



Experienced youth

may sound like an oxymoron, but it will likely be the key to success for the

Washington State University men's basketball team in 2005-06. Six of the Cougar returnees are true sophomores and they combined to make 53 starts during their first season on the Palouse.

At the head of the sophomore class is Derrick Low who started 22 games at point guard in 2004-05. The Honolulu native is tops among returnees in scoring average, assists, steals, free throw percentage and 3-point field goal percentage.

"We will look for more leadership and aggressiveness on both ends of the floor from Derrick," WSU Head Coach Dick Bennett said. "That will determine the type of year he has individually and we have collectively as a team."

Low as well as the other guards will be asked to replace the scoring of Thomas Kelati who finished his career with 1,081 points, 18th best in WSU history.

Kyle Weaver, a Beloit, Wis., native appeared in 25 games last season, including 10 starts. He played point guard when Low was out early in the season due to injury.

"Weaver is one of our better passers and has the ability to post," Bennett said. "He had some very good stretches as a freshman and as his consistency improves he will be hard to keep off the floor."

Other returning guards include sophomore Josh Akognon (Petaluma, Calif.) and senior Randy Green (Renton). Akognon appeared in 27 games off the bench last season and shot 31 percent from beyond the arc. Green is the only Cougar who has been on campus more than one season and is a 33 percent career shooter from 3-point range.

Washington State added depth to the perimeter with the addition of freshman Chris Matthews (Washington, D.C.) and junior transfers Antonio Chavers (Fort Worth, Texas) and Rodney Edgerson (Peoria, III.). Edgerson's offensive credentials are the most impressive among the trio. He averaged 24.6 points per game during his sophomore campaign at Illinois Central College.

Sophomore Robbie Cowgill will be a key to the Cougars inside game. In 2004-05, he started 19 games while playing out of position. The Austin, Texas native was forced to move from forward to center because of an injury to Shami Gill. Cowgill responded with 27 blocked shots, second most by a freshman in WSU history. The Cougars would like the luxury of moving the 6-foot-10 Cowgill back to forward.

"If one of the two freshmen (Aron Baynes or Caleb Forrest) or (sophomore) Chris Henry can step in and play in the middle, then we can look at moving Cowgill to forward," Bennett said.

Baynes has played four years of organized basketball. At 6-foot-10, 247 pounds, the Cairns, Australia native brings international experience and a big body to Pullman.

Forrest comes to the Cougars from Pagosa Springs, Colo. He averaged 20 points and eight rebounds as a senior and was named "Mr. 3A Basketball" by *The Rocky Mountain News*.

Henry was sidelined due to injuries that cost him half of his freshman season. If healthy, he provides the Cougars a physical presence inside.

The Cougars lack depth at the forward position with Daven Harmeling the only returnee who saw significant playing time there last season. Harmeling (Grand Junction, Colo.) played in 26 games and made one start. He has the ability to stretch the defense with his perimeter shooting.

Junior transfer Ivory Clark (New Orleans) and invited freshman walk-on Steve Campbell (Kenmore) were added in the offseason.

Clark averaged 13.2 points and 7.1 rebounds at Midland (Texas) College last season. He has shot blocking ability and can guard multiple positions on the defensive end. Campbell helped lead Inglemoor High to a fifth place finish in the Washington 4A State Tournament last season.

The 2005-06 Cougar schedule will feature eight of nine nonconference games in the Evergreen State. Washington State hosts Utah in the inaugural Cougar Hardwood Classic, Dec. 22 at Seattle's KeyArena. The Cougars will host BYU at

the Spokane Arena, Nov. 22 and travel to Gonzaga, Dec. 8.

Washington State's remaining five nonconference home games will be played in Pullman against UC Riverside (Nov. 19), Idaho (Nov. 26), Wyoming (Nov. 30), Kansas State (Dec. 3) and Portland (Dec. 17). The Cougars will play a road game against San Diego State (Dec. 10).

"I like our schedule," Bennett said. "It's a good nonconference schedule with a chance for our students and alumni see us play against quality opponents throughout the state."


The Cougars open Pacific-10 action at the Spokane Arena against Arizona, Dec. 29. Following the 18-game league schedule, all 10 teams will advance to the Pacific Life Pacific-10 Conference Tournament at Staples Center in Los Angeles,

"The league will improve its overall quality once again," Bennett said. "My first year in the league, it was mediocre. Last year it was good. This year it will be very good. I think the upper division will be tighter and it will be tougher top to bottom compared to last year."
