# Feb. 14, 2004 OSU 65 WSU 55 at Corvallis, Ore.

Bianca McCall led the Cougars with a game-high 19 points while Charmaine Jones added 12...Kate Benz contributed a game-high 11 rebounds along with nine points for WSU....Brina Chaney led OSU with 13 points...the Cougars were done in by two categories that are normally strengths for them...two days after converting nine treys at Oregon — the most by the team since 2001 — the Cougars shot 2-of-20 from outside the arc at OSU...additionally, the Cougars, who entered the game second in the Pac-10 in free throw percentage, made good on 15-of-23 (65.2 percent) attempts from the charity stripe...conversely, OSU was a perfect 17-of-17 from the free throw line...ironically, the Cougars fared well in a category that has been a struggle for them, turnovers...with a season low 11 turnovers, WSU committed four fewer than OSU...down 31-24 at the half, WSU blitzed the Beavers with a 10-0 run in the opening 3:42 of the second half to gain a 34-31 lead...McCall accounted for half of the Cougars' points in the run...OSU responded with a 7-0 run of its own to retake the lead at 38-34 with 14:20 remaining...the run was broken by a Jones' 3-pointer, the first trey by the Cougars in 13 tries up to that point...up by three with 10:27 remaining the Beavers extended their advantage to double-digits at 57-45 with an 11-2 run...OSU extended its lead to 61-48 but a bucket by Benz, combined with a Jones' steal and Stephanie Singer 3-pointer brought the Cougars back to 61-53 with 2:44 remaining...after closing the gap to 61-54 with a McCall free throw, the Beavers erased any doubt as to the outcome with consecutive buckets by Anita Rivera and Krystal Turner.

Krystal Turner turned in a double-double of 13 points and 10 rebounds for Oregon State...the Beavers were led by a game-high 14 points from Hollye Chapman while Brina Chaney added 12 for OSU... WSU jumped out of the gates quickly scoring the game's first eight points...OSU whittled away at the deficit but the Cougars held onto their lead for the majority of the first half...with WSU up 26-25 at the 3:26 mark, a Chapman bucket gave OSU its first lead of the game at 27-26 with 2:45 remaining in the first half...the Cougars went into the break with the lead however, as a Kolleen Horton lay-up with three seconds left gave WSU a 29-28 advantage at the half...that would be the score until Turner's bucket with 17:40 remaining gave Oregon State a 30-29 lead...although the Cougars would be within one on four occasions in the second half – the last being at 42-41 with 9:45 remaining – WSU never enjoyed the lead again for the remainder of the game...the Cougars shot 11-of-23 (47.8 percent) in the first half but cooled off to 7-of-25 (28 percent) in the second half...OSU was 9-of-25 (36 percent) in the first half and 14-of-32 (43.8 percent) in the second half.

**Series with OSU:** The Beavers lead the all-time series with WSU 35-20...OSU has captured the last 10 meetings...the Cougars last win was Feb. 13, 1999, a 70-52 triumph at Pullman.

Singer finished with 17 points, including five in the final 2:07 of the game, while Ferguson chipped in 15 for WSU. Charmaine Jones and Nikki Stratton added nine points to the Cougars' cause.

Coming off a 24-point, 18-rebound performance against Arizona, two days earlier, McCall also added six rebounds, five assists, four steals and three blocks.

"This is a great win," McCall said. "I can't really describe my emotions right now. I am just taking it all in. We had the determination that we knew we were winning this game and we just finished it."

The Cougars never trailed in capturing their sixth win of the season. It wasn't easy how-

Five consecutive ASU points brought the Sun Devils to within two at 70-68 with 2:43 left but Singer made good on a 3-point play to extend the Cougars' lead back to five at 73-68.

McCall Ends Regular Season Strongly: Bianca McCall ended the regular season in style averaging 21 points and 12 rebounds in two games against the Arizona schools last week... for the week, McCall shot at a 51.7 percent clip, shooting 50 percent or better in each game...overall, she was 15-of-29 from the field...converted 12-of-14 (85.7 percent) from the charity stripe...tallied four straight double-digit games in points and she has reached the double figure mark in eight of her last nine games...in those eight games has averaged 19.9 points a game...has averaged 20.8 points in her last four games....recorded a double-double of 24 points and 18 rebounds to lead the Cougars to a near-upset of Arizona...tallied game-highs in both categories....the 18 boards, which tied for 10th on the school's all-time single game rebounding list, was the top rebounding performance by a Pac-10 player for the week and was just one shy from her career-high...24 points tied for her second-best career scoring effort...recorded a double-double in the

**Career-High Effort For McCall at Stanford:** Bianca McCall poured in a career-high 29 points (previous high was 24 points at Cal, Jan. 18, 2003) against Stanford, Jan. 31...made a career-high 11 field goals en route to posting the game-high point total... the 29-point effort was the highest point total by a Cougar since Feb. 24, 2000 when Alke Dietel scored 30 points at, coincidentally, Stanford.

Benz Baskets: Freshman Kate Benz turned in her ninth double-digit scoring effort of the season with 10 points against UW, Feb. 21...averaged a double-double of 13 points and 10 rebounds in two games at the Oregon schools, Feb. 12 & 14...recorded a game-high 17 points and added nine rebounds at Oregon, Feb. 12...two days later pulled down a game-high 11 rebounds and chipped in nine points at Oregon State...recorded her third double-double of the season with 20 points and 10 rebounds against UCLA, Feb. 8...that marked her third double-double in a five-game span... is tied for sixth in the Pac-10 in that category...point total against UCLA was a season-high...scored 14 points and pulled down 11 rebounds at Stanford, Jan. 31...turned in her first double-double this season with 15 points and 10 rebounds against UW, Jan. 24...leads the team in rebounds (6.6/game) and is second in scoring (9.0 points/game)...in conference games only, is averaging 9.9 points and 6.6 rebounds a game... is ranked among the top 10 in the Pac-10 in three categories: sixth in rebounds, seventh in offensive rebounds (2.56/game), and eighth in defensive rebounds (4.07/game).

Ferguson has seen action in 25 games while Stratton has seen time in 22...Benz has started every game, Ferguson 18 games, Singer nine and Stratton five...along with Benz's nine games scoring in double figures, Ferguson has hit double figures six times, Singer six and Stratton twice...the quartet had an significant impact in the win over Arizona State, Feb. 28...the trio of Ferguson, Singer and Stratton combined for 41 of the Cougars' 75 points in the victory...Benz pulled down a game-high seven rebounds against the Sun Devils.

**Point Barrier Broken:** The Cougars registered back-to-back 70-point games against the Arizona schools last week... WSU scored a then season-high 72 points in nearly pulling off an upset of Arizona, Feb. 26... two days later, the Cougars established another season-high with 75 points in the win over Arizona State, Feb. 28... the last time the Cougars scored 70 or more points in consecutive games was Feb. 22 & 24, 2001 against Stanford and Cal.

**Cougar Notes:** The Feb. 28 win over Arizona State marked the first win for the Cougars when allowing the opposition above 60 points this season... WSU book-ended its regular season with home victories... the Cougars began the campaign with a 69-51 win over Fresno State, Nov. 21 and ended the season with a 75-72 win over Arizona State, Feb. 28... coincidentally, WSU tallied a season-high 16 steals in each win.

**Crashing the Boards:** The Cougars have out-rebounded their opponents in 13 games... that are the most games that WSU has out-rebounded an opponent since its 1991 NCAA Tournament season (18)...last year, WSU out-rebounded its opponents in four games...for the season, opposition has only out-rebounded WSU by a 981-972 margin.

**Making Good From the Charity Stripe:** The Cougars are second in the Pac-10 in free throw percentage (374-of-516, 72.5 percent)... Charmaine Jones has converted 67-of-86 (77.9 percent) from the charity stripe, which is sixth in the conference... Jones has hit a perfect 6-of-6 from the line twice (at UCLA, Jan. 9 and at Cal, Jan. 29).

Milestones From the Cal Win: The come from behind win at Cal, Jan. 29 marked the Cougars' first Pac-10 road win since Feb. 15, 2001, when WSU defeated Oregon 77-76, a span of 27 Pac-10 road games...in addition, the 12-point deficit the Cougars overcame tied for the seventh greatest comeback in school history...WSU was down 42-30 with 15:10 remaining in the game...coincidentally, one of the previous 12-point comebacks was at California, Feb. 22, 1997...the Cougars rallied to capture an 83-70 win that day.

**Exceeding the Past Two Seasons:** With six wins this season, the Cougars have exceeded their combined win total over the past two seasons (4)...WSU won two games each in the 2001-02 and 2002-03 campaigns.

**Back to Defense:** The Cougars held their opponents to under 60 points five times this season with the most recent occurrence coming at Cal, Jan. 29... WSU is 5-0 when holding the opposition to under 60 points and 1-21 when allowing at or above 60 points... the Cougars held the opposition to under 60 points in four of the season's first six games... in 28 games last season, the Cougars held their opponents to under 60 points three times... the 49 points allowed by the Cougars against Utah Valley State were the fewest allowed by the team since a 55-49 win over Portland State, Nov. 26, 2001... WSU held two opponents (Fresno State, .291; Utah Valley State, .288) to under 30 percent field goal percentage... the last time WSU held two opponents under 30 percent field goal percentage in the same season was in 2000-01... WSU held American (.263) and Vermont (.269) to under 30 percent that season.
