# **MEDIA POLICIES**

# PRINT AND ELECTRONIC MEDIA

Please direct all credential requests to assistant sports information director and basketball SID Jessica Schmick in the WSU athletic media relations office (see contact information below).

Credential requests should be made 48 hours in advance. Credentials are available at the Athletic Media Relations Office prior to game day. Otherwise, all credentials will be left at the tunnel entrance on the Southeast side of the Beasley Performing Arts Coliseum.

Credentials are issued on an individual-game basis and should be requested as soon as possible. Priority is given to those print and electronic media outlets that cover Washington State or its opponent on a regular basis. In order to qualify for a credential, a news agency must have a full-time sports director or editor.

## PHOTOGRAPHERS

Credential requests should be made to the Athletic Media Relations Office per the above guidelines. Photographers are permitted to work the baseline areas beyond the end lines. No photographer is permitted to shoot from the sidelines at any time. A green photo vest will be provided to photographers and must be worn at all times. Photographers that do no follow these guidelines will be removed from the facilities.

#### **MEDIA PARKING**

A limited number of season passes are available to those Washington State beat writers, photographers and broadcasters. "R" passes permit media members to park along North Fairway Road. Single "A" passes are also available which allow members to park in the lot south of the Beasley Performing Arts Coliseum.

Television parking requests must go through Associate Director of Athletics for Event and Facility Operations John David Wicker (509-335-0282).

#### **TELECOMMUNICATIONS**

Visiting media, including play-by-play radio stations, can order phones through WSU Information Technology Services at 509-335-3355.

### MEDIA SERVICES

Washington State University uses the Statcrew computer program to produce the office box scores and statistical books for all games. These materials will be sent via fax and e-mail to the sports information offices of visiting opponents as well as any media outlets requested by the opponent's sport information contact. Rosters, pregame notes, halftime and final statistics and a play-by-play account of the game will be supplied to working media.

#### **POSTGAME PROCEDURES**

The Washington State locker room is closed at both home and away games. A member of the WSU Athletic Media Relations Office will take requests for players with about two minutes remaining at home games.
Following a cooling off period and any radio obligations, coach Bennett and selected players will be brought to meet the media in the Cougar Lounge. Postgame arrangements with visiting coaches and players will be made at the discretion of the visiting sports information director.

#### **WEEKDAY INTERVIEWS**

Requests for coach and player interviews must be made to Jessica Schmick in the WSU Athletic Media Relations Office. Please give 24 hours notice for all requests.

#### **Head Coach**

WSU head coach Tony Bennett holds a press conference every Tuesday of the season at noon in the WSU Athletic Media Relations Office (Bohler Athletic Complex Room 195). In addition, digital recordings of the press conference will be available for playback. Bennett is also available following each practice. Any other interviews must be arranged through the WSU Athletic Media Relations Office.

#### **Player Interviews**

All interviews must be arranged through the Athletic Media Relations Office at least 24 hours in advance. Players will be available on Mondays (before and after practice and via telephone). All Monday player interviews will take place after practice and weights in the WSU Athletic Media Relations Office (Bohler Athletic Complex Room 195). In addition, players will be available on the court Friday after practice.



#### **INTERNET ACCESS**

Beasley Coliseum is fully equipped with wireless internet available to all media members both on the court and in the media work room. No password is required.

# **BUD NAMECK**

Bud Nameck is the Program Director for 700 ESPN The Ticket and the host of "Bud, A Fan and The Wingman" on 700 ESPN The Ticket. Bud is also the Assistant Network Director of the Cougar Sports Radio Network.

Nameck has covered sports in the Inland Northwest since 1980. He has been the voice of Washington State University basketball for the past 14 years, and is a member of the Cougar football radio broadcast crew. Nameck handled the television play-by-play of Washington State Cougar basketball for six years and football for 12 years on what is now Fox Sports Net Northwest.

The 1994 Sportscaster of the year in the state of Washington, Nameck was the Sports Director of KXLY TV/AM/FM for 13 years, before taking over as the Director of Birdies Golf Center in Spokane. Under his direction and marketing, Birdies was named the best new golf range in America by Golf Range Times.

Nameck played baseball for Santa Clara University and graduated with a marketing degree.

Nameck is a member of the Board of Directors for the Rosauers Open Golf Tournament benefiting the Vanessa Behan Crisis Nursery. He has been on the board for the Wishing Star Foundation, and also served on

the YMCA advisory board. Nameck has also been a spokesman for the United Way and High 5, an anti-drug and alcohol group in area schools.

An avid golfer, Nameck donates his time and services to a number of charity golf events throughout the Northwest. He lives in Spokane with his wife Diane and daughter Kelsey.
