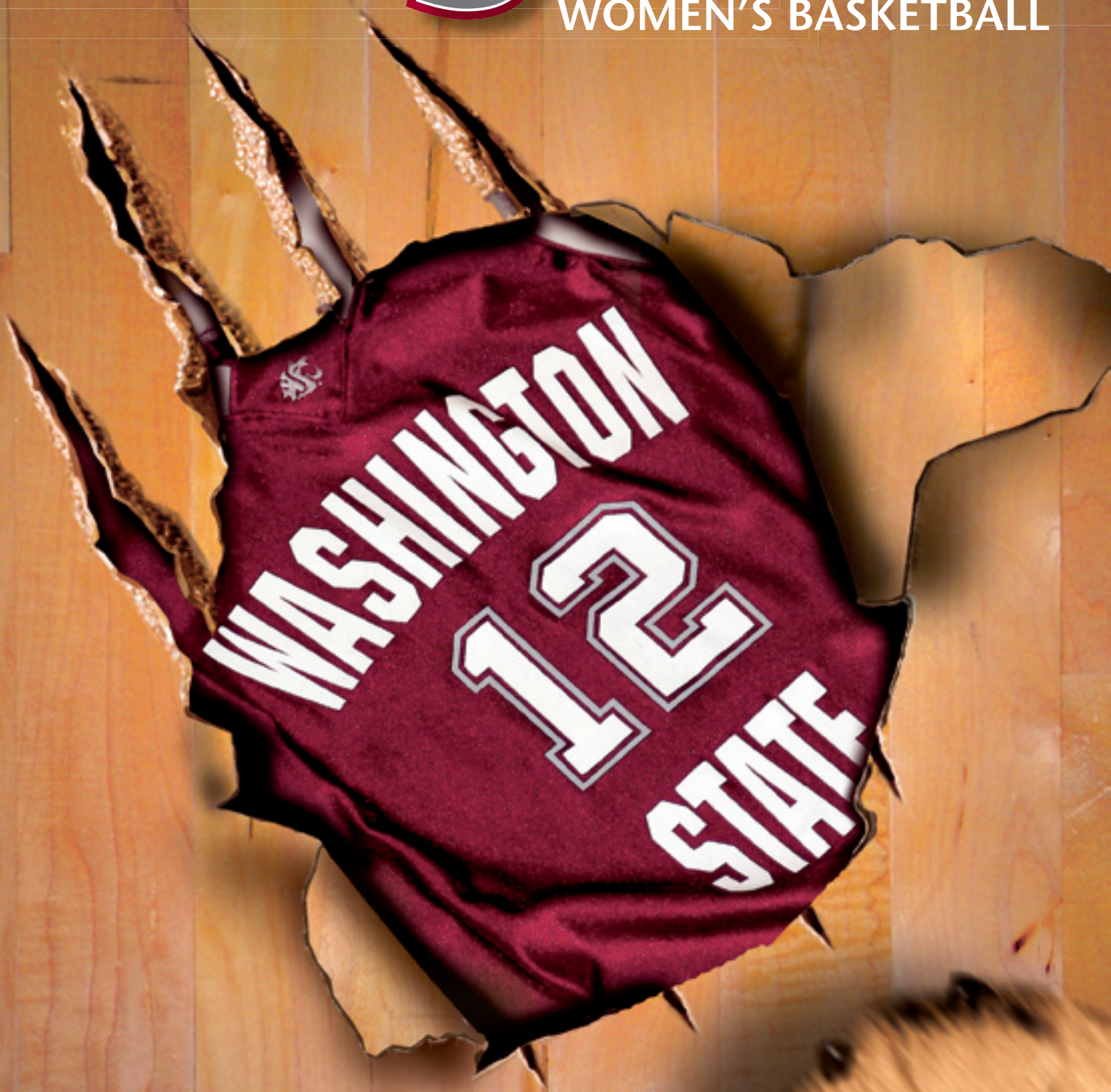

If it's true that you have to crawl before you walk, then it must follow that you have to walk before you can run.


Last season, we moved forward from where we started and began to take the steps necessary to establish Washington State as a factor in Pacific-10 Conference basketball.

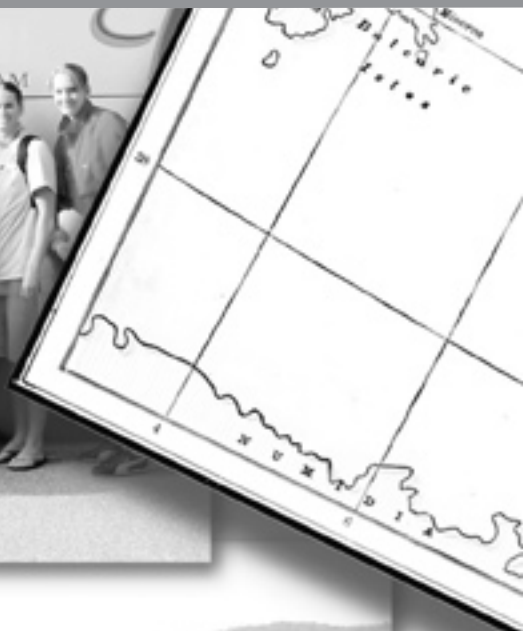

Italy tour



Although the Washington State women's basketball team's 2003-04 season ended in March, its playing days for the academic year were not quite finished.

Just over two months after their final game at the Pacific-10 Conference Tournament, the Cougars embarked on a tour of Italy in May. While abroad, the Cougars competed against four teams and toured ancient sites and cities throughout the country.

The Cougars split their four-game slate and in between the competitions, the team toured historic cities such as Rome, Vatican City, Florence, Venice, Milan, Cervia, Udine, Bellagio, Verona and Como.
