COUGAR BASEBALL HISTORY

Cougar baseball is almost as old as Washington State University. Classes met for the first time Jan. 13, 1892, and in March of that year the students organized a baseball team. It is only natural that baseball should have been the first organized sport at WSU, since at the time the University was founded the game was immensely popular all over the country.

The 1995 season marked a special celebration in Cougar baseball history. It was the 100th year WSU had fielded a baseball team. Following the first season, 1892, play was discontinued and did not resume until 1896. After another brief interruption from play in 1897, baseball became a regular on the sports menu and has been played every year since 1898.

The first game played by the first Cougar team is recorded as a 26-0 win over the Pullman Military College on March 12, 1892. The military school was located on what is now known as "Military Hill" in the northwest part of Pullman. The school was destroyed by fire in 1893.

Captains, chosen by the players, ran the early Cougar baseball teams. Between 1892 and 1900 the Cougars won 21 games and lost nine without benefit of a regular coach.

H. E. Loughheed is regarded as the first official baseball coach at WSU. He served between 1901 and 1903, and his teams won 24 games while losing 18. Since then, the school has had regularly assigned coaches, some of them football coaches putting in time between seasons, and in the World War I years of 1916-20, athletic director J. Fred "Doc" Bohler took over the task.

Baseball really came of age at WSU with the appointment of Arthur B. "Buck" Bailey in 1927. Buck came to Pullman with football coach Orin E. "Babe" Hollingbery in the fall of 1926. A famous football player at Texas A&M and Bethany College and the captain of the West team in the first East-West Shrine Football Game ever played, Bailey also was a baseball player of note. From 1927 to 1942, Buck coached Hollingbery's line during the football season and ran the Cougar baseball program in the spring. He took three years off during World War II, then returned to boss the diamond teams here from 1946 until his retirement in 1961.

Bailey was baseball and baseball was Bailey at Washington State. Buck gave the Cougars their most consistent winner in any sport, and he did it with such flair that Washington State was almost as popular on the road as at home. In 32 seasons, Buck's Cougars won 11 Northern Division titles and finished second an equal number of times. His greatest team—the 1950 squad—posted a mark of 32-6 and finished second in the College World Series in Omaha, Nebraska.

When Bailey retired in 1961, one of his finest players returned to Washington State to take over his squad. Chuck "Bobo" Brayton, three-time All-Northern player and twice captain of the Cougars in the 1946-48 era, when Bailey's teams won two Northern Division titles, succeeded Bailey at Cougarville. Brayton coached at Yakima Valley College after receiving his degree at Washington State in 1950, where he became WSU's first baseball All-American for his play at shortstop in 1947. Brayton continued the winning tradition at Washington State, becoming the winningest coach in WSU athletic history, surpassing the legendary Bailey.

When Brayton retired in 1994, he did so not only as the winningest coach in WSU history with 1,162 victories, but as the fourth winningest baseball coach in the history of NCAA Div. I play.

In January, 2000, the home of Cougar baseball was re-dedicated in honor of both Bailey and Brayton. The complex is now known as Bailey-Brayton Field.

Don Marbut is the third coach to direct WSU baseball fortunes since Brayton's retirement. Marbut took over in 2005 after one year as a Cougar assistant and four years as the head coach at Edmonds Community College. The Portland State graduate (1997) was 152-38 and his Titan clubs won two State community college titles.

Steve Farrington (1995-2000) succeeded Brayton after an outstanding career at Lower Columbia College. Tim Mooney (2001-2004), after a great 14-year run at Albertson College, took over for Farrington and spent four seasons at WSU before resigning after the 2004 season.

Washington State draws more fans to its games than any other conference team. Crowds average between 1,000 and 2,000 on the weekends of important conference games. Bailey Field was relocated in 1980, giving WSU one of the finest collegiate baseball facilities on the West Coast, complete with seating for nearly 3,500 fans and an electronic scoreboard. A \$250,000 lighting project was completed during the 1984 season. In 2004 FieldTurf was installed throughout the field giving WSU a nearly-rain proof facility. The only dirt in the field is home plate and the pitcher's mound.

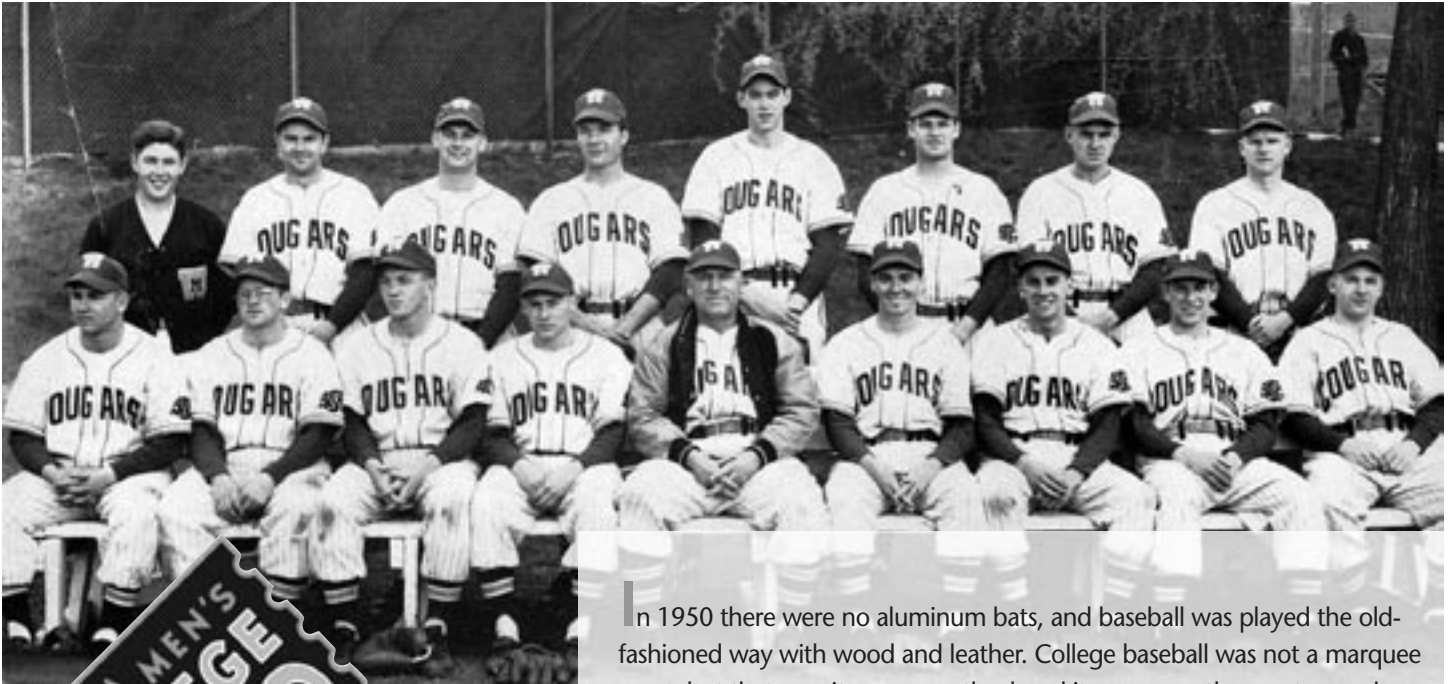

In 1950 there were no aluminum bats, and baseball was played the old-fashioned way with wood and leather. College baseball was not a marquee sport, but that year it permanently placed its name on the sports map by moving the College World Series to its present site in Omaha, Neb.

Fifty years later in 1999 at Rosenblatt Stadium in Omaha, the College World Series celebrated its golden anniversary. The University of Miami outlasted Florida State University for a 6-5 victory in the title game to give the Hurricanes their third national championship. Joining in the festivities at the 50th College World Series in Omaha were players from the first title game in 1950, featuring the University of Texas and Washington State University.

Former Cougar players Bob McGuire, Clayton Carr, Gene Camp, Sonny Galloway, and Leland Dolquist, along with Cougar coaching legend Bobo Brayton and former Athletic Director Rick Dickson, returned to Omaha to help celebrate the 50th anniversary of the College World Series.

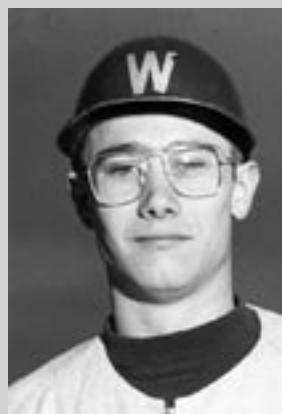
CASEY KELLEY SHATTERS SCHOOL HOME RUN RECORD

In 1998 junior Casey Kelley (Ellensburg, Wash.) etched his name into the record books with a Washington State and Pac-10 North record 25 home runs. The record mark broke John Olerud's 1988 record of 23. An amazing fact is 20 of his 25 long balls sailed to left field, his opposite field. Kelley finished ranked third nationally with .51 home runs per game and was named a third team All-American by Collegiate Baseball. Kelley went onto play first base in the California Angels (Anaheim) organization.

She moved north, taught in the Shoreline (Wash.) public school system as a substitute and coached in the CYO and Seattle Parks Department programs. She was active in the Washington, Northwest, and national officials associations from 1973-82.

After earning her master's degree in sports administration at the University of Washington, Saneholtz was appointed the assistant women's athletic director at Washington State.

Saneholtz was promoted to associate athletic director in 1982 and currently serves as senior associate directors of athletics and is the Senior Woman Administrator at WSU.

She served on the National Association of Collegiate Women's Athletic Administrators (NACWAA) Board of Directors from 1987-94, including a term as president in 1992-93. She was selected the NACWAA National Administrator of the Year in 1997.

Saneholtz has been a strong presence on several NCAA committees. She has served as the chair of the NCAA Women's Division I Volleyball Committee. Other NCAA memberships include the Committee on Athletic Certification (1993-99), chair of the Peer Selection Subcommittee (1992-99), President's Commission Liaison Committee (1992-96), and the Women's Committee on Committees (1989-92). She has also served on numerous Pacific-10 Conference committees including two terms as vice president (1988-89 and 1998-99). Currently, she is a member of the NCAA Committee on Women's Athletics.

Saneholtz and her husband, Byron, have two grown daughters, Jennifer and Amy.

JIM STERK

DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS



Washington native James M. Sterk was appointed Washington State University's director of athletics in June of 2000. In his four years, he has overseen unprecedented growth and success by the Cougars' 17 intercollegiate athletics teams and the 450 individuals who compete for WSU annually.

In the last five years, WSU has scored its best finish and highest point total in the history of the Athletic Directors Cup competition among NCAA schools.

WSU's success on the gridiron in the 21st century - three consecutive 10-win seasons - has more than done its part to draw national attention to the Cougar sports programs. In the past four years, 13 Cougar teams have

been represented in postseason competition.

Facility improvements have also been among projects Sterk has tackled. WSU recently completed a major baseball field renovation and became the first collegiate program to have FieldTurf as its playing surface. An ambitious capital improvement plan is underway to enhance many other WSU sport facilities, including major changes to Martin Stadium, the home of Cougar football.

A 1979 graduate of Western Washington, Sterk received his master's degree in sports administration from Ohio University. His professional career has included positions at North Carolina, Maine, Seattle Pacific, Tulane and Portland State, the latter as director of athletics for five years before coming to Pullman.

The foundation of Sterk's leadership plan is based on five areas, the student-athlete experience, resource acquisition, personnel, political dynamics and facilities. All five areas have enjoyed growth in Sterk's arrival in Pullman.

Sterk currently is a member of the prestigious NCAA Championship/Competition cabinet and has served on numerous Pacific-10 Conference committees during his tenure at WSU.

Sterk and his wife, Debi, have three children, Ashley, Amy and Abby.

KEN CASAVANT

FACULTY ATHLETICS REPRESENTATIVE



Ken Casavant, a member of the Washington State University family since 1967, currently serves as WSU Faculty Athletics Representative to the Pacific-10 Conference and the National Collegiate Athletic Association. He is a past president of the Pac-10 and was recently chosen to serve on the NCAA Division I Management Council.

Casavant came to WSU as a graduate research assistant in the Department of Agricultural and Resource Economics. He was named an assistant professor in 1971, an associate professor in 1975 and a full professor in 1980.

In 2004, Casavant received the honor of giving the Distinguished Faculty Address, the University oldest award and also received the Sahlin Excellence in Public Service award for the University. In 1979, Casavant received the R.M. Wade award for outstanding teacher in the college of agriculture at WSU, and in 1990, he earned the distinguished WSU Faculty of the Year award. Casavant was elected vice-chair (1991-92) and chair (1992-93) of the WSU Faculty Senate and has been accorded the Distinguished Teacher award by the American Agricultural Economics Association. He was named Distinguished Scholar by the Western Agricultural Economics Association in 2003 for his nationally recognized work as a transportation economist.

During his tenure at WSU, Casavant has served as associate director for the Washington State Transportation Center (1984-87) and the interim Vice-Provost for Academic Affairs and interim Vice-Provost for Research (1998).

The North Dakota native is a 1965 graduate of North Dakota State University, where he earned a bachelor degree in agricultural economics. He received his master degree from NDSU, followed by a Ph.D., from WSU in 1971.

Ken and his wife Dorothy have two grown daughters, Michele and Colette.

WASHINGTON STATE TRADITIONS



THE COUGAR HEAD LOGO

In 1936, student Randall Johnson, class of 1938, designed the original Cougar head logo for Washington State College. It was used on the side of college trucks. In 1959, when the institution changed from college to university, he re-created the logo to incorporate the "U" in place of the "C." In 2002, WSU developed a new graphic identity. It employs the Cougar head within a crest, an internationally recognized symbol for higher education.

THE COUGAR NICKNAME

Washington State University students officially adopted the nickname "Cougars" October 28, 1919, three days after a reference to "cougars" was used in a football game story following WSU's upset 14-0 win at California. In the story, a Bay Area writer said the Pacific Northwest team "played like cougars" in upsetting the Bears.

THE VICTORY BELL

In the late 1800s, the victory bell was mounted on the ground in the center of campus; it rang to start and dismiss classes in those early days. Today, it is located at the Lewis Alumni Centre. A member of the Student Alumni Connection rings it after a WSU football win.

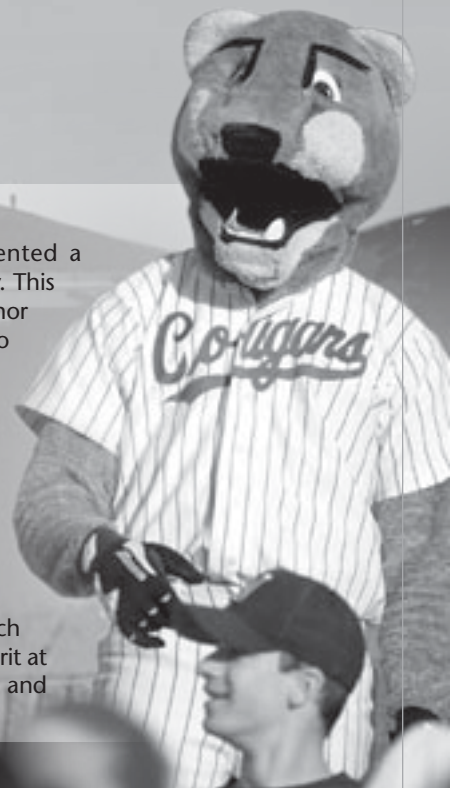

THE COUGAR MASCOT

In 1927, Governor Roland Hartley presented a cougar cub to the students of the University. This first cougar mascot was called Butch, to honor Herbert "Butch" Meeker of Spokane, who was WSU's football star at the time. Butch II was presented to the students by Governor Clarence D. Martin in 1938. Butch III and IV were twin cubs, presented by Governor Arthur B. Langlie in 1942. Governor Langlie presented Butch V in 1955. Butch VI, the last live mascot on campus, died in the summer of 1978. He had been presented to WSU by Governor Albert Rosellini in 1964 from the Seattle Zoo. Today, WSU students in a "Butch the Cougar" mascot costume rally school spirit at athletic contests, including football games and other events.

The road from high school baseball to the Major Leagues is long, usually winding, and full of detours. But for many, the gate to the professional fields seems to open easier when Cougar Baseball has been a part of the trip.

Take former Cougar John Olerud for example, Toronto plucked him out of WSU's program in 1988 and rather than send him to the minors for instruction on the basics, they sent him right to the parent club. Olerud, who was the college baseball player of the year in 1988, went straight to the top.

Olerud won the American League batting title in 1993 and was the starting first baseman for the Blue Jays when they won the 1992 and 1993 World Series Championships.

But Olerud, who retired following the 2005 season isn't the only example of Cougars to have success in the pros. The list (to the left) of former Cougs who went on to the Major Leagues numbers 39, with most of them a product of the last 30 years.

The latest includes Mike Kinkade, Aaron Sele, Scott Hatteberg and Mark Hendrickson round out the former Cougars who played in the majors last year.

Bill Doba, 3rd Year

Bill Doba's 2004 Cougars notched an Apple Cup victory and posted wins over bowl bound teams New Mexico and UCLA. Doba became just the fourth Pac-10 coach to win 10 or more games in his first season in 2003 as he led the Cougars to a second place finish in the Pac-10 and a victory over Texas in the Holiday Bowl. The 2005 campaign will mark his 17th season with the program, helping WSU reach six bowl games, including a pair of Rose Bowls.

VOLLEYBALL



Brian Heffernan, 2nd Year

Heffernan enters his second season at WSU after serving two years as an associate head coach and two years as an assistant coach at the University of Minnesota where he helped guide the Golden Gophers to four NCAA appearances including a national semifinal match in 2003, and the Big Ten Conference title that same season.

SOCCER



Matt Potter, 3rd Year

Potter enters his third season on the Palouse after a 2004 campaign that saw the Cougars upset four ranked opponents, including wins over Pac-10 rivals No. 8 UCLA, No. 22 USC and No. 12 Washington. Potter, a native of England, spent eight years with the Sereno Soccer Club in Arizona prior to coming to Washington State. He was also a member of the Watford Football Club and represented England internationally as a player.

CROSS COUNTRY



Jason Drake, 2nd Year

Drake enters his second year as the head coach and fourth year of coaching the men's and women's cross country programs. The 2004 Cougar women's team finished an unexpected fifth at the 2004 Pac-10 Championships and strong recruiting classes the past two years give both programs optimism for the future.

SWIMMING



Erica Quam, 4th Year

During Quam's tenure, WSU swimmers have set two school records, earned 61 spots on the Cougars' all-time top 10 lists and recorded a 41st place finish at the NCAA championships. The team has been in the top four nationally all six semesters academically.

MEN'S BASKETBALL



Dick Bennett, 3rd Year

The Cougars have led the Pac-10 in scoring defense each of the last two seasons. WSU's 25 overall and 14 conference wins are the most in a two-year span since the 1996-97 seasons.

WOMEN'S BASKETBALL



Sherri Murrell, 4th Year

Murrell is in her fourth year at the helm of the Cougar women's basketball program. In 2005, Murrell's recruit Kate Benz became the first player in program history to lead the Pac-10 in rebounding. Prior to her appointment on the Palouse, Murrell led Pacific to four consecutive winning seasons with 68 wins in that span.

GOLF



Walt Williams, 8th Year

In the first seven years under Williams' guidance, Cougar teams re-wrote the record book and made a first-ever team appearance in the NCAA Championship (men and women). Williams has coached two All-Americans (Kim Welch, Anastasia Kostina) and in 2003 Welch earned a fifth-place finish at the NCAA Championship.

Lisa Hart, 3rd Year

The Cougars have been ranked nationally each of the last two seasons. WSU has five wins over ranked opponents during Hart's tenure.

BASEBALL



Don Marbut, 2nd Year

Marbut became the 14th head coach in the 110-year history of Cougar baseball as he took the reigns in 2004 after spending a year as an assistant at WSU. A successful coach at the community college level, the Portland State University graduate coached Washington State to 21 wins and saw three players drafted in his initial campaign.

Jane LaRiviere, 4th Year

In just three years at the helm of the program, LaRiviere has made an instant impact on Cougar rowing, guiding the team to consecutive NCAA Championship appearances. In 2004, the Cougars finished ninth at the NAAs, the best finish in program history.

TRACK & FIELD



Rick Sloan, 12th Year

Sloan has coached Cougars for 32 years and has been named the USTCA West Region Coach of the Year five times. During his head coaching tenure, All-America honors have come to WSU 48 times in men's events and 31 times in women's events.
