USC PLAYS FINAL HOME GAME SATURDAY VS. WSU

• Will Play Wednesday at 2:30 p.m. in Pac-12 Tourney •

TODAY'S GAME -- USC (6-24, 1-16) will host Washington State (14-15, 6-11) at the Galen Center on March 3 at 3 p.m. The game will be streamed live and for free on USCTrojans.com. USC has lost eight consecutive games and is 1-17 in its last 18 games. Today is Senior Day with Trojan senior guard Eric Strangis and senior managers Doug Cottier and Chris Steele being honored before the game.

BREAKING DOWN THE COUGARS -- The Cougars are led in scoring by junior forward Brock Motum who averages 17.8 points per game. WSU defeated USC 60-53 on Feb. 2 in Pullman, Wash., but the Trojans lead 67-45 in the all-time series. Washington State is coming off a 78-46 loss at UCLA on March 1 and is 1-7 in conference road games this season.

TROJANS FALL TO WASHINGTON -- Washington scored an opponent-high in points in cruising to an 80-58 win over the Trojans at the Galen Center on March 1. Washington led 40-26 at the break on the strength of outrebounding USC 30-10 in the first half. The 40 points allowed in the first half were the most scored by a Trojan opponent this season. USC battled back to cut the score to 49-40 with 13 minutes left in the game, but the Huskies responded with a 7-0 run to take back command of the game. Bryron Wesley led USC with a career-high 23 points, while Garret Jackson chipped in with 14. James Blasczyk added a career-high 10 points. Terrence Ross led Washington with 18 points. Washington ended up with a 49-23 rebound bulge, including hauling down 20 offensive boards. USC's 45.1 percent shooting was its highest since hitting 48.0 percent vs. Utah in its only Pac-12 win on Jan. 28 and it was just the sixth time in the last 22 games that the Trojans shot above 40 percent from the field.

PAC-12 TOURNAMENT ON DECK -- USC will play in the Pac-12 Tournament on March 7 at 2:30 p.m. at the Staple Center. What isn't decided yet is who the Trojans' opponent will be. The game will be broadcast on 690 AM and televised on FSN.

TROJANS STINGY WITH TURNOVERS - As a young team playing with no senior scholarship players and just three scholarship players who had played in the USC system before, USC has committed just 10.8 turnovers per game, tied for 15th-best in the country. USC has had 9 or less turnovers in 12 of the last 15 games and has had 12 or less turnovers 22 times. USC is tops in the Pac-12 with a +4.5 turnover margin. USC has committed 135 less turnovers than its opponents.

WESLEY AMONG FRESHMAN LEADERS - USC wing Byron Wesley ranks among the top Pac-12 freshmen in six different category averages: scoring (9.6, 4th), rebounds (5.0, T-4th), defensive rebounds (4.1, 2nd), assists (1.8, 8th), steals (0.8, 7th) and minutes (34.5, 1st). He has gotten better as the season has progress, registering a career high in points in each of his last three games (18, 22 and 23) for an average of 21 points per game in that stretch.

MOJO, MAN OF STEAL - Sophomore guard Maurice Jones has 121 career steals, already ninth on the Trojans' all-time steals list. Jones' 69 steals last season set a USC freshman record and his 52 so far this season already rank fourth all-time by a Trojan sophomore. Jones currently ranks fourth among active Pac-12 players in career steals, the only sophomore in the top 10.

MIGHTY MO - USC's Maurice Jones (38.1) is one of nine players in the country averaging 38.0 or more minutes per game. **Also, Jones' 13.3 points per game average ranks eighth in the conference, but in terms of percentage of a teams' scoring, he is second in the conference at 24.1 percent. Washington State's Brock Motum leads all players, scoring 25.7 percent of the Cougars' points.**

KO'S CORNER -- Kevin O'Neill was named the USC head coach on June 20, 2009 and brought with him a tireless energy, a brilliant basketball mind and a vast depth of experience at both the collegiate and NBA levels. He has had highly successful stops as a coach or head coach at both the college and NBA levels which have helped him develop strong NBA ties and some impressive defensive systems. In three seasons at the helm of the USC program, O'Neill has compiled a 41-53 record. He guided USC to a 19-15 record and into the NCAA Tournament last season. The Trojans finished tied for fourth in the Pac-10 conference and reached the Pac-10 semifinals. Along the way he oversaw the development of NBA first round draft selection Nikola Vucevic, who went from averaging 2.6 points per game prior to O'Neill's arrival to averaging 17.1 points, a conference-leading 10.3 rebounds and first team all-conference honors. In his first season in 2009-10, O'Neill led USC to a 16-14 record and a fifth-place tie in the Pac-10 Conference. He was named the 2010 Pac-10 Coach of the Year by CollegeInsiders.com. USC was in the hunt for the conference title until the final two weeks of the season, despite playing the second half of the year under the knowledge that self-imposed sanctions would prohibit them from postseason play. O'Neill brings 14 years of collegiate and NBA head coaching experience and has worked in the coaching ranks for 31 years. He has served as a collegiate head coach at Marycrest (1983), Marquette (1990-94), Tennessee (1995-97), Northwestern (1998-00), Arizona (2008) and USC. He also was the NBA's Toronto Raptors' head coach in 2004. O'Neill has compiled a 229-247 career mark as a collegiate head coach, despite for the most part taking over programs that were rebuilding. When he served as an assistant at Arizona under Lute Olson from 1987-89, the Wildcats went 82-19 and went to the Final Four one season. He was named Olson's successor for the 2008 season and guided Arizona to a 19-15 record and into the NCAA Tournament despite four of its top five players being freshmen or sophomores. In seven of his 14 seasons as a head coach of a Division I program, he has guided his teams into the postseason.

BIG GAME HUNTERS -- USC has four wins against ranked teams outside of the conference in the three seasons with Kevin O'Neill as the head coach. The Pac-12 as a whole has a total of nine wins in that stretch against ranked non-conference opponents.

FACING THE BEST -- USC's 2011-12 schedule features 22 of 31 games against teams which finished the 2010-11 season with a record of .500 or better. Among the nonconference highlights were games against perennial national powers Kansas, UNLV, New Mexico, Minnesota, Nebraska, South Carolina and Georgia. Through games of March 1, 20 of the 30 games USC has played are against teams that are currently above .500 and 18 games have been against teams that have won 17 or more games. Eleven games have been against teams with nine losses or less. Sixteen of the last 19 games USC has played were against teams with above .500 records.

TROJANS ON THE RADIO -- USC's radio flagship station once again will be ESPN Radio 710 with Chris Fisher and Jim Hefner calling all the action.

PAC-12 PREDICTIONS -- USC was picked to finish 7th (194 points) in 2011-12 in the Pac-10 Conference in a vote by the league media. UCLA was picked 1st (421), California 2nd (405), Arizona 3rd (404), Washington 4th (355), Oregon 5th (282), Stanford 6th (255), Oregon State 8th (188), Arizona State 9th (148), Colorado and Washington State 10th (119) and Utah 12th (74).

A HISTORY OF WINNING -- USC has compiled a record of 1,500-1,095* in its 106 years of inter-collegiate basketball competition. USC has had a .500 or better record in 76 of the first 105 seasons.

THE GALEN ADVANTAGE -- USC is 4-12 at home this season and is 67-31 in six seasons at the Galen Center since it opened on Nov. 16, 2006. USC is also 34-11 in nonconference games at the Galen Center.

IT'S A NEW DAY... -- The Trojans had to replace a great deal of their production from the 2010-11 season as starters Nikola Vucevic, Alex Stepheson, Donte Smith and Marcus Simmons all departed and returning senior point guard Jio Fontan suffered a torn ACL on the team's trip to Brazil this summer. That left Maurice Jones' 9.9 points and Garrett Jackson's 3.2 as the only returning scorers from a season ago. The 5-7 Jones is also USC's leading returning rebounder at 2.6 boards per game. USC returns 19.7 percent of its points per game and 12.4 percent of its rebounds per game, all lows for a Pac-12 team.

TROJAN TIDBITS -- USC has only three seniors on its roster, Jio Fontan who will likely miss this season due to injury, Eric Wise who transferred from UC Irvine and will have to sit out the 2011-12 season and walk-on guard Eric Strangis. Nine of USC's 17 players are either freshmen or sophomores. Ten of the 17 players never played in a game for the Trojans before the opener.

INJURY UPDATES -- Curtis Washington (So, F) had surgery to repair his labrum on Aug. 24 and is expected to miss the season. Jio Fontan (Sr. G) had surgery to repair his left ACL on Sept. 13 and is expected to miss the season. Evan Smith (So., F) reinjured the left glenoid labrum of his left shoulder on Oct. 18 which had previously been repaired on Dec. 23, 2010. Smith was treated with a conservative treatment plan of rest and rehabilitation, with the goal of returning him to basketball activity without surgical intervention. He returned to action on Dec. 10 vs. New Mexico, but was shut down after the Dec. 22 game vs. Kansas and is done for the season. Aaron Fuller is scheduled to have surgery on his left labrum on Jan. 26 and is done for the season. Dewayne Dedmon suffered a torn MCL on Jan. 26 and is likely out for the season. * 21 wins and one loss in 2007-08 later vacated due to NCAA penalty.

PAC-12 TELECONFERENCES

The Pac-12 media teleconferences began on Tuesday, Dec. 20 and then go every Tuesday from Jan. 3 until March 6. Media can call the Pac-10 at (925) 932-4411 for the call-in number. Kevin O'Neill's time slot begins at 11:20 a.m. To listen to the taped replay, media can call (402) 222-9927.

A BIG HILL TO CLIMB -- When starting point guard and senior leader Jio Fontan went down with a knee injury in August it left USC with just 19.7 percent of its scoring returning and 12.4 percent of its rebounding returning entering the 2011-12 season. In terms of returning scoring for teams from BCS conferences (ACC, Big East, Big 12, Big Ten, SEC and Pac-12), only 3 schools: St. Johns (3.7 percent), Boston College (10.8 percent) and Texas (17.0 percent) have a lower percentage of returning production. There were only eight schools in the country which entered the season with less than 20 percent of its scoring returning from a season ago.

FULLER HAS SURGERY -- USC forward Aaron Fuller, who was second on the team in scoring (10.6) and first in rebounding (5.9) when he was shut down for the season with a labrum tear in his left shoulder. He underwent successful surgery on his shoulder at USC Hospital on Jan. 26 performed by Dr. James Tibone. Fuller originally suffered a bilateral labrum tear in his left shoulder, his shooting shoulder, in a preseason scrimmage against Air Force. He mainly shot right-handed this season, but then suffered a slight tear in his right shoulder on the trip to the Bay Area. He scored in double-figures the first 6 games, but only 3 times in his final 12 games (all starts).

DEDMON SUFFERS MCL TEAR -- USC sophomore forward Dewayne Dedmon was diagnosed with a torn medial collateral ligament (MCL) in his left knee and a tibial bone bruise of his left leg and is likely out for the remainder of the season, it was announced on Jan. 27. Dedmon hurt his knee four minutes into the game on Jan. 26 when a Colorado player took a charge and fell back into Dedmon, hyper-extending his leg. Dedmon will begin a non-surgical treatment of rest and rehabilitation and will be evaluated week to week. Dedmon averaged 7.6 points and 5.5 rebounds in 20 games this season. As Dedmon started to practice and play on a consistent basis, he improved upon those numbers to 9.6 points and 5.9 rebounds in the first seven Pac-12 games before suffering the injury. Before the season Dedmon suffered a fracture in his right hand and had to practice with a cast and then, suffered a stress injury in his right foot which forced him out of practice from Nov. 28-Dec. 12).

AND THEN THERE WERE SEVEN SIX -- On the same day that USC's Aaron Fuller had season-ending surgery on his shoulder (Jan. 26), Dewayne Dedmon suffered an injury likely ending his season meaning USC now has five scholarship players who have suffered season-ending injuries: Dedmon (knee), Jio Fontan (knee), Fuller (labrum), Evan Smith (labrum) and Curtis Washington (labrum). USC has six scholarship players available on the active roster as two more players (Ari Stewart and Eric Wise) are transfers and unavailable until next season.

SUMMER MEMORIES... -- After the departure of four starters from last season, USC began its summer exhibition tour on Aug. 14 with a starting lineup of guards Jio Fontan, Maurice Jones and Evan Smith and forwards Aaron Fuller and Dewayne Dedmon. Only Maurice Jones remains playing from that starting lineup.

OSU KNOCKS USC OFF ROUTE 66 -- USC held its first 19 opponents to 66 points or less before Oregon State scored 78 against the Trojan defense on Jan. 21. It was the first time USC had started a season holding the opposition to 66 points or less for the first 19 games since the 1948 season when it held all 24 opponents to under 66 points. **USC has held its opponents to 60.4 points per game, tied for 24th in the country and is one of only four teams in the top 30 in that category to have a record under .500 (EMU, SMU, Sam Houston St.).**

NO DEFENSE FOR THIS -- USC has been outscored from the free throw line by 101 points. USC has struggled at the charity stripe, making just 61.0 percent (258-for-423). USC's opponents have connected at a 72.1 clip (359-for-498).

ALWAYS ENTERTAINING -- Fifty-four of the 94 games played by USC in the last three seasons have been decided by 10 points or less (57.4 percent). Also, 23 of the 53 losses have been decided by 6 points or less. USC played five consecutive games decided by 7 points or less to start the season before losing by 11 points to UNLV on Nov. 25. It was the first time since the 2010 season and just the third time in the past 21 seasons USC had played five straight games decided by 7 points or less. Twelve of USC's 30 games this season have been decided by 7 points or less and eight by 4 points or less.

DRIVEN BY DEFENSE -- USC has held its opponents to a conference-leading 60.4 points per game and a 43.8 shooting percentage through the first 30 games. USC held opponents to a conference low of 62.7 points per game during the 2010-11 season. USC was 13-1 in games it held the opponent under 60 points last season, the lone loss being its NCAA Tournament loss to VCU (59-46), yet is 4-9 this season when holding the opponent under 60 points. In the past three seasons, USC has held the opponent to under 60 points 94 times and is 71-23 in those games (.755 winning percentage). USC also held the opposition to under 40 percent shooting 16 times during the 2010-11 season and was 14-2 in those games. During the past seven seasons USC has held the opponent to under 40 percent shooting 110 times and is 85-25 in those games (.773 winning percentage). USC has allowed 80 points or more just six times in the first 94 games under head coach Kevin O'Neill and one of those games was a double-overtime contest. USC is 0-6 in those games.

IT'S A FINE LINE -- In 7 of USC's 24 losses this season, it has made more baskets than the opposition (NEB, SDSU, UNLV, UNM, Oregon, WSU, ASU). In those 7 losses the Trojans were outscored 110-46 from the free throw line. In the 23 losses overall, USC has been outscored 293-185 from the free throw line. In 9 of the 24 losses, USC was within 3 points, tied or had the lead with under 4 minutes left in the game.

USC RECRUITING CLASS FOR 2012-13 SEASON

The USC men's basketball program received signed National Letters of Intent (NLI's) from guard J.T. Terrell of Peninsula JC in Port Angeles, Washington and forward Strahinja Gavrilovic from La Jolla Prep in La Jolla, Calif. it was announced on Nov. 9 by USC men's basketball head coach Kevin O'Neill.

"J.T. is a dynamic scorer that will be able to impact our team offensively next year," said O'Neill. "He comes in with the experience of playing in the ACC which will allow him to have an immediate impact in the conference. He's an exceptional athlete that can score in a number of ways. He's as talented a perimeter player as I've coached in college."

Terrell is rated as the No. 1 junior college player in America by Swannys Roundball Review. The ultra-quick guard is playing this season at Peninsula JC in Washington, following a freshman season at Wake Forest. In one exhibition game this season for Peninsula, he scored 29 points. Terrell averaged 11.1 points per game during the 2010-11 season at WF, second on the team and fifth among ACC freshmen. Terrell played in all 32 games for WF and made 18 starts, while recording 16 double-figure scoring games. He made a splash in his collegiate debut by scoring 26 points vs. Stetson on Nov. 12, 2010, setting the WF freshman record for points in a first game. He had a season-best 32 points vs. Iowa on Nov. 30, 2010, making seven three-pointers, including the game-winner with two seconds left in the game. His seven three-pointers made tied a WF freshman record. He made 35.7 percent from beyond the arc (50-for-140) and his 50 three-point baskets are the fourth-most ever by a WF freshman. Terrell was one of the top high school scorers in the country as a senior at West Charlotte High, averaging 30 points per game. He was ranked the No. 49 prospect overall by ESPN.com. Terrell was a two-time All-State selection and led West Charlotte to a 22-10 record and the 4A Finals as a senior. His father James lettered two years in basketball at UNC Charlotte (1991-92).

"Strahinja is a very skilled forward who has the ability to use both hands and score inside and outside," said O'Neill. "He can really rebound outside of his area. He has a bright future and his best basketball is ahead of him. Once he adjusts to the college game, we expect him to have a key role in our future. He has a wide repertoire of moves which allows him to score in a number of ways and makes him hard to defend."

Gavrilovic is a 6-8, 220 forward from Kragujevac, Serbia who came to the U.S. this fall and will play his senior year at La Jolla Prep. He is known to have a solid inside and outside game out to three-point range and honed those skills as a member of the Serbian U18 team at the European Championships. His father Zoran played professionally in Europe for more than a decade and is now the Secretary General of the Basketball Association in Serbia.

FRESHMAN FOUNDATION - USC freshmen guards Byron Wesley and Alexis Moore look to be providing the Trojans with good building blocks for the future. Through 30 games, Wesley is the third-leading scorer and third-leading rebounder on the team with averages of 9.6 and 5.0 respectively. He is also second on the team in assists with 53. Moore is seventh on the team with a 4.3 scoring average, is third on the team in three-point baskets (23) and assists (49). Wesley has started every game and his 34.5 minutes per game played are the most by a freshman in the Pac-12. Wesley's season high in points is 23 vs. Washington on March 1. Moore has started 18 times this season, including 16 of the last 21 games. Moore had a season-best 18 points on Dec. 17 vs. Georgia and has scored in double figures five times. Moore had a season-high five assists vs. Arizona on Jan. 8 and a season-best six rebounds on Jan. 28 vs. Utah.

JACKSON MEANS ACTION - Since being inserted into the starting lineup 12 games ago, sophomore Garrett Jackson has scored 11.0 points per game or 132 total points. That total is 61 more points than he had scored in USC's first 18 games while coming off the bench. In the 12 starts he ranks only behind Maurice Jones (11.8) and Byron Wesley (14.1) for points per game by a Trojan. Jackson also has 13 blocks and 13 steals in his starts.

ALLEN MAKING MOST OF INCREASED ACTION - Junior Greg Allen has scored 72 points in USC's last nine games for an 8.0 per game average. He had totalled 16 points in USC's previous 13 games and 43 in his first 15 games. Allen had a career-high 17 points while making five 3-pointers at Washington State on Feb. 2. Allen has averaged 7.5 points in the 14 games he logs 20 or more minutes (105 total points).

IF AT FIRST YOU DON'T SUCCEED... - USC led 32-14 at the half vs. Utah on Jan. 28, **just the seventh time (5-2) all season the Trojans had led a game at halftime.** USC's lead in the second half was its first following halftime in a game since winning 83-59 vs. TCU on Dec. 19. USC's second-half lead at ASU on Feb. 25 was just the second time the Trojans led after halftime in a conference game this season.

BOARD GAMES -- USC outrebounded California 38-28 on Dec. 29, including getting 18 offensive boards, its most since registering 20 in the third game of the 2010-11 season. USC is 4-2 this season when having more or the same amount of rebounds as the opposition and is 2-22 when being outrebounded. USC has been outrebounded in its last 16 games. USC has allowed 10 or more offensive rebounds 18 times. Colorado had 51 rebounds vs. USC on Jan. 26, the most by a Trojan opponent since Stanford also had 51 on March 7, 2002. USC then allowed Washington to grab 52 rebounds on Feb. 4, the most by a Trojan opponent since LMU had 53 on Dec. 9, 1998. **USC has been outrebounded by an average of 18.9 rebounds per game in the last 10 contests (237 to 426).**

SHOOTING STRUGGLES CONTINUE -- USC snapped a streak of six consecutive games shooting under 40 percent from the field when it shot 41.0 percent at Oregon on Jan. 19. In the last 12 games USC has shot over 40 percent five times, but one of the games was when they shot a season-low 28.8 percent at Washington on Feb. 4. USC is shooting 23.9 percent (59-for-247) from three-point range in its last 15 games. **USC's 39.3 shooting percentage ranks last in the conference and is on pace to be the lowest shooting percentage by a Trojan team since USC shot 38.9 percent as a team during the 1964 season, the last Trojan team to shoot under 40.0 percent.**

TERRELL'S BEEN A TERROR -- USC's top recruit JC guard J.T. Terrell has averaged 25.0 points through 27 games (23-4) for Peninsula JC (Wash.). Peninsula clinched a spot in the 2012 NWAACC Basketball Championships last Monday. He's hitting 49 percent from the field, 39 percent from three-point range and 79 percent from the foul line. In Peninsula's win on Dec. 3 vs. No. 7 Highline, Terrell scored 38 points, hit a three-pointer for the lead and then added two free throws to seal the victory. Terrell has scored 30 or more points in 11 of Peninsula's 27 games.

LET'S GIVE THE DEFENSE SOME CREDIT... -- USC has struggled to score points this season, averaging 53.4 points per game and 11 times being held under 50 points which has all been duly noted. What hasn't been mentioned is that 15 games USC has played are against teams ranking in the top 80 in scoring defense (out of 344 teams).

WHERE DID HE COME FROM... - Junior 5-10 walk-on Daniel Munoz came out of nowhere on Jan. 19 at Oregon to play 27 minutes for the Trojans, his first game of the season. His minutes, shots (0-for-3), points (2) and rebounds (3) were all career highs. Munoz had played a total of 5 minutes without a shot attempt in his 3-year career prior to the game at Oregon. Munoz then started on Jan. 21 at Oregon State and played a total of 12 minutes, including making his first career three-point basket to finish with a career-high three points.

SLOW STARTS -- In 21 of its 30 games, USC has scored more or the same amount of points in the second half. In the last 22 games, USC has scored under 20 points in the first half nine times, but scored 28 or more points in the second half in 15 of those games.

JONES EARNS HONORS -- USC guard Maurice Jones was named Pac-12 Player of the Week for the week of Nov. 21-27 as he averaged 19.0 points and 3.0 assists and the Trojans went 2-1. In the 63-60 win vs. South Carolina on Nov. 26, Jones set a USC record by making all seven 3-point attempts. He made 57.1 percent of his field goal attempts for the week (20-for-35) and 62.5 percent of his 3-point attempts (10-for-16). He was also named Pac-12 Player of the Week by College Sports Madness and was named to the Las Vegas Invitational All-Tournament team.

VUCEVIC KEEPS USC ROLLING IN THE NBA DRAFT -- USC's Nikola Vucevic was selected by Philadelphia as the 16th pick in the 2011 NBA Draft, becoming the fifth Trojan selected in the first round of the draft since 2007. USC's five first-round selections ties for the fifth-most in the country during that period and only USC and Kansas have had at least one player selected in the top 16 picks in four of the last five drafts. USC has had more first round selections in the past five years (2007-11) than any Big East team and more than perennial power Duke.

SUMMER BUSINESS TRIP TO BRAZIL -- USC went 2-2 on a four-game trip to Brazil in August in which they played some of the top Brazilian professional teams. Jio Fontan scored 57 points in the first two games before getting injured in the third game. Maurice Jones averaged 13.8 points and Garrett Jackson averaged 9.5 points and 8.0 rebounds in the four games. Dewayne Dedmon improved in each game and finished the trip with a 19-point, 5-rebound and 4-block effort. Alexis Moore started the final game in place of Fontan and poured in 16 points and had four assists and just one turnover.

DARK WATERS -- USC has lost a school-record 24 games. The previous record for losses in a season was 22 (10-22) in the 1989 season. It should be noted that teams have more games on their schedules than they used to.

TROJANS GRAB ANOTHER 40 -- When USC scored 47 points vs. Stanford on Feb. 12, it marked the 11th game this season it has scored under 50 points. That is the most games scoring 49 points or less in a season for the Trojans since registering 13 such games during the 1948 season.

O'NEILL TO MEET WITH SIX MARINES AFTER THE GAME -- USC head coach Kevin O'Neill will meet with six U.S. Marines from the Wounded Warrior Battalion West at Camp Pendleton. These Marines have had tours in the Gulf and will be in attendance at the USC-Washington State game at the Galen Center Saturday. O'Neill is expected to meet with them just after his postgame press conference.

Bryron Wesley led USC with a career-high 23 points, while Garret Jackson chipped in with 14. James Blasczyk added a career-high 10 points. Terrence Ross led Washington with 18 points. Washington ended up with a 49-23 rebound bulge, including hauling down 20 offensive boards. USC's 45.1 percent shooting was its highest since hitting 48.0 percent vs. Utah in its only Pac-12 win on Jan. 28 and it was just the sixth time in the last 22 games that the Trojans shot above 40 percent from the field.

THE 2011-12 TROJANS -- USC returns only two players who logged significant minutes for the 2010-11 team. USC went 19-15 and advanced to the NCAA Tournament where it lost in the first round to eventual NCAA Final Four team VCU. The lone player returning who started a year ago is 2010-11 Pac-10 All-Freshman team selection Maurice Jones (25 starts). Jones averaged 9.9 points, 3.2 assists and 2.6 rebounds, while setting the USC freshman steals record with 69. The 5-7 guard's 2.6 rebounds per game are the most by a returning Trojan. USC lost key seniors Marcus Simmons, Donte Smith and Alex Stepheson and junior Nikola Vucevic departed early for the NBA. Also, USC had expected to rely heavily on senior point guard and co-captain Jio Fontan, but he tore his ACL on the team's exhibition trip to Brazil in August. With Fontan's injury, only Jones (337 points), sophomore forward Garrett Jackson (107 points) and injured redshirt sophomore forward Evan Smith (13 points) have scored any points in a Trojan uniform entering this season.
