OKLAHOMA STATE 39, WSU 13



Aug. 30, 2008, SEATTLE – Kendall Hunter ran for a career-best two touchdowns and Zac Robinson passed for or 182 yards and ran for another score in the Cowboys' 39-13 win over the Cougars. The Cowboys, seventh last season nationally in total offense at 486 yards per game, gained just 367 yards. Twelve of their first 25 points came thanks to a 42-yard punt return by Dez Bryant, a safety and a 90-yard kickoff return for a touchdown by Perrish Cox. Paul Wulff, the first graduate to lead the Cougars since Phil Sarboe left after the 1949 season, debuted his no-huddle, spread offense against the Cowboys. The Cougars trailed 18-0 before star receiver Brandon Gibson, who finished with six catches for 53 yards, made a twisting catch in the end zone off a 9-yard pass from Gary Rogers. The Cougars countered with a touchdown in the fourth when Gary Rogers rushed up the middle for 3 yard gain, putting the Cougars down by nine.

Nov. 22, 2008, PULLMAN – Sophomore kicker Nico Grasu kicked three field goals, one to end regulation and two in overtime, to lift Washington State to a 16-13, come-from-behind victory over rival Washington in the Apple Cup. Trialing by three with 56 seconds remaining in regulation, the Cougars drove 69 yards, including a 48-yard Kevin Lopina-to-Jared Karstetter pass to the Washington 18 and was capped by Grasu's 28-yard field goal with no time remaining to send the game to overtime. After the teams exchanged field goals, the Cougar defense held Washington to a missed field goal in the second overtime, setting the stage for Grasu's 37-yard game-winner. After going scoreless in the first half, Logwone Mitz put WSU on the board with a 57-yard, third-quarter touchdown run. The Huskies scored 10 points in the second quarter and took that margin into halftime. Greg Trent led the WSU defense with a game-high 12 tackles as WSU won the Apple Cup for the second-straight year and fourth time in the last five seasons.

Nov. 29, 2008, Honolulu, Hawaii. – Greg Alexander threw for 315 yards and two touchdowns to lead Hawaii to a 24-10 victory over Washington State in the Cougars' 2008 season finale. After spotting Hawaii to a 14-0 lead, the Cougars found the scoreboard on Nico Grasu's 26-yard field goal in the second quarter. In the third Dwight Tardy's one-yard touchdown run cut the lead to 17-10, but WSU drew no closer. Freshman quarterback JT Levenseller came in late in the second quarter to replace injured Kevin Lopina and completed 6-of-11 passes for 53 yards. Senior receiver Brandon Gibson had one reception for 18 yards to finish his Cougar career as the school's career leader in receiving yards (2,756) and second all-time in receptions with 182. Senior linebacker Greg Trent, a four-year starter, recorded one tackle to finish his career with 323 tackles, seventh all-time at WSU.
