What's Happening: The regular season concludes for the Washington State women's basketball team with a trip to the state of Arizona this week...the Cougars (6-19, 2-14 Pac-10) are at Arizona (18-9, 10-6), Thursday, Feb. 24 at 6 p.m. Pacific and at Arizona State (18-8, 10-6), Saturday, Feb. 26 at 3 p.m. Pacific...next up for the Cougars after this week's games is the Pacific-10 Conference Tournament at HP Pavilion in San Jose, Calif., March 4-7.

Ninth In The Standings: WSU's win over Oregon State, Feb. 12 was the team's second conference triumph of the season and moved the Cougars up to ninth in the conference standings...nothing has changed in the standings since then...WSU is a half game ahead of the Beavers for the ninth position...WSU is a game behind California for eighth place...if the season ended today, the Cougars would play California in the first round of the Pac-10 Tournament, Friday, March 4 at 8:15 p.m...the last time the Cougars were not in last place in the Pac-10 standings was the 2000-01 season...that season the team finished ninth.

Benz, Ferguson Honored: The sophomore duo of Kate Benz and Adriane Ferguson was named to the 2005 CoSIDA Academic All-District VIII University Division Women's Basketball Team, Feb. 17...Benz earned a first team accolade while Ferguson garnered a second team selection...the tandem joins Lindsey Egeland (2004), Katie Nyseth (2001), Victoria Harrod (2001), Darla Williamson (1992) and Jeanne Eggart (1982) as Cougars who have earned a selection to the team...as a first team pick, Benz is eligible for selection

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to the national team, which will be announced, March 3...Eggart earned national honorable mention honors in 1982.

Improved Scoring Margin: The average scoring margin for the Cougars this season is -7.7 points...that continues a trend of improvement by the team since head coach Sherri Murrell's arrival to the program...in 2002, a year before Murrell began her tenure, the scoring margin was -22.5...in 2003, Murrell's first, it went down to -20.5 and in 2004 it was -12.5.

Scales Hits Top 10: Ariana Scales scored a season-high 22 points at Washington, Feb. 19...Scales was 8-of-16 from the field including 6-of-10 from 3 point territory...the six treys tied Scales for sixth on the school's all-time list in single-game 3-point field goals with eight other players including Adriane Ferguson who reached that figure, Nov. 22 at Nebraska...four of Scales' treys came in the second half as the 5-foot-8 guard tallied 14 points in that half.

Benz On The Boards: With her 9.4 rebound average, Kate Benz holds a .4 advantage over Oregon's Cathrine Kraayeveld for the Pac-10 lead...no Cougar has ever captured the Pac-10 rebounding title...if the season ended today, Benz would have the fourth best single-season rebounding performance in school history...only two Cougars -- Jennifer Grey's 14.7 average in 1975 and Janet Kusler's 10.4 average in 1976 -- have ended a season with a double-digit rebound average...with 234 rebounds so far this season, Benz is sixth on the school's single-season rebounding list and is seven shy of fifth position (Cassandra Overby, 1984)...ranked in the conference's top 10 in several categories...tied with Kraayeveld for the lead

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in double-doubles (eight), leads conference in defensive rebounding (6.88/game)...fifth in offensive rebounding (2.48/game), and seventh in minutes played (32.28)...additionally, is 16th in scoring (10.4 ppg).

Holding The Opposition: Prior to its game at UW, Feb. 19, the Cougars had held their opponents to fewer than 70 points in eight straight games and 18 for the season...in the 2002-03 season, head coach Sherri Murrell's first, the team had seven games of allowing fewer than 70 points...the next season that number improved to 13...the Cougars are sixth in the Pac-10 in scoring defense allowing 66.0 points a game...the 39 points allowed by WSU against Portland State, Dec. 3 were the fewest since Nov. 22, 1992 when the team defeated Gonzaga 88-37...the 30-point margin of victory was the largest for WSU since it defeated

Wyoming 94-49, Nov. 24, 1998...the Cougars held PSU to 27.4 percent shooting from the field...that was the lowest shooting percentage from a Cougar opponent since Vermont (26.9 percent) in 2000.

Overcoming Deficits: The Cougars have overcome at least an eight-point deficit to take the lead in nine games with four of those contests resulting in victories...the latest occurrence was against Oregon State, Feb. 12 when WSU rallied from an 11-point first-half deficit to capture a 68-63 win...in overcoming the double-digit deficit, the Cougars tied for the 11th greatest comeback in school history...at USC, Feb. 3 when down by 13 in the second half, WSU rallied to take a one-point lead with less than three minutes remaining...against California, Jan. 27 the Cougars trailed the Bears by 10 (38-28) with 3:27 remaining in the first half...the Cougars rallied for the 79-69 win...WSU trailed by nine against Boise State and at Nebraska, 13 at Fresno State, eight at San Diego State, 13 versus Eastern Washington and eight against Valparaiso...the Cougars were able to secure wins against Boise State and San Diego State.

Overcoming Deficits II: In addition, WSU has overcome double-digit deficits to get back into contention in other games...the latest occurrence came at Washington, Feb. 19...WSU was down by 20 in the first half before rallying to pull within one with a minute and a half left in the game...trailed Arizona by 14 in the first half before rallying to come within a point of the Wildcats in the second half, Dec. 29...fell behind by 14

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in the first half to California, Jan. 4 before rallying to cut the deficit to as little as four before the halftime break.

For Three!: The Cougars have converted ten 3-point field goals three times this season: at UW, Feb. 19, vs. UCLA, Jan. 7 and in the win over St. Mary's, Nov. 26...the St. Mary's win marked the most treys by the Cougars since WSU hit 12 in a 77-76 win at Oregon, Feb. 15, 2001...it also marked the first time WSU hit double-digits in 3-point field goals in a game since the 2001 Oregon win, a span of 94 games.

Over A 1,000: WSU finished its home schedule averaging 755 fans a game...marks the third consecutive year that attendance has increased...in 2003, Murrell's first season, average attendance was 518...that figure increased to 624 in 2004...the attendance figure of 1,460 for the Jan. 22 UW-WSU game was the largest to attend a Cougar home game since 1992...WSU drew 2,256 fans for its game against UW, Feb. 7, 1992...it also marked the third time that WSU drew over 1,000 fans for a home game this season...marks the first time since the 1992-93 season that WSU has had at least three games that it attracted over 1,000 fans to a home game....that season, WSU had four home games of over 1,000 fans...the Cougars drew 1,020 fans for their game against Arizona State, Dec. 27...a total of 1,149 witnessed the team's 61-48 season-opening win over Boise State, Nov. 19.

Perry On All-Time List: Senior Jessica Perry eclipsed the 300 career assist total vs. Cal, Jan. 27 to become the eighth player in school history to reach that milestone...total now stands at 325 assists, which is seventh all-time in WSU history...is sixth in the Pac-10 averaging 3.28 assists a game...is also fifth in the conference in assist to turnover ratio (1.17) and eighth in steals (1.72/game)...with 178 career thefts is six steals shy of cracking the school's all-time top 10 list in that category.

Double Joneby: Senior Emma Joneby (Vasteras, Sweden) is averaging 6.8 points and 5.3 rebounds a game...tallied her fifth double-double of the season with 12 points and 10 rebounds at UW, Feb. 19...rebound figure is 12th in the Pac-10...tallied nine double-digit scoring games this season...entered season with a career total of four double-digit scoring games...five double-doubles is fourth in the conference.

More Moore: Keisha Moore (Riverside, Calif.) is averaging 7.2 points and 5.7 rebounds a game...rebound figure is ninth in the conference...is third in the Pac-10 in blocks (1.29/game)...scored a

season-high 17 points in the win over Oregon State, Feb. 12...scored 13 of her season-high point total in the second half...contributed 10 points in a 14-1 WSU second half run that gave the Cougars the lead for good...also contributed across the stat sheet recording seven rebounds, five steals and three blocks against the Beavers.

Earlier This Season Against Arizona and Arizona State: The Cougars dropped games to the Arizona schools to open the conference schedule in December...WSU fell to ASU 67-39, Dec. 27 and Arizona 54-51, Dec. 29.

About Arizona: Dee-Dee Wheeler leads the conference in scoring averaging 17.9 points a game...Shawntinice Polk is also scoring in double digits (12.9 ppg)...prior to a 69-51 loss at Oregon, Feb. 19, Arizona had won its last three games.

Series With Arizona: Arizona leads the series with WSU 20-17...the Wildcats have won the last seven in the series...the Cougars last win in the series was Feb. 10, 2001, a 93-86 triumph at Pullman...the team's last win at Tucson was Jan. 8, 1998, when the Cougars prevailed 64-61.

About Arizona State: The Sun Devils have won three of their last four...Emily Westerberg leads the team with a 11.7 points a game average...Kristen Kovesdy is also scoring in double figures (10.7 ppg).

Series With Arizona State: ASU leads the all-time series with WSU 25-12...the Cougars last win was a 75-72 triumph at Pullman, Feb. 28, 2004...that snapped a 13-game losing streak in the series...WSU's last win at Tempe was Jan. 30, 1997 when the Cougars defeated ASU 86-78.

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Jones From The Line: Charmaine Jones is third on the team in scoring (9.6 ppg) and has tallied 11 double-digit scoring games...scored a career-high 26 points at USC, Feb. 3...Jones scored 15 of the Cougars' 23 first-half points...recorded the top free throw shooting performance in the Pac-10 this season...was 11-of-11 from the line on her way to the career-high effort...point total was second 20-point effort this season, both coming against USC...scored 20 points, including seven in overtime, against the Women of Troy, Jan. 9...leads the team and is ninth in the Pac-10 in free throw percentage making good on 85-of-114 attempts (74.6 percent)...last year Jones was eighth in the Pac-10 in free throw percentage making good on 71-of-91 attempts (78 percent).

Free Throw Discrepancy: In the Cougars' 68-63 loss at UCLA, Feb. 6, both teams shot 80 percent from the charity stripe...UCLA was 20-of-25 while WSU was 4-of-5...the last time WSU had at least 20 fewer free throw attempts than its opponent was in a 94-68 loss at Washington, Dec. 21, 2001 (16-37)...the last time the team had fewer than five free throw attempts was when the team went 0-of-4 in an 80-50 loss at Arizona, Feb. 8, 2003...the Cougars have made and attempted more free throws than their opposition in their six wins.

Ranked Quintet: When the Cougars played No. 4 Stanford, Jan. 29, it marked the fifth time the team has played a ranked opponent this season...the Jan. 7 UCLA game marked the fourth ranked opponent for the Cougars in the span of 12 days...the Cougars lost to No. 22 (AP)/24 (ESPN/USA Today) UCLA 89-69...WSU fell to No. 21 (AP) Arizona State 67-39, Dec. 27 and No. 25 (ESPN/USA Today) Arizona 54-51, Dec. 29 at Pullman...WSU then lost at No. 5 (AP)/6 (ESPN) Stanford 72-39, Jan. 2...the last ranked opponent the Cougars defeated was No. 22/19 (AP/USA Today) Arizona, 93-86, at Pullman, Feb. 10, 2001.

Ferguson In The Conference: Sophomore Adriane Ferguson (Spokane, Wash.) is seventh in the Pac-10 in 3-point field goals made (1.54/game), and 20th in scoring (10.0 ppg)...the 19-point effort at UCLA, Feb. 6 was her second best career performance, only eclipsed by a 26-point total at Nebraska, Nov. 22...Ferguson has scored in double-digits in 14 games.

In Overtime: The overtime loss to USC, Jan. 9 was the first overtime game for the Cougars since Dec. 5, 2001 when WSU lost at Idaho 89-72...it also marked the first home overtime game since Dec. 10, 1998 when WSU lost to Utah 81-70...the Cougars are 6-16 all-time in overtime games.

20/20: Emma Joneby and Charmaine Jones each hit the 20-point plateau against USC, Jan. 9...Joneby scored a career-high 25 points while Jones added a then career-best of her own with 20 against the Women of Troy...the last time WSU had two players score at least 20 points in a game was Feb. 10, 2001 when Yvonne Volkman (22 points) and Katie Nyseth (20 points) led the Cougars to a 93-86 win over Arizona at Pullman.

Coug Notes: WSU has been involved in nine games decided by six points or fewer...the Cougars are 2-7 in those games...last year, WSU was 3-1 in games decided by six points or fewer...the Cougars have

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trailed at the half in 22 games going 4-18 in those contests...prior to leading UCLA 35-29 at the half, Feb. 6, the Cougars had trailed at the half in 16 straight games.

Coug Notes II: The 48.3 percent (28-of-58) shooting performance by the Cougars in the win over Cal, Jan. 27 was the best by the team since its win over Arizona State, Feb. 28, 2004...that day the Cougars shot 52.8 percent (28-of-53) en route to a 75-72 win over the Sun Devils...the Cougars have won four games by at least a double-digit margin...the last time the team won as many games by double-digits was in the 2000-01 season (six).

Coug Notes III: A total of 10 players have made at least one start for WSU...Benz is the only player to have started all 25 games...WSU has committed fewer than 20 turnovers in seven of their last nine games...the team has not had more than 24 turnovers in any game this season.

Road Success: The win at San Diego State, Dec. 11 marked the third road win of the season for WSU, matching last season's road win total...the three road wins are the most since the team won six in 1997-98...the win at St. Mary's, Nov. 26 marked the Cougars' fourth win in their last 16 road contests dating back to the beginning of the 2003-04 season...that equaled the number of road wins the Cougars achieved from Jan. 28, 1999 to the conclusion of the 2002-03 season, a span of 61 road games.

Longer Road Trip Than Expected: On the return trip from Oregon, Jan. 16 the Cougars were due to fly into Pullman via Seattle at 11 a.m. ...those plans were revised when the 6:50 a.m. flight from Eugene to Seattle was cancelled (mechanical problems)...faced with the prospect of arriving into Pullman at midnight, the team took the bus back to Pullman, a 10-hour ride...along the way, the team witnessed the effects from the ice storm that hit Portland a day earlier...the Cougars arrived safely back to Pullman at 6 p.m.

Big Assist: The 24 assists WSU recorded against Portland State were the most since the team tallied 24 assists in a 76-49 win over Samford, Dec. 29, 2000...the duo of Stephanie Singer and Jessica Perry combined for 15 assists against the Vikings.

Cougars Take Second At St. Mary's Tournament: WSU took home the second place trophy at the Hilton Concord Thanksgiving Classic, hosted by St. Mary's (Calif.)
