of Montana in the first collegiate women's dual meet hammer throw event in Pullman on March 27, 1982. She threw a 35.74m/117-3 on that day and the following week set an unofficial collegiate women's world record of 38.34m/125-9 in Eugene, Ore. In 1994, the NCAA added the women's hammer throw as an official event for the 1995 season.

Farwell was a graduate assistant coach for the WSU track and field program from 1983-86 under head coaches Jessica and Rob Cassleman. She also was a teaching assistant in the WSU physical education department in 1985, instructing beginning weight training and conditioning, and field event classes.

From 1987-91, Farwell served as an assistant track and field coach at the University of Iowa where she was responsible for coaching the throwers along with the multi-event athletes and developing a strength and conditioning program for all track athletes. She received her USATF certification for levels I and II in 1990 at the U.S. Olympic Training Center in Colorado.

Farwell was the assistant track and field coach and exercise science and sport activity instructor at Penn State University in 1994-95.

Farwell is a 2007 graduate of the NCAA Women's Coaches Academy. Also committed to community involvement, the Cougar throwers have washed cars and raised over \$10,000 to donate to local community members in need in the past eight years.

Farwell and her husband George enjoy the company of their two dogs, Wolfie and Fergie.

Pete Julian joined the Cougar track and cross country coaching staff in August 2009 after a highly successful career as a collegiate coach and professional athlete and coach. Julian coaches the men and women middle distance, distance and cross country runners at WSU.

In his first cross country season, the WSU men's team placed seventh at the prestigious Pre-Nationals meet in Terre Haute and received a national ranking for the first time since 2003. The team finished a disappointing sixth at the Pac-10 Championships but the new training routine shows great promise for outstanding results during the 2010 winter and spring track and cross country seasons.

Cougar senior Lisa Egami finished 11th at the 2009 NCAA West Regional Cross Country Championships and advanced to the NCAA Championships, the first time in four years a WSU woman had competed at the national meet.

Julian came to WSU from Metropolitan State College of Denver where he served four seasons as the men's and women's cross country head coach and three seasons as the men's and women's track and field head coach. In 2008-09, he directed the Metro State men's teams to high finishes in the NCAA Div. II Championships: 10th in the Indoor, 16th in the Outdoor and 14th in Cross Country. The Roadrunners' women's cross country team placed 19th nationally last fall. Under Julian's tutelage, Metro State produced the national 2009 DII indoor and outdoor champion in the men's 800m, Anthony Luna, who ran a school record time of 1:47.90. During Julian's tenure Metro State garnered 11 NCAA All-America distance honors and 37 Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference honors for sprints, jumps, distance and relays. The Metro State men's track team also received national academic honors from the United States Track & Field/Cross Country Coaches Association (USTFCCCA), finishing in the DII top 20 this year for team grade point average.

For the past three years Julian has also been the director of Tempo Sports, the official distance center of USA Track & Field, in Boulder, Colo., managing and coordinating the elite distance training group. In the summer of 2008, Julian was an assistant coach for the Nike Oregon Project where he assisted world-class athletes leading up to the 2008 Olympic Trials. In 2007 he served as the director of the USA Cross Country Championships and World Team Trials, also in Boulder.

An Oregon native, Julian graduated from Ashland High where he ran for his father, Bob Julian, on the Oregon state high school championship team. He earned four All-America certificates at the University of Portland: three in track and became the first Pilot in school history to earn one in cross country. After graduating with a degree in communications management, Julian spent over 10 years racing professionally in track and road races as a member of Team adidas. He was a member of the United States World Cross Country team in 1997 and 1998, running personal-best times of 3:42 in the 1500m, 13:33 in the 5000m, and 28:05 in the 10,000m. Julian captured the bronze medalist in the 10,000m at the 1999 Pan American Games, and was a finalist in the 10k at the IAAF World Championships in Seville, Spain, that same year.

Prior to Metro State, Julian was a volunteer assistant coach and recruiting coordinator for the cross country programs and Santa Clara University and Regis University (Denver).

Julian is married to Colleen Glyde Julian, a former All-American distance runner at the University of Colorado who has a PhD in medical anthropology and is currently serving a fellowship with the Colorado Altitude Research Center in Denver, Colo. The Julians have a son named Wade, in addition to pet companions, Boise, a cat, and Miles, a dog.

Mark Macdonald coached student-athletes to banner years in 2008 and 2009. Jeshua Anderson won back-to-back Pac-10, NCAA West Regional and NCAA titles, as well as the USA Junior and World Junior intermediate hurdles crowns. Anna Layman placed eighth in the 800m at the 2008 NCAA Championships and Lorraine King captured the 2009 Pac-10 women's intermediate hurdles title. Four of the eight men scorers in the 400m hurdles at the 2009 Pac-10 Championships were Cougars.

Macdonald was an outstanding Cougar track and field student-athlete who now coaches the hurdlers and sprinters, and serves as the program's recruiting coordinator. He was named the 2009 USTFCCCAWest Region men's team Assistant Track Coach of the Year. He is credited with bringing in back-to-back women's recruiting classes ranked among the top ten nationally by Track & Field News. In the past six years, WSU's recruiting classes have included 77 state or junior college champions.

WSU had three consecutive champions in the Pac-10 men's 100m dash including two-time champ and 2004 US Olympic Trials competitor Anthony Buchanan (2003, 2004), and 2004 and 2008 Canadian Olympian Anson Henry (2002). Macdonald coached Ellannee Richardson in her transition from heptathlon to the 400m hurdles where she achieved a PR of 55.61 and finished ninth at the 2004 Olympic Trials. He also coached former USA record-holder Dominique Arnold to the men's 110m hurdles title at the 1996 NCAA Outdoor Championships, and Arend Watkins to two top-eight national finishes. Two-time All-American intermediate hurdler Eric Dudley, the 2003 CoSIDA/Verizon Track & Field Academic All-American of the Year, competed in both the 2004 and 2008 US Olympic Trials.

At the 2001 NCAA Outdoor Championships, Macdonald had Cougars competing in all four hurdles events - the only Division I program to accomplish that feat.

He also directed the school's record-holders in the women's 4x100m relay team - Attrina Higgins, LaTroya Mucker, Ellannee Richardson and Francesca Green - to a 44.50 time to win the title at 1999 at the Pac-10 Meet. The 2003 4x400m relay team of Tiffany Giles, Monique Jessie, Angelita Green and Ellannee Richardson set the school indoor record of 3:35.49 and finished seventh at the NCAAs. With Tamara Gulley running in place of Green that same year, the relay set the WSU outdoor record of 3:33.65.

Macdonald protégé Randi Smith finished second in the women's 400m hurdles at the 2000 USATF Junior National Championships with a school record time of 57.07 which was also the fifth-fastest time in the world that year for a junior competitor (ages 14-19).

After a successful prep career as a multi-sport athlete at Bethel High School where his father Mike was the track and field coach, Macdonald achieved All-America status as an intermediate hurdler at Washington State. Macdonald's 400m hurdles seventh place finish in the 1992 NCAA Championships at Austin, Texas, was his third appearance at a national championship.

He served as the team captain of WSU's 1992 National Dual Meet Champion squad and competed in the 400m hurdles at the 1992 U.S. Olympic Trials. Macdonald was twice named to the All-Pac-10 Academic Track and Field Team and honored as WSU's Pac-10 1992 Conference Medal Winner.

Macdonald graduated from WSU with a B.A. in Social Studies Education in 1992. He completed his master's degree in Athletic Administration in 1993.



Ellannee Richardson

Ellannee Richardson's calm and quiet demeanor contradicts her fierce competitive spirit. She is achieving prominence as a Cougar coach just as she did as a student-athlete and instilling that same competitive fire in her sprint and relay runners.

Richardson joined the WSU Track & Field coaching staff as a fulltime assistant in 2003 after an illustrious athletic and academic career as a student-athlete and works with assistant coach Mark Macdonald in the sprints, hurdles and relays.

In 2009 the men's 4x400m relay team of Barry Leavitt, Reny Follett, Justin Woods and Jeshua Anderson ran a school indoor record time of 3:06.74 and took eighth place at the NCAA Indoor Championships. This same foursome ran an outdoor time of 3:07.47 in 2008, sixth-best in WSU all-time records and earned a trip to the NCAA Championships. Woods was the 200m winner and 100m runner-up at the NCAA West Regional meet.

Richardson was named the U.S. Track & Field and Cross Country Coaches Association (USTFCCCA) West Region men's sprints/hurdles 2006 Coach of the Year. That year James McSwain, Jaycee Robertson, Justin Woods and Martin Boston advanced to the NCAA Championships in the sprints and 4x100m relay.

In addition to her coaching duties, Richardson finished fifth in the 400m dash at the 2004 USA Indoor Track & Field Championships and competed on the USA National Indoor Track and Field 4x400m relay at the IAAF World Indoor Championships at Budapest, Hungary. At the 2004 US Olympic Trials, she missed the 400m hurdles final after running a PR time of 55.61 in the prelims and 56.27 in the semifinals, just 24/100s of a second from qualifying for the final.

Richardson was a five-time All-American heptathlete and sprinter at WSU. She is a four-time All-America heptathlete taking second place at the 2003 and 2002 NCAA Championships and earned an All-America certificate at the 2003 NCAA Indoor Meet anchoring the women's 4x400m relay to seventh place with a school-record time of 3:35.49. She also anchored the 1600m relay to a school record outdoor time of 3:33.65 for second place at the NCAA West Regional and a trip to the national meet with teammates Tiffany Giles, Monique Jessie and Tamara Gulley.

Richardson currently holds school records in the 400m relay (44.50), 1600m relay for indoor and outdoor races, but during her career also reached school records in the heptathlon, 100m hurdles and the indoor 400m dash. In WSU all-time records, Richardson's performances are in the top five in eight different events and eighth in the long jump. A three-time Pac-10 heptathlon champion, Richardson was ranked as the third-best heptathlete (top collegiate) in the United States in 2003 by *Track & Field News*.

She garnered these awards in 2003: WSU's Pac-10 Medal Winner, Cougar Pride Academic Salute Trophy, Senior Excellence in Academics, Pac-10 Postgraduate Scholarship, Arthur Ashe Jr. Sports Scholar First Team, NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship, nominee for NCAA Woman of the Year, and Verizon/CoSIDA National Academic All-American second team. A 2002 WSU graduate with a B.A. in sociology, Richardson completed her master's degree in criminal justice in 2007.

WSU has one of the most outstanding traditions in the jumping events in the country with top 10 lists that are truly remarkable. During the past four seasons under Coach Matthew McGee the WSU jumpers have continued to build upon that great tradition.

Under McGee's guidance 2009 was another outstanding year for the WSU jumps group. The men's high jump group was arguably the best in the entire NCAA with 3 seven foot jumpers in Trent Arrivey 7-4 1/2 (2.25m), Shawn Swartz 7-0 1/2 (2.15m), and Ryan Deese 7-0 1/4 (2.14m). Arrivey is now a three-time All-American earning honors at both the NCAA indoor and outdoor championships. He also won the 2009 Pac-10 title to go with the NCAA West Regional title he won in 2008. In the women's pole vault, Kendall Mays and Alexa Huestis became 13 foot plus vaulters with Mays clearing 13-5 1/4 (4.10m) and Huestis 13-0 1/4 (3.97m). For the third consecutive year WSU had three women over 40 feet in the triple jump in Sarah Burns, Candace Missouri, and Jessica Yates.

The 2007 season McGee's first responsible for all four jumping events was highlighted by pole vaulter Tyson Byers' improvement to 18-1/2 placing third at the NCAA indoor championships earning All-American honors.

Moreno Zapata and Trent Arrivey both placed in the top three at the Pac-10 Championships. Zapata finished second in the triple jump at the NCAA West Regional championships improving to a best of 51-9 1/4 earning a trip to the NCAA outdoor championships. Also the first time in school history, WSU had three women over 40-feet in the triple jump with Sarah Burns at 41-5, Catie Schuetzle at 41-3 1/4, and Kaylee Gardner at 40-10 1/4. All three advanced to the NCAA West Regional Championships.

In 2006 McGee was responsible for coaching the WSU high jumpers. Three of the four high jumpers on the team scored at the Pac-10 Championships and sophomore McKinnon Hanson also advanced to the NCAA outdoor Championships.

He was promoted to a fulltime assistant coaching position in the summer of 2005 after spending the previous year as a volunteer.

A former Cougar, McGee returned to WSU after spending 2003-2004 season as an assistant track and field coach at Diablo Valley College where he was responsible for jumps, throws, and multis, in addition to developing the strength conditioning program.

developing the strength conditioning program.

Born in San Francisco California, McGee attended College of Marin and Diablo Valley College in the Bay Area, competing as a decathlete.

He transferred to WSU and walked-on the team as a junior. He excelled as a javelin thrower and was a two time Pac-10 scorer highlighted by a second place finish in the javelin at the 2003 Pac-10 Championships.

McGee graduated in May 2003 with a B.A. in philosophy. He was named to the Pac-10 All-Academic and Arthur Ashe, Jr. Sports Scholar second team and awarded a Pac-10 post-graduate scholarship.

McGee is married to former Cougar teammate and pole vaulter Karla McGee, they have one son, Liam, and a daughter, Kaiya.

2010 WASHINGTON STATE MEN'S TRACK & FIELD

he 2010 Cougar men's track and field team is a very exciting proposition for Head Coach Rick Sloan, in his 16th season at the helm and 37th season with the program, and his staff.

"I thought we had an outstanding year last year, finishing fourth in a very competitive conference championship and then come back two weeks later and take third in the NCAA West Regional Championship," Sloan said.

While some of the strong contributors to those results, Justin Woods, Robert Williams, Barry Leavitt, and Moreno Zapata, have graduated, there are a number of strong returnees and some newcomers expected to have an impact.

"I think that what with who we have coming back this year, and the addition of talented newcomers, that we'll be that good again and maybe a little bit better," Sloan predicts.

Two-time national intermediate hurdles champion Jeshua Anderson returns for his junior year. A pair of three-time All-Americans in high jumper Trent Arrivey and discus thrower Matt Lamb are all threats to win national championships and would be a potential of 30 team points.

Other Cougars with national meet point-accumulating abilities include sophomore Joe Abbott, the 2009 USA Junior Championship men's 800m gold medal winner. Senior Reny Follett joins Anderson with indoor All-American honors for the 4x400m relay and the potential to rebuild another national caliber squad. Seniors Sam Ahlbeck in the steeplechase and Luke Lemenager in the 1500m have an opportunity to develop and get to the national championship.

"If you can get to the NCAA and get to the final, you have the opportunity to strongly contribute to team success," Sloan said. "Too often we treat the nationals as an individual competition because we have not recently been a threat as a team. I think a goal for the 2010 team is that we want to come home with a trophy, which is a top four finish. That is a big goal but one that we can attain if we have people performing to their capabilities. I think we can accomplish it."

SPRINTS/RELAYS

Four-time NCAA competitor Justin Woods has graduated and Sloan acknowledges that the team will have to work hard to replace him but there are many waiting in the wings to try.

"We could count on Justin in big meet competitions to really perform up," Sloan said. "A lot of our success as a men's team last year was because of him in the relays and in the 100m and 200m. We're going to miss him."

Junior Marlon Murray is the top candidate to step into Woods' shoes. Murray had a good 2009 season in spite of constantly battling with hamstring and other injuries which kept him from competing at the NCAA Championships. Sloan points out that Coach Ellannee Richardson will be working to maintain a delicate balance to make sure that Murray is fit and ready to race but not in a position to reinjure himself.

Freshman Brett Blanshan, a prep state sprint champion in 2009, shows tremendous promise. Junior college transfer Nate Washington joined the team in January but should be ready to contribute during the spring. Sophomore Ezra John Griffey had a down season last year coming off a high school injury, but is beginning to show his strength and confidence again so fast times may be on the horizon. Freshman Greg

Hornsby provides the Cougs a great range from 10.69 to 21.41 and has run a 47.2 split time in the 1600m relay. Sloan considers Hornsby a top candidate to replicate Woods in the two shorts sprints and both relays but will have to work to achieve Woods' level of accomplishment

Junior Andre Jennings has also battled hamstring problems his entire career but is starting the season performing well. Senior Devin Giles, an accomplished prep runner who has been on the Cougar football team, is somewhat an unknown but Sloan said Giles has looked impressive in early training. Freshman Wesley McCann needs to show a strong level of improvement in order to contribute to the team this season.

In the 400m dash, Jeshua Anderson is the top returning time but the true quartermiler is senior Reny Follett.

"Reny is off to his best season ever. He is the team captain and has been a leader in the fall training, performing at the front of the pack in every workout," Sloan said.

Transfer Ryan Barrett joined the team in January and brings a 47.99 time from Clark Community College.

"We will have a good, solid 4x400m relay team and the 4x100m relay should be another sub-40 seconds team," Sloan predicted. "For us to return to the NCAA Championships we will need Hornsby, Bar-

rett, Joe Abbott, or someone to become a 46-seconds split runner. With the strong legs Jesh and Reny bring, tack on another high 46 and then maybe a mid to low 47 leg and we hopefully will be back in the show and All-America again."

MIDDLE DISTANCE/DISTANCE/ STEEPLECHASE

The 800m is a very strong area for the Cougars. Sophomore Joe Abbott was the 2009 USA Junior Champion after really coming on late in the season and running twice under 1:50. Senior Luke Lemenager, along with redshirt freshman Jason Stoker can contribute in this event.

The 1500m event is one of concern for the Cougars because there isn't a true miler on the team: most of the runners are either moving up from the 800m or down from the steeplechase to compete. Redshirt sophomores David Hickerson and Peter Miller will have to drop 10 seconds off their times to be competitive in the conference meet in this event. Sloan praises Coach Pete Julian as a remarkable tactician and developer, and is confident these runners will all improve and can be the 3:45 guy the team needs.

In the 3k, 5k, and 10k races, seniors Dominic Smargiassi and Mark Moeller and junior Dan Geib are the strongest returning competitors. Redshirt freshman Jono Lafler is coming off a very good cross country season and could compete anywhere from the mile to 5000m. Sophomore Justin Englund led the team at the NCAA West Regional cross country meet this year. His controlled stride pattern pleases Sloan and his progress will assist the Cougs in making an impact in the longer distances this year. The coaches also have high hopes for incoming freshmen Andrew Kimpel and Andrew Gonzales and their development as 5k and 10k runners.

Senior Sam Ahlbeck is coming off an

NCAA steeplechase competition last spring and a strong cross country season last fall. Sloan thinks Ahlbeck is ready to drop his time and become an All-American. Hickerson has run a competitive steeplechase but the Cougars are lacking depth in this event.

"We have a great steeplechase frontrunner in Sam but do not have a lot of depth in this event until we identify some additional runners as the season progresses," Sloan said.

HURDLES/STEEPLECHASE

Junior Jeshua Anderson, the two-time Pac-10 and NCAA intermediate hurdles champion and an indoor All-American on the relay team, left the football team but added another event to repertoire this season; the high hurdles, where the Cougars do not have a lot of depth.

"I think Jesh will have an outstanding year running the high hurdles this year," Sloan said. "He is showing good progress in his training, still needs to work on his start, but should perform well indoors and out. We already know what he can do in the intermediate hurdles."

Decathletes Kyle Schauble, Sean Harris and 6-6 freshman Ramsey Hopkins can contribute in the highs when not performing in the combined events.

In the 400m hurdles, sophomore J Hopkins is coming off a great 2009 season and will be a terrific number-two guy to Anderson this year. Freshman Dana Wells is the newest in a long line of Washington high school hurdlers who have come to WSU, developed, and run well in the intermediates.

IUMPS


The high jump is a very strong area for the WSU men this season with great top jumpers. Three-time All-American senior Trent Arrivey brings a PR of 7-4 1/2 from 2009 and looks to continue leaping to new levels in 2010. Junior Ryan Deese cleared 7-feet during the '09 indoor season and has the talent and ability to be a high scorer in the Pac-10 and NCAA meets but needs to establish more consistency in his performances. Redshirt freshman Ross VanZanten competed indoors last year but had to have foot surgery so missed the outdoor season. Happily, he has fully recovered and Coach Matt McGee and Sloan agree VanZanten is someone who will surprise those who follow Cougar track

Sophomore Jake Baertlein is the Cougars' top returning pole vaulter. Joining him is a trio of 15-foot vaulters in freshman John Brenteson, sophomore Adam Neace, and redshirt sophomore Trevor Sodorff. Sloan

wants to see all vaulters make significant strides in their development in order to help the team at any level of competition but especially in the Pac-10, which is very strong in the vault.


In the long jump and triple jump, Stephan Scott-Ellis is a 6-6 freshman who has leaped 23-10 in the long and 50-5 in the

triple. He could be a very strong contributor at the Pac-10 level for the Cougs this year and in time at the NCAA level. "We're excited about having Stephan on the team and are looking forward to him doing great things," Sloan said.

Decathlete Kyle Schauble is the back-up in the long jump with a best leap of 23-2. Sophomore Sean Wilson did a great job in the triple jump at the end of last year, coming off a knee surgery, and has looked strong in fall training. Sloan is hoping to see Wilson reach over 50-feet this spring.

THROWS

The discus will be led by three-time All-American discus thrower Matt Lamb, a fifth-year senior with 204-7 lifetime best is one of the strongest competitors on the entire team. "We depend on Matt to aid in our team's success. His maturity and experience makes him that much more valuable in the big scoring meets."

Lamb also has the best returning mark on the team in the shot put but will rarely put the shot this season. Joe Bartlett was in a transition year as a freshman in 2009, learning new techniques which he brings to his sophomore campaign which should be very successful. Bartlett threw the shot put 54-9 1/2 and the discus 160-3 last year but will make the adjustments and start throwing at

a much higher level in 2010. The mid-season arrival of jaycee transfer Jacob Weintraub will add depth to Coach Debra Farwell's squad. The 6-5 Weintraub has thrown 57-2 1/4 in the shot and 158-5 in the discus.

Redshirt junior Mark Presby topped 200-feet in the javelin last year with his PR toss of 203-9 and is the top returning spear-thrower for the Cougs. Freshman Kyle Stevens, who was coached by former Cougar All-American javelin thrower Jan Johansson at Mount Si High School, has shown a lot of potential. Sloan is impressed with Stevens' frame and lever system, and the noticeable improvement he made over the summer. Though not deep the Cougars should score well in the javelin.

DECATHLON

Senior Kyle Schauble will have the impetus to do well in his final year of competition in the Cougar uniform. Schauble reached PRs in the 110m hurdles, pole vault and shot put in 2009 and will work to reach a scoring spot at the conference meet.

Sean Harris has shown a tremendous

amount of improvement in his sophomore season, according to Sloan. Harris is much stronger and faster than he was as a freshman in 2009, and understands the intricacies of the combined events. Freshman Ramsey Hopkins is new to the decathlon but possesses some of the needed parts already. At 6-6 and 200-pounds, Hopkins has very good

athletic talent but needs to take the time and opportunity to learn the techniques of all 10 events. Sloan thinks he has the physical skills but has to understand how to do the different events, and the whole concept of the decathlon.

2010 WASHINGTON STATE WOMEN'S TRACK & FIELD

he Washington State women's track and field team returns two All-Americans, three NCAA outdoor participants and nine scorers from the 2009 Pacific-10 Conference Championships. Not a bad lineup for a team with just three senior members.

"We are looking to be better than we were last year," Cougar Head Coach Rick Sloan said. "We had a few star performers and some very big highlights during the 2009 season, especially at the Pac-10s and the Regionals. We have some very talented women on our team that are going to help carry us. We were very young last year - a freshman and sophomore dominated team - and we need those people to improve their level of performance for us to improve as a team."

Look for strong seasons from All-Americans Anna Layman (800m, 8th 2008) and Marissa Tschida (javelin, 6th, 2009) as well as 2009 NCAA track and cross country participant Lisa Egami (1500m). Other Pac-10 scorers returning for 2010

include senior sprinter Princess Joy Griffey, junior triple jumper Candace Missouri, and sophomore throwers Jennifer Hamilton (javelin), Kjirsten Jensen (hammer), Ashley Kenney (discus), and Courtney Kirkwood (javelin).

The Cougars will rely on newcomers to make an immediate impact. Freshmen Holly Parent and Christine Rice (high jump), Shaquana Logan (hurdles), and Shawna Fermin (400m), and transfer Devin Brooks (hurdles) bring impressive past performances to the squad.

"The new people need to get on board very quickly and hit the ground running. They need to contribute now," Sloan said. "I still think we are a work in progress but I think we have people on the team who can get the job done. We just need to keep moving them forward in their development. I am excited that we have talented people, but they need to continue to develop and they must take ownership of the outcome of this season."

SPRINTS/RELAYS


Leading the way in the sprints and relays is senior Princess Joy Griffey, coming off a great 2009 season with outstanding Pac-10 (PR 11.58, 4th 100m; PR 24.04 200m) and Regional performances.

"I think we will see further improvement from Princess Joy this year and I think we will see her 200m time drop down to a solid 23-seconds mark," Sloan said. "She has had a great fall of training and is stronger right now than she's ever been. I anticipate her greatest season ever."

Sophomore Morgan Clem is second on the depth chart with a 11.90 100m dash and will mix in some of the relays and sprints but she will emphasize hurdles more this season. Likewise, freshman heptathlete Jasmine Johnson-McKeown has run some credible times in the 100m and the 200m but will concentrate on the combined events. Freshman Cindy Robinson had solid marks in high school at 11.96 and 24.32 and will transition to collegiate-level training and competition.

In the long sprint, the 400m, freshman Shawna Fermin is a low-55-seconds quartermiler who can provide a solid performance to the event. Sophomore Brianne Brown showed tremendously improved strength from last season and had a solid fall of training. Redshirt freshman Jacki Hill is also more fit and performing at a higher level this year.

Coach Sloan expects both relay teams to be comprised of several different combinations of people until the best squads become evident. The 4x100m relay may see sprinters, hurdlers and heptathletes in the rotation while the 4x400m relay will see runners moving up and down in distance to comprise the squad. Anna Layman, an 800m-specialist who mainly trains with the hurdlers, is the secondfastest 400m runner on the team, and Griffey is the third-fastest. Sloan said while they will not see much action in the open 400m, both Layman and Griffey will see duty on the relay.

MIDDLE DISTANCE/DISTANCE

The 800m could be a very strong area for WSU with All-American Anna Layman and NCAA track and cross country participant Lisa Egami. Layman looks to pull together an entire spring of healthy competition and top her 2008 time of 2:04.03. Egami is coming off a great spring of incredible racing and a highly competitive season in the 800m and the 1500m, setting the school indoor record in the mile (4:44.92i), taking third in the 1500m at the NCAA West Regional and advancing to the national meet. She carried that into a solid cross country season, finishing 11th in the NCAA West Regional and making it to the national championship.

"I am looking for Lisa to have a really outstanding year," Sloan said. "Coach Pete Julian wants to have her run in some 5k races this season as well as the middle distances, thinking that with her speed and her work in cross country, that might be the race to have her make her mark on the national scene."

Freshman Courtney Zalud is a Cougar to pay attention to in the 800m and 1500m. Although she missed time training and competing during the cross country season due to headaches, Zalud showed the capability of being a top-five scorer for the team. She is considered a very talented runner with good speed and can develop at the college level. Another freshman, Caroline Austin, had a solid cross country season but is more a middle distance than long distance runner. In addition to racing in the 800m and 1500m events, Austin will be introduced to the 3000m steeplechase to see what event fits her best.

While Egami is clearly the 1500m leader, the Cougs have plenty of depth in the event but will need one or more individuals to show a dramatic improvement to be competitive at the Pac-10 level.

The distance corps is thin this season with the top returning Cougars in the 3k, 5k and 10k distances being junior Amanda Andrews and sophomore Michelly Foley. Foley missed the cross country season with foot issues but has resumed training, stronger and more athletic than last year and should be a contributor in the longest races at the Pac-10 level and hopefully beyond. Andrews will mainly concentrate on the steeplechase again this year.

HURDLES/STEEPLECHASE

While the Cougars are without an "ace" in the 100m hurdles, there is solid depth in this event. The only hurdler to run under 14-seconds is transfer Devin Brooks, with a 13.86 time at New Mexico State, and to be under 14-seconds is a goal for the rest of the team in order to score at the Pac-10 meet. Junior heptathlete Angela Jensen, junior Jalissa Williams, and freshman Shaquana Logan, a state champion in both the high and intermediate hurdles, will be expected to elevate their racing and lower their times.

"I'm looking for improvement from all of our hurdlers," Sloan said. "We'll see how the new people adapt to our training with the goal of getting them under 14-seconds on a consistent basis."

The 2009 Pac-10 intermediate hurdles champion Lorraine King has graduated leaving an opening for someone to step up and lead this event. After a great freshman year, junior Veronica Elseroad-Wall has produced solid fall training and the results should be evident in the spring. Sophomore Morgan Clem is penciled into some of the relays

and sprints but she will emphasize hurdles more in 2010 and Coach Mark Macdonald is excited about her potential in both the intermediates and in the highs as well. Logan, sophomore Brittnay Crabb and junior Caroline Hedel should make the intermediate hurdles a strong area for the Cougar women.

"Like the high hurdles, there are a lot of quality hurdlers with nobody standing out as the ace," Sloan said. "Hopefully we get one or two or more of these athletes to really make some progress and put themselves in a position to score at the Pac-10s."

Junior Amanda Andrews is the leading steeplechase returnee, with her PR time of 10:35.28 being the fifth-best in school history. Sophomore Emily Farrar also returns after a solid 2009 season. Freshman Caroline Austin will be introduced to the 3000m steeplechase as will frosh Alyssa Andrews if she can fully recover from the back issues that forced a medical hardship during the cross country season.

2010 Women's Outlook

JUMPS

The high jump is a strong area for the Cougar women this year. The excitement is from the arrival of freshmen Holly Parent (5-10 3/4) and Christine Rice (5-10). Parent, from British Columbia, has international experience while Rice attended the WSU Track summer camp and the coaches observed her skills as a prep jumper. Redshirt sophomores Maria Creech and Amanda Stewart cleared 5-7 in 2009 and give the team good depth in the event.

"We have been good in the high jump in the last decade at both the Pac-10 and national levels. In the Pac-10, if you can jump 5-10 on a consistent basis, you're going to score points for your team," Sloan said. "Coach Matt McGee has established a solid high jump corps."

Redshirt junior pole vaulter Kendall Mays did not compete during the 2009 outdoor

season last year after a very strong indoor season. Mays, who cleared 13-5 1/4 indoors, could not train regularly because of pain in her shins. This year she back to the regular training regime and feels she is coming along quickly with her technique. Add in junior Alexa Huestis, who jumped 13-0 1/4 last year, and the pole vault has a very strong one-two punch this year. Redshirt sophomore Hilary Moore showed a lot of progress last year and came close to clearing a regional qualifying mark on several occasions.

The long and triple jumps have a brief list of competitors this season. Junior Candace Missouri suffered with Graves disease during the fall so her training is going slowly so that she can regain her strength. Missouri is the only Cougar long and triple jumper with collegiate experience. Freshman quartermiler Shawna Fermin was a prep long jumper and

redshirt sophomore Kimika Rozier, over from the volleyball team, was a high school triple jumper.

THROWS

The majority of the Cougar women throwers were inexperienced last season but they certainly provided the team highlights for the year. The four events roster for 2010 includes one junior, five sophomores and a freshman.


The javelin is an event the Cougars are extremely strong in but Sloan wants to see more consistency at the upper distances. Junior Marissa Tschida produced a great 2009 season and returns with All-America honors in the javelin after a sixth-place NCAA finish and the school record of 181-8. Sophomore Courtney Kirkwood tossed the school freshman javelin record of 170-8 last year. Sophomore Jennifer Hamilton had a great season in the javelin (157-0) and showed signs of being a very good shot putter (44-4 1/4i).

"Coach Debra Farwell continues to develop the ballistic qualities of Jennifer's throw. I think she has as much going for her as Cougar All-Americans Andrea Thornton and McKenzie Garberg," Sloan said. "Jennifer is athletic, light on her feet and has the tools to throw the shot over 50-feet in her career."

Ashley Kenney adjusted well to collegiate competition and had a great freshman season last year with a discus PR of 161-8 and scored in the Pac-10 Championships. Sloan predicts she will reach the 170-foot mark and beyond in the future.

The hammer throw was a surprising bright spot in 2009 as two first-time throwers, Kjirsten Jensen and Cassie Whitfield, learned the event from the ground up and made significant progress. Jensen's strength helped to propell her to a 174-2 distance. Whitfield's height and range allow her to really extend the ball out when she turns and she consistently finishes well.

"I felt Cassie and Kjirsten could become good throwers. Under Coach Farwell's tutelage, both will continue to develop and be a strong one-two punch for us," Sloan said.

Junior Angela Jensen displayed strong developmental strides, that Sloan had been looking for, at the Pac-10 Championships. She competed very well during the second day with PRs in 100m hurdles, 200m, long jump, javelin, and 800m. Freshman Jasmine

Johnson-McKeown is a raw novice at the combined events. Sloan calls her an "explosive athlete" and is impressed by her strength and excellent speed and is very powerful as is evidenced by her discus throw of 140-feet in high school.

For each individual event contested at each of the Championship Preliminary Round competitions, the top 48 declared student-athletes will be accepted into the competition. For each relay event contested at each of the Championship Preliminary Round competitions, the top 24 declared relay teams will be accepted into the competition. The stated maximums are absolute and will not be extended as a result of ties.

The Heptathlon and Decathlon events are not contested during the Preliminary Round of Championship competition at the Preliminary Round sites. Qualification to the Championship in these two events is accomplished through a competitor's position on the national descending order list. The top 24 declared student-athletes in each of these two events will be accepted into the competition. Declaration for these two events is completed during the one and only declaration period, which is prior to the Preliminary Round of Championship competition.



CROSS COUNTRY





n crisp fall mornings, along the farm roads of the Palouse, you will likely find the Washington State distance squad out for their weekly long run. Some of the greatest names in cross-country and distance running have left their footprints on the dirt roads surrounding Pullman, Washington.

The infamous Lindgren's Loop is a hilly ten-mile loop from campus and local legend has it that one of America's greatest distance runners of all time, Gerry Lindgren, ran this loop three times a day while a student-athlete at Washington State. Others soon followed in Lindgren's footsteps including NCAA Champions John Ngeno, Josephat Kapkory, Bernard Lagat, Samson Kimombwa, Peter Koech, Joshua Kimeto, Richard Tuwei, Julius Korir, Samuel Kibiri, and one of the greatest distance runners of all time, Henry Rono.

Women began to compete at WSU in the early '80s and by the early '90s Celestine N'Drin and Jennifer Bravard lowered the school records in middle distance events to 2:02 in the 800 meters, 4:14 for 1500 meters, and 9:15 for the 3000 meters. Megan Maynard became Washington State's first Cross Country All-American in 1998. Haley Paul earned All-America honors as a sophomore with her 14th place finish at the 2005 NCAA Cross Country Championships after finishing sixth at the Pac-10 Championships and ninth at the NCAA West Regional Championships. Sara Trané won back-to-back Pacific-10 Conference steeplechase titles in 2007 and 2008.

Coach Pete Julian came to Washington State in August 2009, and brought a solid resume of developing championship-caliber distance and middle distance runners with him. He has implemented a training program for the distance runners that had an immediate impact. The Cougar men's team finished seventh at the prestigious ISU Pre-Nationals and were ranked 26th in the USTFCCCA, the

first national ranking in six years.

"I think it was a very successful season. I think we saw some pretty good improvement across the board from all of the athletes," Julian said. "We didn't get to the NCAA Championships and that was our goal, but to be fair, we just weren't quite ready yet to move on to the NCAA Championships. I feel confident that we have a lot of great guys coming back next year and we should be able to make it."

On the women's side, Lisa Egami's 11th-place finish at the NCAA West Regional and at-large invitation to the NCAA Championships was a highlight.

"With our sport, it might take a season or two to see the results of all of the hard work the women did in the Fall, but I think it will be seen this spring and next fall. We laid the groundwork for some great things to happen in the near future," Julian said.

In the course of his first year, Julian has hit the recruiting trail with a vengeance. His ability to sell the program and the outstanding training facilities is unsurpassed. His commitment to developing young talent promises take the Cougar distance program to the next level.

"There is a tremendous history of distance running at Washington State and I intend to build upon it," Julian said. "I am committed to recruiting the top talent from the region and then work to develop that talent to the highest level."


