2006 Season Review

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TEAM NOTES: - WSU's staff ERA of 4.87 was the lowest by a Cougar staff since posting a 4.57 ERA in 1991...the 17 saves by Cougar relievers this season eclipsed the previous school record of 16 set in 1971... WSU's team batting average of .310 was its highest since hitting .310 during the 1994 season...the 649 hits in 2006 are the most by a Cougar team since collecting 654 during the 1991 season...the Cougars won three conference series for the first time since the Pac-10 Conference went to a full round-robin format prior to the 1999 season...WSU won the season series against USC for the first time since the 1969 season...WSU won the season series against Arizona for the first time since the 2000 season...by winning series against USC and Arizona, the Cougars won consecutive conference series for the first time since the Pac-10 went to a full round-robin format prior to the 1999 season...the 15-win improvement from the 2005 season tied for the greatest single-season improvement in school history, along with the 15-win improvement from the 1955 to 1956 seasons...the 10 conference victories are the most by a Cougar squad since the Pac-10 went to a full round-robin format prior to the 1999 season...the Cougars fall semester GPA of 2.86 was the highest semester ever by a WSU baseball team. The spring semester was equally impressive with a 2.77 GPA, the highest ever by the baseball team in spring...the nine-win improvement in conference play from the 2005 season is the greatest single-season conference improvement in school history...WSU received a national ranking for the first time since the 1994 season. The Cougars were ranked No. 28 by College Baseball News in the Mar. 27 poll. The Cougars also received votes in the NCBWA poll the final week of March and the first week of April...the Cougars went 6-9 against teams making the 2006 NCAA Championships. WSU went 2-1 against Stanford, 1-0 against San Francisco and Missouri, 0-1 against Fresno State, 1-2 against Arizona State and UCLA and 0-3 against Oregon State...WSU played 36 of its 59 games this season on the road, going 26-10 in games away from Pullman. That included a 10-2 record in the opening three weekends, a 17-day stretch, that saw them cover 11,234 miles...the Cougars won three tournament titles during the season, including the Buccaneer Baseball Classic, River City Classic and Banana Belt tournaments...Washington State posted a season-long winning streak of seven games (Feb. 23 - Mar. 4), which included a 4-0 record and tournament title at the River City Classic (Sacramento, Calif.).

JAY MILLER NAMED ALL-AMERICAN: Washington State senior outfielder Jay Miller has been named to the 2006 Louisville Slugger NCAA Division I All-America third team, by Collegiate Baseball newspaper...Miller, from Bellevue, Wash., batted .361 for the season, sixth in the Pac-10, and led the conference in hits (88) and doubles (28). His doubles total were second in the NCAA while he also ranked No. 25 in the nation in toughest to strikeout (16.1). He began the season with a 15-game hitting streak and tied a school record by scoring five runs in an 18-10 win over Gonzaga (Mar. 3, 2006)...Miller finished his career as WSU's career hits leader with 308. That total places him ninth all-time in the Pac-10, while his 74 career doubles are second all-time at WSU and the fifth-most in Pac-10 history. Miller also ended his Cougar career as the all-time leader in at-bats (224), tied for third in games played (227), fifth in walks (107), sixth in runs scored (161) and tied for ninth in RBIs (147).

PRINCE GARNER'S ALL-AMERICA THIRD-TEAM HONORS: Washington State freshman outfielder/pitcher Jared Prince was named to the 2006 American Baseball Coaches Association Division I All-America third team, announced by the ABCA by Collegiate Baseball newspaper...Prince was one of only two freshmen in the country to receive All-America status, as voted on by coaches across the nation.

MILLER SETS ALL-TIME HITS RECORD: With his sixth inning single to left in the series-opener at

Washington (5/26), senior Jay Miller passes former Cougar Mike Kinkade ('92-'95) for the top spot on WSU's all-time hits list with 305...Miller follows that at-bat with a seventh-inning double, giving him 74 doubles for his career, one shy of another Kinkade record...Miller added a single in the series finale, giving him 307 hits for his career...he and Kinkade are the only two players in Cougar baseball history to amass over 300 career hits.

COUGARS CLOSE OUT HOME SEASON WITH WIN: Washington State closed out its 2006 home schedule Monday night with a 4-2 win over Lewis-Clark State College at Bailey-Brayton Field...on a night when senior Jay Miller tied the WSU career record for hits, the Cougars scored four runs in the first five innings and made it hold up with a strong effort out of the bullpen...Miller and Paul Gran each had RBIs in the contest, while the other two runs came via a balk and error...WSU held a Senior Day presentation prior to Sunday's home conference finale when it honored its five graduating seniors...Grant Alexander, Reese Baker, Zach Franklin, Zach McAngus and Jay Miller were all recognized prior to the start of the contest.

PRINCE, COULTER REGISTER OUTSTANDING ROOKIE SEASONS: Freshmen Jared Prince and Travis Coulter assaulted the freshmen records at WSU in 2006...Prince had arguably the greatest freshman campaign in school history...among freshman records, Prince was tops in batting average (.401) of those players with 100-plus at-bats, tied for third in runs scored (50), first in hits (883) and RBIs (58), second in doubles (16), fourth in home runs (9) and tied for third in stolen bases (10)...Coulter had an equally remarkable season as he finished tied for fourth in batting average (.345) of those players with 100 or more at-bats...he was first in at-bats (226), second in runs scored (54), second in hits (78), tied for third in stolen bases (10) and tied for fourth in triples (2).

PRINCE NAMED TOP FRESHMAN: WSU right fielder/pitcher Jared Prince was named the top freshman in the country by Baseball America in their 2006 midseason report released last week...Prince's .411 batting average and 1.32 ERA have helped the Cougars to a 22-12 record at the midseason mark...the freshman has surrendered only four earned runs in 27.1 innings of work, posting a 4-0 record in four starts with a 17-5 strikeout-to-walk ratio...the 6-foot-3 Poulsbo native has started 32 games, whether it is on the mound or patrolling right and center field, where he has tallied nine assists and committed no errors...at the plate, Prince has picked up a team leading 32 RBI's, while ripping 12 doubles, second only to All-Pac-10 candidate Jay Miller.

COUGARS GARNER PAC-10 ALL-ACADEMIC HONORS: Washington State pitchers Steve Kost and Jayson Miller earned first team honors while pitcher Nick Cebula was named to the second team as Pacific-10 Conference Commissioner Tom Hansen announced the conference all-academic baseball honors.

SIX COUGARS GRAB ALL-PAC-10 HONORS: Washington State senior Jay Miller and freshman Jared Prince were named to the All-Pacific-10 Conference first team, Pac-10 Commissioner Tom Hansen announced Wednesday. Cougars Travis Coulter, Jeff Miller, Jim Murphy and Travis Webb also received honorable mention recognition.

BRAYTON, OLERUD NAMED TO COLLEGE BASEBALL HALL OF FAME BALLOT: Former Washington State University coach Charles "Bobo" Brayton and pitcher/first baseman John Olerud were two of 46 college baseball greats included on the 2006 ballot for induction into the College Baseball Hall of Fame, it was announced by the College Baseball Foundation...When he retired from WSU in 1994 after 33 years leading the Cougars, Brayton ranked as the

fourth winningest baseball coach in NCAA Division I history with 1,161 wins. A member of the WSU Athletic Hall of Fame, Brayton, who led the Cougars to 21 conference titles in 33 years, was named Pacific-10 Conference Northern Division coach of the year five times and West Coast NCAA Regional coach of the year once...Olerud spent three years in a Cougar uniform, hitting .434 for his career (160-369) with 37 doubles, 33 home runs 131 RBI and a .824 slugging percentage. On the mound he posted a 26-4 record with a 3.17 ERA and 169 strikeouts in 39 appearances. Inducted into the WSU Hall of Fame in 2001, Olerud left Pullman as the school's career leader in batting average (.434), slugging percentage (.824) and in the top five in home runs (33) and pitching wins (26). In 1988 he was named Baseball America's NCAA Player of the Year after hitting .464 with 83 runs, 21 doubles, 23 home runs and 81 RBI. That same season he was 15-0 on the mound with a 2.49 ERA.

COUGARS RANKED BY COLLEGIATE BASEBALL: For the first time since the 1994 season, the Washington State University baseball team has earned a national ranking...in its latest weekly release of NCAA Division I baseball teams, Collegiate Baseball newspaper's poll has the Cougars ranked No. 28...the ranking marks the first appearance by a WSU squad since 1994 when the Cougars were ranked No. 25 by Collegiate Baseball newspaper. WSU's highest national ranking came one season prior when Baseball America had them at No. 13 during the 1988 season.

COUGARS SET HITS RECORD IN OPENER AT NORTHERN COLORADO: In Game One of the Northern Colorado series (4/21), WSU pounded out a school-record 26 hits against the Bears, eclipsing the previous mark of 25 set twice during the 1999 season in back-to-back games against New Mexico State, Feb. 14-15...Mike Gilbert had four hits in the contest while Ryan Krauser, Jay Miller, Paul Gran and Jared Prince each had three...additionally, the Cougars set a season-high with 22 runs, while tying the season mark with six doubles.

COULTER HIT STREAK REACHED 20: Freshman Travis Coulter's 20-game hitting streak ended in the final home game with his 0-for-3 performance against Lewis-Clark State, just two hits shy of John Olerud's single-season record of 22 set during the 1988 season...Coulter had hit safely in every game from Apr. 14, the second game of the California series when he went 2-4, through May 21...Coulter was one of only two Cougars (Jared Prince), to get a hit in each game of the Oregon State series, collecting one each day...during the streak, Coulter hit .393 (35-for-89) with a double, triple, home run, 11 RBIs and 19 runs scored.

PRINCE NAMED TO DICK HOWSER TROPHY WATCHLIST: freshman Jared Prince has been named to the initial Dick Howser Trophy Watch List, recognizing the top player in collegiate baseball...Prince currently leads the Cougars in hitting with a .426 average, posting team-bests of 44 RBIs and a .606 slugging average. He is also second in hits (66) and doubles (14), and third in home runs (4)...on the mound the righthander has a team-leading 6-1 record with a 3.80 ERA...the Dick Howser Trophy, given in memory of the former Florida State University All-America shortstop and major league player and manager who died of brain cancer in 1987, is regarded by many as college baseball's most prestigious award...criteria for consideration for the trophy include performance on the field, leadership, moral character and courage.

MCANGUS NAMED PAC-10 PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Senior outfielder Zach McAngus was named the Pacific-10 Conference Baseball Player of the Week for Apr. 25 - May 1...McAngus, from Honolulu, Hawaii, led Washington State from the plate last week, batting a team-best .583 in four games...he went 7-for-12 with two doubles, a home run, two RBI and six runs scored,



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while slugging at 1.000 with an on-base percentage of .688...in a 9-6 win at Gonzaga, McAngus went 2-for-3 with a double and two runs scored...in Friday's opener vs. USC, he went 1-for-3, before going 3-for-4 Saturday with a double, home run, two RBI and three runs scored in a 13-7 win...McAngus finished the series by going 1-for-2 Sunday while scoring a run to help the Cougars defeat the Trojans, 6-3. For the conference series, he hit .556 (5-for-9) and added a stolen base.

AIR MILES ADDUP: The Cougars were no strangers to the road at the start of the 2006 season...WSU opened its campaign at the Buccaneer Classic in Charleston, S.C., and followed that with a four-game series at Hawaii-Hilo on the Big Island...WSU then competed at the River City Classic in Sacramento, Calif...the season-opening road swing encompassed 12 games, lasted 17 days and covered 11,234 miles.

DAMAN, McANGUS EARN ALL-TOURNAMENT HONORS: Pitcher Wayne Daman, Jr. and outfielder Zach McAngus were both named to the River City Classic all-tournament team...Daman worked 7.0 innings, allowing two unearned runs on four hits while matching his career-high with nine strikeouts... McAngus drove in a team-high eight runs as he hit .333 (4-12) with two home runs, a double and single... McAngus drilled a pinch-hit, three-run home run in the eighth against USF that proved to be the game-winner.

JAY MILLER NAMED PAC-10 PLAYER OF THE WEEK: For the second time in his Cougar career, senior outfielder Jay Miller was named the Pac-10 Player of the Week for March 21-27, announced commissioner Tom Hansen...Miller, from Bellevue, Wash., batted a team-leading .667 (8-for-12), with two doubles, three runs scored, two RBIs along with a slugging percentage of .833 and an on-base percentage of .692...in the opener, he went 2-3 with a run scored in WSU's 7-1 win...In Sunday's 8-5 victory, Miller went 3-5 with one run, two doubles and two RBIs... the finale, Miller went 3-4 and his final hit, a two-out single in the ninth, tied him with Jim Connor for third on WSU's all-time hit list, with 271 career hits.

DAMAN, JR. NAMED PAC-10 PITCHER OF THE WEEK: Washington State junior right-handed pitcher Wayne Daman, Jr. has been named the Pacific-10 Conference Pitcher of the Week for Feb. 7-13...Daman, Jr., from Beaver, Wash., opened the Cougar's 2006 season by throwing six shutout innings in the WSU's 8-2 victory over East Tennessee State...he scattered only two singles and did not walk a batter while registering a career-high nine strikeouts...he retired the first 10 batters he faced and 13 of the first 14, not allowing a runner past second base...the Pitcher of the Week honor is the first for Daman, Jr., and the 26th selection all-time for Washington State. The last Cougar pitcher to receive the honor was Garrett Alwert, who captured the award Apr. 20, 2004.

HITTING THE BOOKS: Following the 2005 fall semester, the Washington State University baseball team posted a 2.86 combined grade point average, the highest semester GPA in Cougar baseball history...the team followed that with a 2.77 GPA during the spring semester, also the highest-ever by a Cougar baseball team during the spring.

COUGARS OFF TO FAST START: The Cougars jumped out to a 15-4 start through the first month of the season, marking their best opening stint since going 10-2 during the 1988 season...the Cougars' best start occurred during the 1980 season when they opened the season with an 18-0 record...that team went on to post a 36-10 record.
