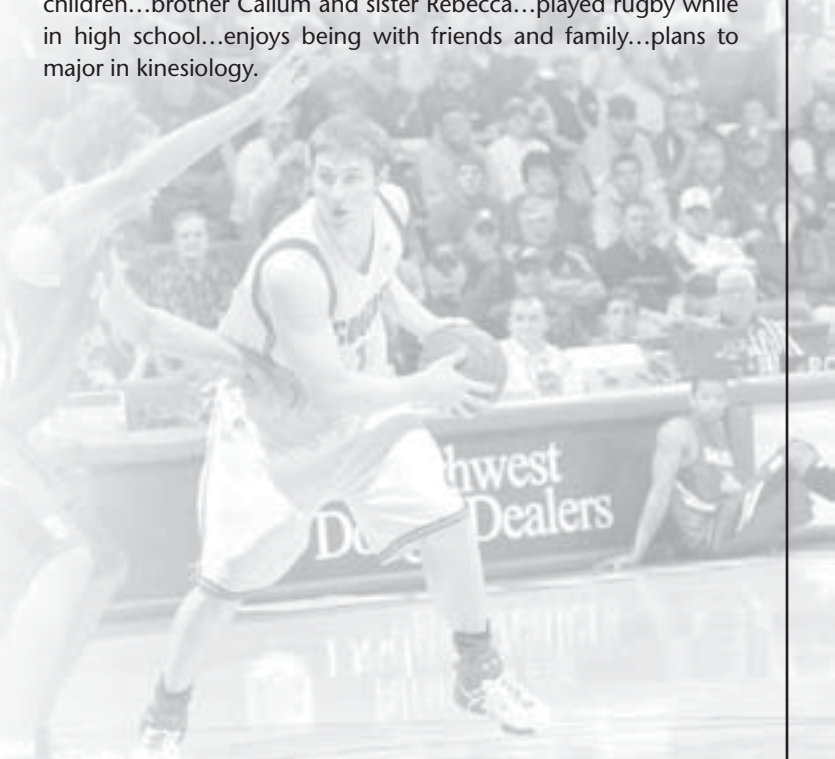
**SOPHOMORE (2006-07)** – Appeared in 24 games, including six starts...missed first five games recovering from off-season left ankle surgery...ranked fourth on the team in rebounds per game (3.1) and blocked shots (0.4)...recorded 10 points, season-high eight assists and season-high four blocks at Idaho (Dec. 9)...tallied 10 points against No. 2 UCLA in Pullman (March 1)...shot perfect 10-for-10 from the field for career-high 25 points in double overtime win vs. USC (March 3)...became first player in school history to shoot 100 percent from the field in a game with at least 10 attempts...went 5-for-7 from the field against Vanderbilt (March 17) recording 14 points in the Second Round of the NCAA Tournament...represented his native Australia at the World University Games in 2007...ranked third at the championships with a team-leading 18.1 points per game and second with 9.0 rebounds per game in seven contests...registered a double-double with game-highs 19 points and 12 rebounds in opening round against Korea...tied for team-high honors with 14 points and six rebounds against Israel...registered game highs of 21 points and nine rebounds versus Angola...was a perfect 9-for-9 from the field...tallied team highs with 16 points and eight rebounds versus Czech Republic...registered second double-double of the tournament with game-highs 21 points and 10 rebounds in Australia's victory over Kazakhstan...pulled down game-high nine rebounds versus Chinese Taipei...named to the Pacific-10 All-Academic First Team.

**FRESHMAN (2005-06)** – Appeared in all 28 games, including 12 starts...tallied 19 points off the bench against UC Riverside (Nov. 19)...his 19 points marked the most points in a season opener by a WSU true freshman...tied WSU freshman record (Carlos Daniel vs. Eastern Washington, Nov. 29, 1994) for blocks in a game with five at San Diego State (Dec. 10)...added eight points and four rebounds...recorded 12 points and added 10 boards at California (Jan. 28)...first career double-double...scored 13 points and grabbed season/career-high 13 rebounds against No. 16 Washington (Feb. 4)...first player to record back-to-back double-doubles since J Lockier during the 2001-02 season...grabbed 10 boards and added seven points against Stanford (Feb. 25)...pulled down 10 rebounds at Arizona State (March 4)...notched 14 points,

seven boards, and a block against Oregon (March 8)...ranks on WSU's freshman single season list in several categories including rebounds (fourth - 116), rebound average (fifth - 4.1), blocks (10th - 13), and blocks average (10th - 0.46).

**HIGH SCHOOL** – Named Queensland North State Representative player in 2002 and again in 2003...was part of the Under-23 QABL State Championship during 2003 season...played and trained under head coach Marty Clarke at the Australian Institute of Sport during 2004 and 2005...led the Cairns Marlins to a semiprofessional national championship in 2004...garnered the junior national championship as a Queensland Under-20 in 2005.

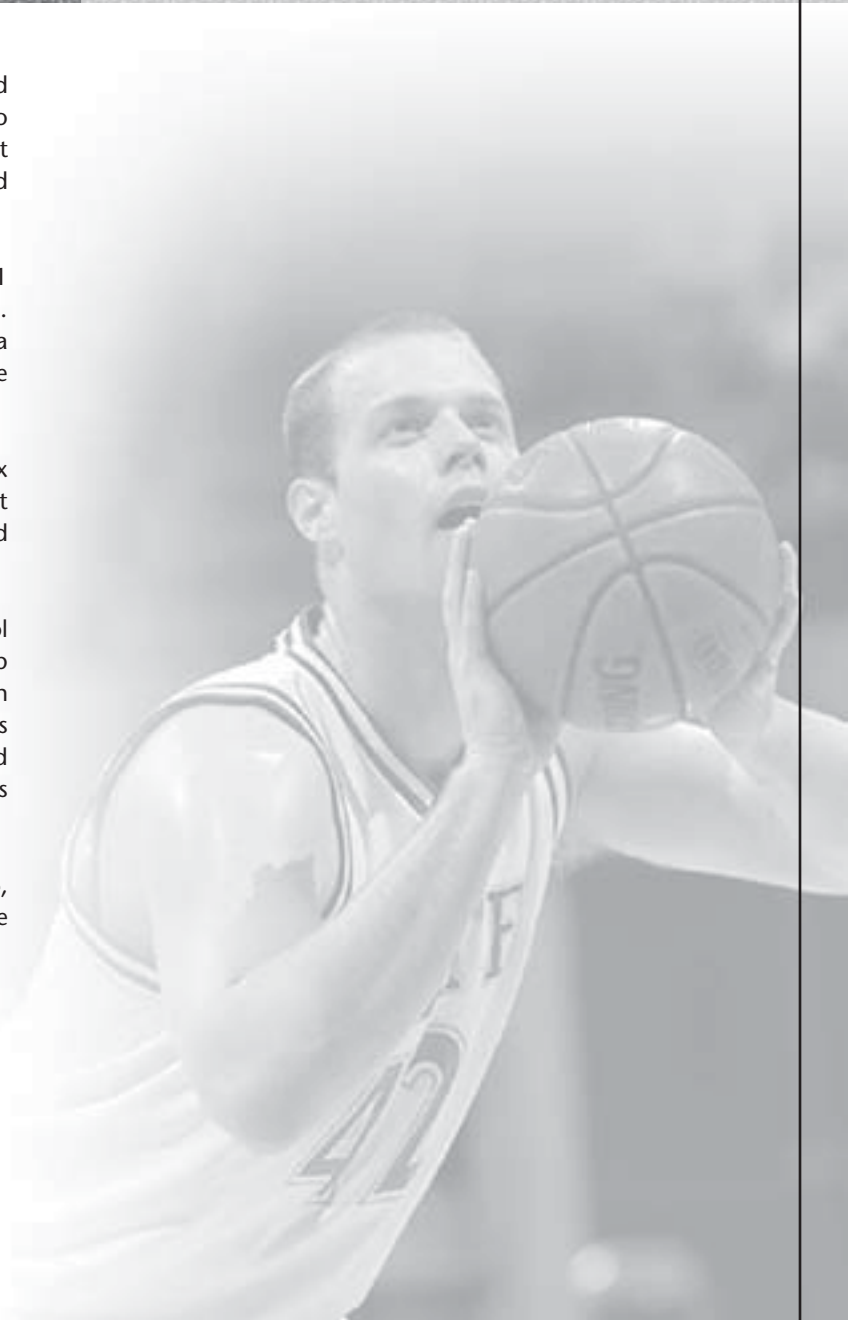

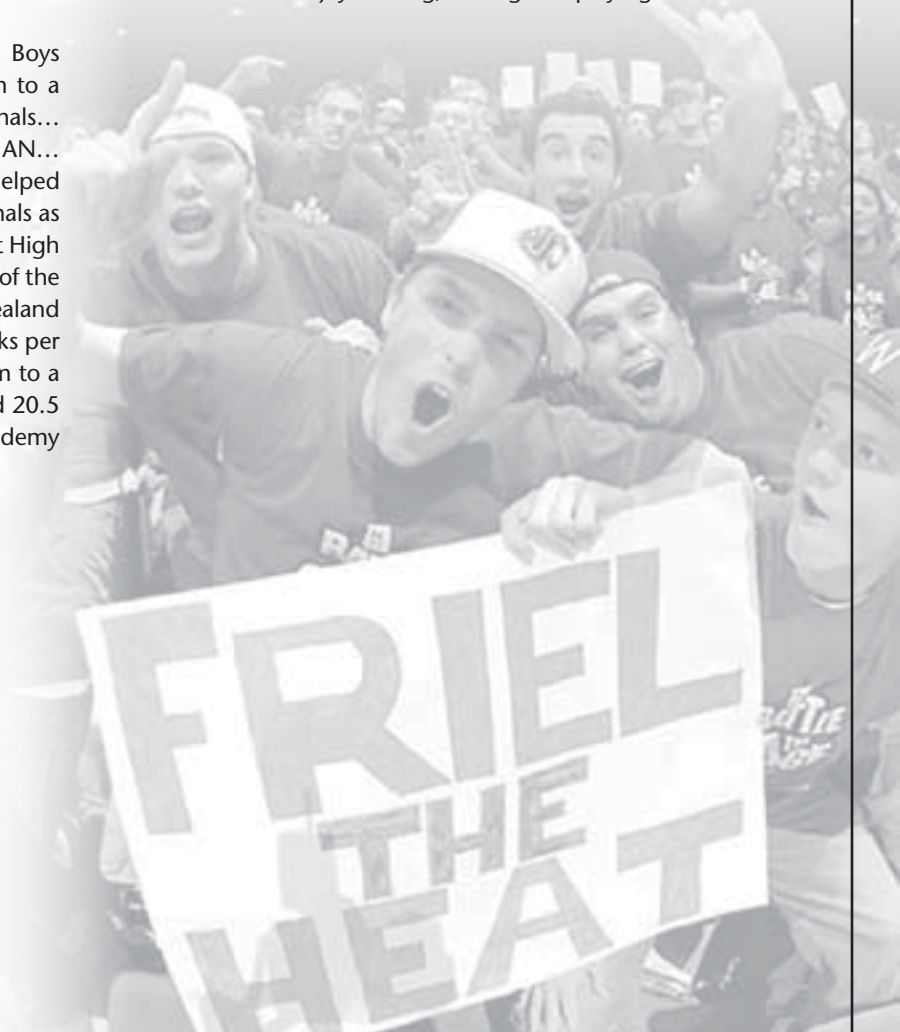

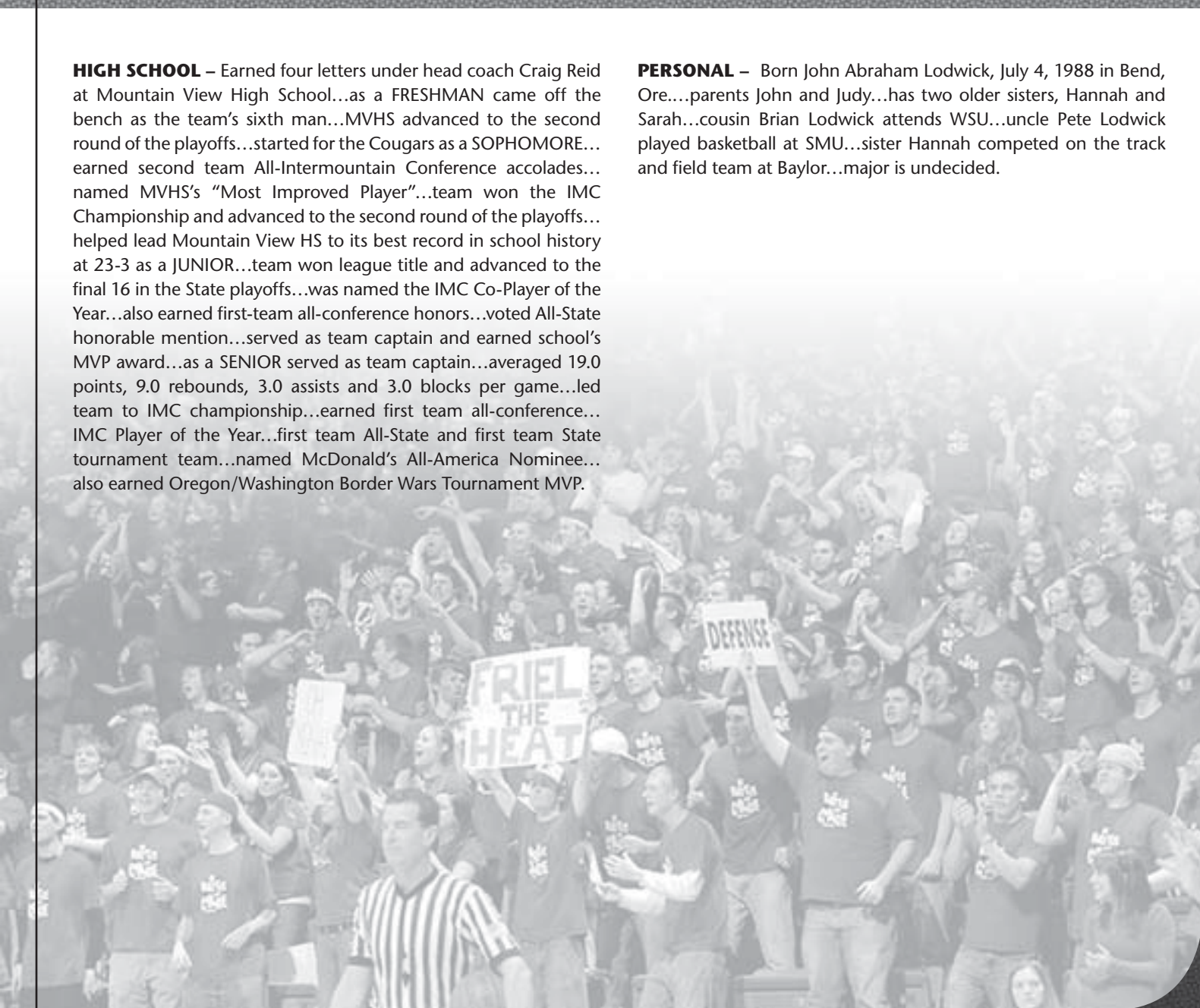
