WASHINGTON STATE COUGARS (2-10) AT HAWAII WARRIORS (6-5) NOVEMBER 29 › ALOHA STADIUM 8:05 P.M. (PT)

SATURDAY'S MATCHUP: Coming off their fourth Apple Cup victory in the past five years, the Washington State Cougars (2-10) close out their 2008 schedule when they visit the Hawaii Warriors (6-5) at Aloha Stadium Saturday at 6:05 p.m., Hawaiian time (8:05 p.m. PT). It will mark the fifth time in the past 50 years the Cougars have ended their regular season with a team other than Washington (2002 UCLA, 1998 Hawaii, 1987 California and 1959 Houston).

WSU-HAWAII SERIES: Saturday's matchup marks the fourth meeting between the two teams and the first since a 22-14 WSU victory in Hawaii, Nov. 27, 1999. The Cougars hold a 2-1 advantage all-time, having dropped the first meeting 20-11 in 1925. Four years later WSU evened the series with a 28-7 victory and the only other meeting came in 1999. All three previous games have been played at Hawaii. Saturday's contest is the first of a three-game agreement between the two schools, with Hawaii traveling east for the game in 2009 and the Cougars returning to Hawaii during the 2011 season.

GIBSON PASSES HILL ON CAREER YARDS LIST: With his second catch at Arizona State two weeks ago, an 11-yard reception from Kevin Lopina, senior Brandon Gibson passed former teammate Jason Hill to become the all-time leader in career receiving yards. Gibson, who last week moved into sole possession of second place on the career receptions list (181), enters the final game of his career with 2,738 career receiving yards. He would need 14 receptions to tie former teammate Michael Bumpus on the career receptions list.

HAWAII WEEK PRACTICE SCHEDULE: This week's (Nov. 23-30) practice schedule preceding the Hawaii contest (Nov. 29) will be slightly different than WSU's normal media times. The Cougars will not practice Sunday and Monday, then will hold morning practices at 9 a.m. Tuesday and Wednesday. Media availability will follow the Tuesday practice only. There will be no media availability following Wednesday practice as the team will leave for Hawaii shortly after practice. Coach Wulff will hold his Tuesday conference call at 1 p.m., but will not have his regular Thursday call due to the Thanksgiving holiday.

APPLE CUP GOES CRIMSON...AGAIN: For the second straight year, and fourth time in the last five seasons, Washington State defeated rival Washington to earn the Apple Cup trophy. The win marked the first time in series history the Cougars have won four of five Cups. Head Coach Paul Wulff also became the first Cougar head coach to win the Apple Cup in his debut season since Jim Sweeney did so in 1968. Having won the Cup in 2004, 2005 and 2007, the Cougars needed some late heroics and two overtimes to defeat the Huskies, 16-13. With 54 seconds left in regulation and trailing by three points, WSU marched 69 yards, highlighted by a Kevin Lopina to Jared Karstetter 48-yard pass, before Nico Grasu connected on a 28-yard field goal as time expired to send the game into overtime. The teams exchanged field goals in the first OT and after a defensive stop by the Cougars, Grasu drilled a 37-yard game-winning field goal, after which the Cougar fans stormed the field.

GRASU NAMED PAC-10 PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Sophomore kicker Nico Grasu was named the Pacific-10 Conference Special Teams Player of the Week following his performance against Washington. Grasu kicked three field goals, including the game-winner in the second overtime, to clinch the victory. Grasu's first field goal, a 28-yard attempt, came as time expired in regulation, sending it into overtime. Grasu then hit a 19-yarder in the first overtime before clinching the victory with a 37-yard field goal, capping a perfect 3-for-3 afternoon. Grasu is the second Cougar to earn POW honors this season as Marshall Lobbestael was the Pac-10 Offensive Player of the Week following the Portland State contest.

TRENT REACHES 300: Senior linebacker Greg Trent recorded a game-high 12 tackles against Washington to boost his team-leading total to 86 for the season. With his final tackle against Arizona two weeks ago, Trent became the 10th player in WSU history to record 300 tackles in a career. A four-year starter with 36 consecutive starts, Trent finished last week's game with 321 career tackles, placing him seventh on WSU's all-time list.

COUGS HONOR SENIORS: Saturday's contest against Washington marked the final home appearance for 19 seniors who played their last game in Martin Stadium. Prior to the contest the Cougars recognized the players for their contributions to Washington State University and the football program. The list of seniors included A'i Ahmu, Jared Bjerkestrand, Jeff Bowen, Markus Dawes, Kendrick Dunn, Matt Eichelberger, Cory Evans, Devin Frischknecht, Brandon Gibson, Luke Hansell, Adam Hineline, Alfonso Jackson, Vaughn Lesuma, Matt Mullennix, Gary Rogers, Tali Talakai, Greg Trent, Benny Ward and Ben Woodard.

FIRST STARTS: Through 12 weeks of the 2008 season, 26 WSU players have registered their first collegiate start, 17 on offense and nine on defense. WSU had six offensive players and three defensive players starting for the first time in the opener and since then have had a first-time starter in seven of the following nine weeks. Most recently against Arizona redshirt freshman running back Logwone Mitz and redshirt sophomore defensive tackle Toby Turbin made their collegiate starting debuts. The first-time starters includes four players on the offensive line, all underclassmen, which has used seven different starting units through 12 games this season. The 26 players include punter Dan Wagner and kickers Wade Penner and Nico Grasu.

SCORING STREAK ENDS: Following their loss to USC, the Cougars saw their 280-game scoring streak come to an end. WSU held the nation's second-longest active scoring streak, dating back to the 1984 season, before being held scoreless against the Trojans Oct. 18. WSU's streak marks the fourth-longest in NCAA Division I history, trailing only BYU (361), Michigan (296, active) and Texas (282). WSU also saw its conference-leading scoring streak end at 258 games as well as its 203-game Martin Stadium scoring streak.

MULLENNIX GETS WIN NUMBER FOUR: Following the Cougars win in last weeks Apple Cup, senior Matt Mullennix, who was granted a sixth year of eligibility by the NCAA prior to this season, became the first Cougar to be a part of four Apple Cup victories. Mullennix was a redshirt freshman on the 2004 squad that posted a 28-25 victory, though he missed the game after suffering a season-ending injury in the season's fourth game. Mullennix was also a part of the 2005 and 2007 winning teams.

COUGAR PRIDE STATUE CEREMONY: Cougar Pride, a 15-foot tall monument commissioned by Gary Schneidmiller (WSU class of '71) and created by artists Mike and Chester Fields, was dedicated during a ceremony at the Martin Stadium plaza, two hours prior to kickoff of the Apple Cup, proudly sponsored by Boeing. Dignitaries included Governor Chris Gregoire, WSU President Elson S. Floyd, Fran Forgette, Chair, WSU Board of Regents, Director of Athletics Jim Sterk, the Fields, and Schneidmiller. In its entirety, the sculpture is 14-feet, 5-inches long nose to tail, 6-feet, 4-inches wide, and weighs approximately 4,500 pounds; the cougar itself will stand 11-feet, 4-inches high. It is located on the Martin Stadium Plaza, adjacent to the main thoroughfare of campus, Stadium Way. Crafted by Mike Fields and his father Chester, the process of creating the statue began in May and was only completed earlier this month when the monument was cast in bronze.

HANNAM NAMED ALL-ACADEMIC DISTRICT VIII: Washington State University sophomore offensive lineman Micah Hannam has been named to the ESPN The Magazine/CoSIDA Academic All-District VIII First Team. It marks the second straight season Hannam was named to the squad, last year earning second-team honors. Hannam carries a 3.57 grade point average while majoring in civil engineering.

INJURY BUG HITS COUGARS: Through 12 games of the 2008 season, the Cougars have not been able to avoid the injury bug on either side of the ball. 25 of WSU's 45 players to start a game in 2008 have combined to miss 67 games this season due to injuries. The latest injury occurred to running back Chantz Staden, who suffered a significant knee injury against Arizona State and is not expected to play again this season. The wounded includes an injury-riddled offensive line, which has used seven different lineups, and eight different starting players, through the 12 games. WSU has also used three different starting quarterbacks, four running backs, five cornerbacks and two punters.

WHO'S YOUR DRADDY: Senior offensive lineman Vaughn Lesuma was named a semifinalist for the Draddy Trophy, the National Football Foundation and College Football Hall of Fame recently announced...the Draddy Trophy recognizes the best and brightest in college football, as nominees must have at least a 3.2 GPA, must be a first team player or significant contributor and must demonstrate strong leadership and citizenship...former WSU quarterback Alex Brink was a finalist for the award in 2007.

THOMPSON-LEVENSELLER CONNECTION, PART II: Freshman quarterback J.T. Levenseller's first pass completion of his career went to tight end Tony Thompson in the second quarter against Stanford. If the Thompson-Levenseller connection sounds familiar to Cougar fans, it should. Tony's father is legendary Cougar quarterback Jack Thompson while J.T.'s dad is Mike Levenseller, current WSU assistant coach and one of WSU's all-time best receivers. The original Thompson-Levenseller duo connected 97 times from 1975-77 and the pair remains close to this day, so much so that J.T., whose real name is Michael Jack Thomas Levenseller, was named after the elder Thompson.

LAST MEETING

WSU 22, Hawaii 14

Nov. 27, 1999, Honolulu, Hawaii

What began as either a contest of superb offense or inept offense turned into a second-half shootout as Washington State defeated Hawaii on its own turf 22-14 in front of 45,382 at a windy Aloha Stadium. Making his first collegiate start in his homestate, Jason Gesser got the Cougs going early with a nine-yard pass to Farwan Zubedi. Deon Burnett added three runs to set up a 41-yard Rian Lindell field goal in the first quarter. But for the next 30 minutes, both teams went scoreless, although both had their chances. Later in the first quarter Lamont Thompson intercepted a Dan Robinson pass at the WSU 25-yard line and returned it to the Hawaii 47. Two snaps later Burnett deposited the ball on the carpet and Hawaii recovered. Meanwhile, the WSU defense allowed Hawaii no farther than the WSU 37 to keep the lead at 3-0 heading into halftime. On the opening drive of the second half, WSU finally put more points on the board, driving 61 yards before Lindell connected from 36 yards for a 6-0 lead. The Rainbow offense came through on its second possession of the half when Robinson fired complete to Dwight Carter just beyond the reach of WSU's Marcus Trufant. Carter found the secondary empty and raced to an easy 75-yard touchdown that put the Rainbows up 7-6. On Hawaii's next possession Trufant atoned for his missed deflection with an interception and 45-yard return that gave WSU field position at the Rainbow 46. Two plays later, Adam Hawkins rumbled 30 yards for a touchdown and 12-7 lead. On the Cougars' next possession, Nian Taylor fumbled the ball away to Anthony Smith, who returned it 38 yards for a Rainbow go-ahead touchdown. WSU began its game-winning drive with 7:26 remaining. Hawkins provided six carries for 48 yards as WSU marked 73 yards before Lindell kicked a 24-yard field goal. After a defensive stop, Hawkins added four carries for 20 yards, capped by a six-yard touchdown run, to give the Cougars an eight-point margin of victory.



APPLE CUP NOTABLES: With the victory over the Huskies, WSU Head Coach Paul Wulff became the first head coach to win the Apple Cup in his debut season with the Cougars since Jim Sweeney in 1968...WSU's victory also gives the Cougars four Apple Cups in the last five years, the first time in the history of the rivalry that WSU has accomplished the feat...with sophomore cornerback Romeo Pellum's first quarter interception - his second of the season - the Cougar defense has now prevented its opponent from scoring on its first possession in each of the last three games...prior to the stretch, WSU had allowed scores on first possessions in seven of nine games to start 2008...with his five receptions, senior wide receiver Brandon Gibson claimed sole possession of second place on WSU's career receptions list...punter Reid Forrest's 28-yard rush in the second quarter was the third-longest rush of the season for the Cougars at the time...Logwone Mitz's 57-yard touchdown run in the third quarter was the Cougars' longest rush of the season, and WSU's longest scoring play in 2008...the touchdown ended a six-quarter scoreless streak for the Cougars...Mitz's 70 yards was a career high...Tyree Toomer's third quarter sack was the first of his career...after going four consecutive games without a sack, the Cougars have four sacks in their last three games...with 12 tackles, senior middle linebacker Greg Trent passed Gary Larsen (317; 1971-74) to move into seventh place on the WSU career tackles list...Trent now has 321 career tackles...Washington State won the Apple Cup for the first time in overtime...Washington won the previous two Apple Cups (1996 and 2002) that went into overtime.

BLAND EMERGING AT LINEBACKER: In WSU's contest at Oregon State, freshman Louis Bland recorded the first Cougar defensive score of the season when he intercepted a Lyle Moevao pass and raced 16 yards for a second-quarter score. Last week he recorded seven tackles and three tackles-for-loss, including a TFL in each of Washington's two overtime drives. For the season Bland has played in 11 games, starting eight, registering 51 tackles, fifth on the team, including 36 solo, with eight tackles for loss and an interception.

YOUTH IS SERVED: While the Cougars have had a number of first-time starters this season (26), they have also had an abundant number of underclassmen starting. Through 12 games this season, the Cougars

have started 22 different underclassmen, 13 on offense and nine on defense, including punters and kickers. Six true freshmen have seen action this season: wide receivers Jared Karstetter and Kevin Norrell, linebackers Mike Ledgerwood and Louis Bland, quarterback J.T. Levenseller and safety Tyree Toomer.

STADEN SHINES IN RETURN GAME: Three weeks ago against Stanford, Chantz Staden returned eight kickoffs, setting the school's single-game record...previous record was seven, set by John Davis (1969; Iowa) and Eric Johnson (1972; USC)...Staden also became the WSU record-holder for single-season kickoff return yards...Staden racked up 132 return yards against Stanford, and now has 970 on the season...Staden surpassed Bernard Jackson's mark of 744, set in 1971...Staden's 43 returns this year are first on the all-time single-season list.

LOBBESTAEI LOST FOR SEASON: Cougar redshirt freshman quarterback Marshall Lobbestael suffered a torn ACL and torn MCL in his left knee during the Cougars' game at Oregon State last month, and will miss the remainder of the season. Lobbestael was injured during the fourth quarter at Oregon State and did not return. Initially diagnosed as an MCL tear, further tests revealed both the ACL and MCL were torn. Lobbestael's recovery is expected to take approximately nine months. Lobbestael is the second starting quarterback this season to suffer a season-ending injury, as Gary Rogers suffered a stable cervical spine fracture that was non surgical against Portland State.

LEVENSELLER MAKES NUMBER FIVE: True freshman quarterback J.T. Levenseller saw his first action of the season against Stanford, playing three series and completing 2 of 4 passes for 20 yards. Levenseller is the fifth Cougar quarterback to go under center this season, joining Gary Rogers, Kevin Lopina, Marshall Lobbestael and Dan Wagner.

BACK-TO-BACK SHUTOUTS: Prior to the USC and Stanford shutouts, the last time WSU was shut out in back-to-back games was in 1969. The Cougars were shutout by 18th-ranked Stanford (49-0, Oct. 18) and California (17-0, Oct. 25).

RUEBEN MAYES 2008 COLLEGE FOOTBALL HALL OF FAME INDUCTEE

Former WSU record-setting All-America running back Rueben Mayes has been selected for induction into the College Football Hall of Fame, announced by the National Football Foundation. Mayes will be honored by the Cougars Sept. 27, when WSU hosts Oregon on Homecoming Day at Martin Stadium.

Mayes is the first Cougar player to be inducted into the Hall of Fame since tackle Glen "Turk" Edwards (1929-31) was enshrined in 1975, and the third player overall. Center Mel Hein (1928-30) was the first Cougar to be inducted in 1954. He also joins head coaches Orin "Babe" Hollingbery (1979) and Forest "Ev" Evashevski (2000), giving WSU five individuals in the Hall of Fame. Hollingbery coached WSU from 1926-42, while Evashevski coached the Cougars from 1950-51. Longtime

Cougar broadcaster Bob Robertson has also been honored by the National Football Foundation as he was the 2004 recipient of the Chris Schenkel Award, given annually to a sports broadcaster who has had a long and distinguished career broadcasting college football.

Mayes, who played for the Cougars from 1982-85, led the Pacific-10 Conference in rushing as both a junior and a senior, garnering league player of the year honors following each season. He completed his career as the Cougars' all-time leading rusher and ranked sixth on the conference career rushing list with 3,519 yards. He was the first Cougar running back to post back-to-back 1,000-yard seasons and held WSU's single-season rushing mark of 1,637 yards for more than 20 years until Jerome Harrison eclipsed that mark in 2005.

As a junior Mayes set WSU, Pac-10 and NCAA Division I records with 357 rushing yards against Oregon. He also had 216 yards against Stanford the previous week, setting WSU, Pac-10 and NCAA records for rushing yards in consecutive games (573 yards).

Drafted by New Orleans in the third round of the 1986 draft, Mayes was named the NFL Rookie of the Year after rushing for 1,353 yards in his first year with the Saints. He played with New Orleans through the 1991 season, earning selections to the Pro Bowl in 1986 and 1987. After playing five years with the Saints, Mayes played two seasons with the Seattle Seahawks before retiring. His professional totals included 866 carries for 3,484 yards and 23 touchdowns in seven seasons.

MARTIN STADIUM RENOVATION: Fans arriving at Martin Stadium this season will notice a number of improvements following a two-year renovation. The majority of the Phase I and II Martin Stadium renovation will be complete, most notably in the east end zone when new restrooms have been added, along with concessions, first aid, ADA accessible seating, new entry gates and convenient access to the North concourse and ticket office. An updated stadium map showing all new gate designations, ticket office, concessions, restrooms, first aid rooms, and seating areas can be accessed in the facilities section of www.wsucougars.com. The WSU Ticket Office has moved from the Visitor Center downtown to its new location in the northeast corner of Martin Stadium. Ticket sales, general will call, and player-guest will call will be located there on gameday. The most visible sign of the renovation at Martin Stadium this season is a new scoreboard/video board in the west end zone. The video display will measure approximately 53 feet wide by 25 feet high, over double the size of the previous video board. The scoreboard in the west end zone as well as the auxiliary board in the southeast corner have also been replaced. A new sound system was also included in the scoreboard replacement as well as new play clocks.

ROBERTS ADDED TO TEAM: Following an open tryout three weeks ago at Rogers Field, WSU Head Coach Paul Wulff announced freshman quarterback Peter Roberts has been added to the Cougar football team. "He's a very smart kid," Wulff said. "All we're asking him to do is help our scout team and help our defense. He's got some athletic ability and he's played quarterback." Roberts, a 6-foot-1, 190-pound Woodinville, Wash., native, was a three-year letterwinner in football at Woodinville High School, earning second-team All-KingCo honors as a senior.

QB TRIO EACH TALLY 100 YARDS: In WSU's win over Portland State, the Cougars had three quarterbacks that each threw for over 100 yards. Marshall Lobbestael (149), Kevin Lopina (109) and Gary Rogers (103) became the first Cougar trio to throw for over 100 in at least 26 years. The last time the Cougars had two quarterbacks throw for over 100 yards in the same game occurred during the 1999 season, when Steve Birnbaum (118) and Paul Mencke (157) eclipsed the century mark at Oregon.

LOBBESTAEL NAMED PAC-10 POW: Redshirt freshman Marshall Lobbestael was named the Pacific-10 Conference Offensive Player of the Week following WSU's 48-9 victory over Portland State. Lobbestael came in during the third quarter of the contest after the first two Cougar quarterbacks suffered injuries and completed 9-of-12 passes for 149 yards and two touchdowns. On his first attempt, Lobbestael found Jeshua Anderson for a 14-yard touchdown strike, the first completion and first touchdown pass of his career. On WSU's next possession, and Lobbestael's next attempt, he connected with Devin Frischknecht on a 53-yard touchdown pass. After Lobbestael entered the game the Cougars scored on each of their next four possessions.

REMEMBERING RANDAL SIMMONS – During the 2008 season, Washington State University players are wearing "RS" on the back of their helmets, honoring the late Randall Simmons. Simmons, who played at WSU from 1976-78, was a member of the SWAT team in Los Angeles when he was killed in the line of duty, Feb. 7, 2008.

ARIZONA STATE NOTABLES: Senior Brandon Gibson collected three receptions for 41 yards, passing Jason Hill to become WSU's all-time receiving yardage leader with 2,711...Gibson also moved into a tie for second on the all-time receptions list...senior Greg Trent moved into eighth place on the all-

time tackles list following his team-leading nine tackle performance...freshman Louis Bland registered his first career sack while sophomore Toby Turpin had his first two sacks of the season, the first Cougar this season with more than one sack in a game...punter Reid Forrest's 55-yard punt was his eighth punt this season over 50 yards.

ARIZONA NOTABLES: Sophomore defensive tackle Toby Turpin and redshirt freshman running back Logwone Mitz each made their first career starts against Arizona...running back Dwight Tardy's 18-yard first quarter touchdown run ended a scoring drought that lasted a total of 159-minutes, 18 seconds of game time...the touchdown gave the Cougars their first lead of the season against a Pacific-10 Conference school...WSU's first quarter touchdown were the first points off of a turnover since Louis Bland's 16-yard interception return for a touchdown against Oregon State...Cougars added a touchdown after recovering a third quarter fumbled punt...Logwone Mitz's 42-yard run at the end of the first quarter was the longest rush by a Cougar in 2008.

NOTABLES FROM STANFORD: True freshman J.T. Levenseller made his Cougar debut in the second quarter against the Cardinal...he finished his day completing 2 of 4 passes for 20 yards...Xavier Hicks led all players with 10 tackles, his second double-digit outing of the season...Chantz Staden set a WSU single-game record by returning eight kickoffs for 132 yards...defensive tackle Toby Turpin blocked an extra point attempt, the second straight game WSU has done so.

NOTABLES FROM USC: Redshirt sophomore Joe Eppelle made just his second career start at left tackle...senior defensive end Matt Mullennix blocked a Trojan extra point attempt in the second quarter...safety Xavier Hicks led all players with seven tackles.

NOTABLES FROM OREGON STATE: Redshirt freshman B.J. Guerra made his first career start against the Beavers, the 23rd player to register his first collegiate start for the Cougars this season...freshman linebacker Louis Bland's 16-yard interception return for a touchdown in the second quarter was the first by a Cougar since Husain Abdullah returned a pick for a touchdown against Stanford in 2007...the interception was the first of Bland's career...redshirt junior safety Xavier Hicks intercepted two Beaver passes...the last Cougar to pick off two passes in a game was Husain Abdullah against California in 2005...sophomore linebacker Myron Beck's second-quarter interception was the first of his career...junior defensive end Kevin Kooyman's seven tackles against the Beavers were a career high...junior defensive end Andy Mattingly's 11 tackles were a season high, and the most since his 11 against California in 2007.

NOTABLES FROM UCLA: Sophomore's Romeo Pellum and Myron Beck each recorded nine tackles against the Bruins...Pellum had eight solo tackles and a tackle-for-loss while Beck had seven solos and a TFL...Devin Giles, who started all 12 games last season, recorded his first start of the year in place of injured cornerback Tyrone Justin and responded with six tackles, all solo, and a pass break-up.

NOTABLES FROM OREGON: Reid Forrest's 60-yard punt was a career long and marked the third time in

the last four games that he recorded a career-best punt...sophomore guard Andrew Roxas returned to the starting lineup after missing the previous three games with a knee injury...redshirt junior safety Xavier Hicks became the first Cougar to record double-digit tackles in 2008 with 14...freshman wide receiver Jared Karstetter's eight-yard first quarter reception was the first of his career...junior wide receiver Michael Willis' fourth-quarter touchdown reception was the first of his career.

NOTABLES FROM PORTLAND STATE: The Cougars had four different players rush for 40 yards or more, led by Dwight Tardy's game-high 80 yards and one touchdown, part of a 277-yard effort by WSU on the night...Jeshua Anderson had his first touchdown reception of the season, a 14-yard score from Marshall Lobbestael...in his first game of the season, junior safety Xavier Hicks led WSU with seven tackles, four solo...the WSU defense had 10 pass break-ups on the game.

NOTABLES FROM BAYLOR: For the first time during the 2008 season, the Cougars took their opening drive to the end zone as Chantz Staden capped a nine-play, 44-yard drive with a one-yard touchdown run...Brandon Gibson finished his night with eight catches for 128 yards, the 10th time in his career he has eclipsed the 100-yard barrier...Kevin Lopina threw for a WSU season-high 174 yards and added an eight-yard touchdown run...for the second straight game, Reid Forrest had a career-best punt, this one going 59 yards, one yard better than his effort against Cal.

NOTABLES FROM CALIFORNIA: Quarterbacks Kevin Lopina and Marshall Lobbestael (redshirt freshman) each saw their first collegiate action...sophomore kicker Nico Grasu's 43-yard field goal was WSU's longest since Loren Langley's 48-yarder against Washington, Nov. 19, 2005...WSU returned 11 kickoffs for 298 yards, both single-game school records...redshirt junior running back Chantz Staden's 185 kickoff return yards rank second on WSU's individual single-game list...punter Reid Forrest's 58-yard punt was a career long and the longest punt since a 62-yard punt by Darrel Blunt against Oregon, Oct. 21, 2006...junior running back Chris Ivory's 68-yard kickoff return was a WSU season-long and longer than any WSU kickoff return in 2007.

NOTABLES FROM OKLAHOMA STATE: Redshirt junior linebacker Jason Stripling posted seven tackles in the first half, matching his career total...Stripling finished with eight tackles, including two for loss...safety Tyree Toomer, a true freshman, recorded six tackles in his first career game as a Cougar...senior wide receiver Brandon Gibson not only had his first career rush (14 yards), but also attempted his first career pass, though it was incomplete...redshirt junior kicker Patrick Rooney recorded a touchback on one of his kickoffs, matching WSU's total from all of last season.

HEAD COACH PAUL WULFF



Following the 2007 season, Washington State University Athletics Director Jim Sterk began a national search for the Cougars' next head football coach. At the conclusion of the search, Washington State hired one of its own as former student-athlete Paul Wulff was named the Cougars head coach, Dec. 10, 2007.

Wulff is WSU's 31st head coach and the first WSU football letterwinner and graduate to lead the Cougars since Phil Sarboe served as head coach from 1945-49.

A 1990 graduate of WSU and a four-year letterwinner, Wulff has spent the previous 15 seasons at Eastern Washington University, the final eight as head coach. There he amassed a record of 53-40. During his eight-year head coaching tenure Wulff was named Big Sky Conference Coach of the Year three times (2001, 2004, 2005) and led the Eagles into the Football Championship Subdivision playoffs three times in the last four years.

In 2007 he guided the Eagles to a 9-4 mark, including a quarterfinal appearance at the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision Playoffs, falling to two-time defending champion Appalachian State. It marked the seventh time in his eight years at Eastern

that his teams posted winning records.

Wulff began his coaching career at EWU in 1993 as a volunteer assistant working with the offensive line. He was named offensive line/strength coach the following season and spent four years in the position before being promoted to offensive coordinator/offensive line/strength coach in 1998.

Following two seasons as the team's offensive coordinator, Wulff was named head coach at Eastern prior to the 2000 season. He guided the Eagles to six straight winning seasons and seven overall during his eight-year tenure.

Wulff's 2005 team was loaded with experience, talent and leadership, featuring a group of seniors that included the Big Sky's Offensive and Defensive MVP's (Erik Meyer and Joey Cwik), and featured a trio of All-Americans (Meyer, Eric Kimble and Matt Alfred). Meyer would go on to win the Walter Payton Award as the best football player in the Football Championship Subdivision. Together, Meyer and Kimble rewrote Eastern's record book as they combined for 27 school records and four Big Sky marks. Meyer set a FCS record for passing efficiency rating (166.47 with 10,261 yards, 84 touchdowns, just 17 interceptions and a .657 completion rate), while Kimble's 46 touchdown grabs ranked second in FCS history behind the 50 of legendary Jerry Rice. The Eagles finished 7-5 and won the Big Sky title with a 5-2 record before losing to eventual national runner-up Northern Iowa in the first round of the playoffs.

The 2004 season was also special, even after the Eagles opened the season 0-2. Eastern won eight of its next nine games - most by substantial margins - as the Eagles closed the year with a 51-44 overtime victory at Montana State to secure a place in the playoffs. Quarterback Erik Meyer was named the league's Offensive Player of the Year and was a finalist for the Walter Payton Award. Senior offensive tackle Michael Roos joined Meyer, wide receiver Eric Kimble and guard Rocky Hanni as All-Americans, with Roos eventually being taken in the second round of the NFL draft by the Tennessee Titans.

In 2004, Wulff's squad finished 9-4 and advanced to the quarterfinals of the playoffs. The crowning glory came when the Eagles knocked off No. 1-ranked and top-seeded Southern Illinois in the first round. Statistically, the 2004 and 2005 teams were nearly identical with each finishing the year ranked fourth in FCS in total offense. In 2005 the Eagles averaged 477.8 yards per game, and were 14th in scoring (35.0). A year earlier the Eagles averaged 475.5 yards and 37.5 points per game to rank sixth.

Wulff coached 21 players to 54 Football Championship Subdivision (formerly Division I-AA) All-America honors in his first seven years at the helm of the EWU program, and two more of his players were named to the Sports Network's 2007 FCS All-America team at the conclusion of last year. Of the 21 players to earn All-America recognition, 15 have been offensive linemen. Additionally, Wulff has mentored 15 players who have earned 18 total CoSIDA Academic All-District VIII honors and a total of 131 All-Big Sky Conference Academic team members.

As a student-athlete and four-year starter at center for the Cougars from 1986-89, Wulff was an All-America honoree himself as a senior, earning honorable mention accolades from The Sporting News. Wulff started at center under three different coaches after redshirting in 1985. He played for Jim Walden in 1986, Dennis Erickson from 1987-88 and Mike Price in 1989. He was also the starting center on WSU's 1988 Aloha Bowl championship team.

After a successful collegiate career Wulff had a brief pro career as a center after graduating from Washington State University in 1990. He signed a free agent contract with the New York Jets, but was released after injuring an ankle and a rib in the preseason. He played in spring 1991 with Raleigh-Durham of the World League, then played in spring 1992 with New York-New Jersey.

A 1985 graduate of Davis High School in Davis, Calif., Wulff played for three different coaches while he was at WSU. He redshirted in 1985 and started four games at guard in 1986 under Jim Walden.

Dennis Erickson directed the program in 1987 and 1988 with Wulff as his starting center both years. In 1988, the Cougars were victorious in the Aloha Bowl as Wulff earned honorable mention All-Pacific 10 Conference honors. Under Mike Price in 1989, Wulff earned second-team all-conference honors and was an honorable mention selection on *The Sporting News* All-America squad. He was also WSU's long snapper during his stay there.

Wulff was born Feb. 25, 1967, in Woodland, Calif. He and his wife Sherry have a 13-year-old daughter, Katie, and two sons, five-year-old Max and two-year-old Sam.

WSU SCORING STREAKS

WSU had three significant scoring streaks come to an end when it faced USC Oct. 18.

WSU had scored in 280 consecutive games prior to the USC games dating back to a 44-0 shutout at Ohio State in 1984...the streak was the second-longest active streak among FBS schools and the fourth-longest all-time...schools with active streaks currently ranking in the top 10 all-time: Michigan 295 (#2 all-time), Florida 250 (#6) and Colorado 242 (#7)...among all-time scoring streaks, active or not, the Pac-10 has four schools which reside in the top 10, in addition to WSU, Washington is fifth (271), Oregon sixth (271) and UCLA 10th (235).

The Cougars had scored in 258 consecutive Pacific-10 Conference games, which had been the longest active streak for any league team...prior to USC the last time WSU was shut out in Pac-10 play was at Oregon State in 1975.

The Cougars also saw their streak of scoring in 203 consecutive Martin Stadium home games snapped, dating back to a 21-0 loss to Oregon State in Pullman in 1956.

COUG TD STREAK: WSU quarterbacks have thrown touchdown passes in 82 of the last 96 games – all games in the 2001 (12), 2002 (13) and 2004 (11) seasons, 11 of 13 games in 2003, in 10 of 11 in 2005, in 11 of 12 in 2006, in 11 of 12 in 2007 and 3 of 12 in 2008;

LONG TD DRIVES: Washington State has scored on drives of 80 yards or more in 37 of its last 47 games, with the lone exceptions coming against California, Oregon and Stanford last season, and Oklahoma State, Baylor, Oregon State and USC, Stanford, Arizona and Arizona State in 2008. During the span of 47 games the Cougars have had 51 touchdown drives of 80 or more yards and 11 of 90 or more yards.

Sept. 12, 2008, WACO, Texas – Robert Griffin ran for 217 yards and two touchdowns, and added one touchdown pass to lead Baylor to a 45-17 win over Washington State in a game moved up one day due the onset of Hurricane Ike. With the threat of Ike looming in the Gulf of Mexico, the Cougars traveled and played on the same day after the decision to move the game ahead was announced one day earlier. WSU took the opening kick and marched 37 yards for an opening-drive touchdown, capped by a one-yard run by Chantz Staden. Sept. 20, 2008, PULLMAN, Wash. – Freshman quarterback Marshall Lobbestael came off the bench in the second half to throw two touchdown passes as Washington State earned its first victory under head coach Paul Wulff with a 48-9 win over Portland State. Lobbestael was the third quarterback used by the Cougars following injuries to starter Kevin Lopina and Gary Rogers. Nov. 1, 2008, STANFORD – Toby Gerhart rushed for a game-high 132 yards and four touchdowns as Stanford snapped a two-game skid to Washington State with a 58-0 victory over the Cougars. The loss marked the second straight game the Cougars failed to score after registering points in their previous 280 games, which marked the fourth-longest streak in NCAA Division I history.
