

Washington State finally got into the end zone on Brink's 8-yard pass to Michael Bumpus in the third quarter, but Daniel Padilla added field goals of 43 and 39 yards for the Ducks, who scored more points against the Cougars than in 85 previous meetings. Brink completed 15-of-33 passes for 251 yards, but was sacked six times.



## WSU 33, STANFORD 17

**Nov. 10, 2007, Pullman, Wash.** – Alex Brink threw for 449 yards and broke the school record for career touchdown passes, leading Washington State to a 33-17 victory over Stanford. In a game marred by fumbles and penalties, Washington State (4-6, 2-5 Pac-10) had 561 yards of total offense and the Cougars withstood a third-quarter rally by the Cardinal (3-7, 2-6). Brink completed 32-of-47 passes and upped his career yards passing to 10,200. He became only the sixth quarterback in Pac-10 history to surpass 10,000 yards and 70 touchdowns. Brink's 12-yard scoring pass to tight end Ben Woodard in the second quarter was the 71st in his career, breaking the school record of 70 set by Jason Gesser from 1999-2002. Brink wasn't the only player setting records for WSU. Senior wide receiver Michael Bumpus caught an 18-yard pass from Brink in the first quarter for the 177th reception of his career, moving past the mark of 176 set by Hugh Campbell from 1960-62. Bumpus finished with seven receptions for 96 yards. Brandon Gibson had seven catches for 153 yards and tight end Jed Collins had 10 catches for 123 yards. Christopher Ivory, returning from a concussion, had 15 carries for 104 yards for the Cougars. Husain Abdullah intercepted Stanford quarterback Tavita Pritchard's pass and returned it 55 yards to give the cougars a 33-17 lead late in the game. Cougars kicker Romeen Abdollahmohammadi hit field goals of 40, 23, 32 and 31 yards.

**Nov. 17, 2007, Pullman, Wash.** – Yvenson Bernard ran for two touchdowns and Oregon State came up with seven interceptions in a 52-17 victory over Washington State. Lyle Moevao, James Rodgers, Clinton Polk and Matt Sieverson also ran for scores as the Beavers assured themselves of a bowl game. The Beavers came into the game with the best run defense in the nation at 62.1 yards per game. Making the best of his second career start, Moevao completed 15-of-28 for 202 yards, and threw for another TD. The Beavers had 431 yards of total offense. Bernard carried 17 times for 74 yards while Kevin McCall had scoring runs of 19 and 1 yards for the Cougars' only touchdowns. Brink completed 21-of-45 for 314 yards. He was sacked once. WSU had 397 yards of total offense, but only 83 yards rushing on 30 carries. WSU wide receiver Brandon Gibson added 135 yards receiving on five catches and linebacker Cory Evans set a school record with 6.5 tackles for loss.

## WSU 42, WASHINGTON 35

**Nov. 24, 2007, Seattle, Wash.** – Alex Brink threw for 399 yards and five touchdowns, the last a 35-yarder to Brandon Gibson with 31 seconds left, and Washington State (5-7, 3-6 Pac-10) came from behind to win the 100th Apple Cup 42-35 against Washington. Brink completed 27-of-40 throws in his 40th and final start. He became the first Cougar quarterback to beat the Huskies three times while setting a record for passing yards in an Apple Cup game. Redshirt freshman Jake Locker returned from a scary neck injury two weeks prior to rush for 103 yards and two touchdowns - including a go-ahead, 1-yard run that gave Washington (4-8, 2-7) a 35-28 lead with 12:18 remaining. Locker threw two interceptions, the final one in the end zone by Alfonso Jackson as time expired. On WSU's final drive, Brink found Michael Bumpus for 18 yards and then 22 yards before his decisive throw to Gibson, who had six catches for 137 yards and two scores while setting the school record for receiving yards in a season. Washington State rallied from deficits of 10-0 and 17-7 to take a 21-20 lead at halftime, thanks mostly to 222 passing yards from Brink and two touchdown throws to third-string tight end Devin Frischknecht. Chris Ivory ran for 114 yards and WSU's other touchdown in the first half.
