



# 2009-10 SEASON OUTLOOK

The 2009-10 season will be a resiliency test for the Washington State University women's rowing team, after last year's team fell short of a bid to the NCAA Championships, where the program has competed five times in the past eight years.

The Cougars were nationally ranked through much of the 2008-09 season, climbing as high as 12th. The spring featured matchups with five ranked teams, including Washington, Michigan State, Michigan, Ohio State and Oregon State. The campaign was highlighted by the varsity eight nearly edging out Washington and Michigan, and the second varsity eight defeating Michigan State, Michigan, Ohio State and Oregon State. The team ultimately finished sixth at the Pacific-10 Conference Championships.

With nine seniors on the varsity squad to lead the way, WSU head coach Jane LaRiviere believes her team has the makeup to bounce back to championship form.

"For the first time in a couple years we are a mature team," LaRiviere said. "We are going to be able to count on a lot of great senior leadership.

"I see a broad base of leadership, with **Erica Lewis** (London, Ontario), **Kyann Martin** (Camas, Wash.), **Hannah Rothstrom** (Spokane, Wash.), **Irena Neffeova** (Prague, Czech Republic) and **Erika Jorgensen** (Orland, Calif.)," LaRiviere said. "We also look for senior leadership from our coxswain **Corina Chilibeck** (Victoria, British Columbia)."

Lewis earned Pac-10 All-Conference honors and CRCA All-West Region First Team accolades in 2009. Also highly decorated, Neffeova became only the second WSU rower to earn First Team CRCA All-America honors (2008). Other seniors include **Johanna Gerig** (Corvallis, Mont.), **Danya Levesque** (Auburn, Calif.), and **Katie Wollstein** (Olympia, Wash.).

Not to be outdone, the junior class features 14 student-athletes who return to add depth and consistency at the varsity level. At the core of the Cougars' solid junior class are **Natasha Ostopovich** (Sydenham,

Ontario), **Sarah Wolff** (Auckland, New Zealand) and **Christina Kinck** (Oslo, Norway). Also in competition for spots on the varsity boats are **Sarah Powell** (North Saanich, British Columbia), **Phillippa Summerville** (Hamilton, New Zealand), **Liz Beck** (Ridgefield, Wash.), **Annie Eastwood** (Winnipeg, Manitoba), **Justine Galbraith** (Fonthill, Ontario), **Lauren Johnson** (Tigard, Ore.), **Tamara Jonoubeh** (Millbrae, Calif.), **Cayla Ravancho** (Olympia, Wash.), **Corinna Sharick** (Burlington, Wash.), and redshirt juniors **Crystal Martin** (Renton, Wash.) **Rachel McNeil** (Deer Park, Wash.), and **Marina Morshead** (Suquamish, Wash.).

The sophomore class is highlighted by returners **Katie Dick** (Victoria, British Columbia), **Ann Hoag** (Bellingham, Wash.), and coxswain **Lexi Ryman** (Snohomish, Wash.).

Several transfers are beginning their first year at WSU, providing the team with additional depth. **Jessica Start** (Saskatoon, Saskatchewan), who is transferring from University of Saskatchewan, competed in the 2009 Canada Games earning a bronze medal in the women's eight for Saskatchewan. A transfer from University of the Fraser Valley, junior **Lisa Roman** (Langley, British Columbia) participated with Cougar teammates Sarah Powell and Katie Dick at the 2009 Canada Games, and took home two gold medals for British Columbia.

"We have a couple of transfers who have a chance at making an impact," LaRiviere said. "Lisa Roman is one who is on pace to do some really great things for us."

Rounding out the sophomore class are **Liz England** (Richlands, Va.), **Rachel Johnson** (University Place, Wash.), **Kelsey Lounsbury** (Yakima, Wash.), **Kasia Rademacher** (Hermiston, Ore.), **Leah Smith** (Seattle, Wash.) and redshirt sophomore **Kelly Brashers** (North Bonneville, Wash.).

Excited about this year's freshman class, LaRiviere said it is a good class with tall strong bodies, and is looking to develop. The freshmen include **Liana DeMaris** (Snohomish, Wash.), **Kaitlan Foster** (Arlington, Wash.), **Josie Lallemand** (Marysville, Wash.), **Alison Smith** (Carmichael, Calif.), **Cortnee Whittington** (Everett, Wash.), coxswain **Heidi Kim** (Cottage Grove, Ore.), and redshirt freshman **Allie Reilly** (San Diego, Calif.).

With a total of 24 upperclassmen on the roster, WSU is equipped with the experience and leadership to return to the top of the Pac-10. This year's spring schedule will provide numerous opportunities to prepare for the championship season by competing against Pac-10 foes Washington (third at 2009 Pac-10 Championships) and Oregon State (fourth at 2009 Pac-10 Championships), as well as racing at the Lake Natoma Invite, where an array of Pac-10 teams will participate. In the end, LaRiviere's goal is to compete with the best in the country and return to the NCAA Championships, which WSU will host in 2010 at Gold River, Calif.

"The measuring stick is always the NCAAAs," LaRiviere said. "Most members of the team have tasted it and want to get back there. They know that's the culmination, the peak of why we do what we do. You want to get to where your own Olympics are. That's the crescendo."



# head coach Jane LaRiviere

Eighth Season • Calgary '86

Under the direction of eighth-year head coach Jane LaRiviere, Washington State University has established a heritage as one of the leading women's rowing programs in the nation. The second head coach since Washington State rowing became an NCAA varsity team in 1990; LaRiviere recently led the Cougars' 2008 march to the NCAA Championships, marking the fifth appearance in program history.

In the 2009 season the WSU varsity eight raced tough against UW and Michigan, while the solid second varsity eight defeated Michigan State, Michigan, Ohio State and Oregon State. In addition, 2009 marked the inauguration of the Tom and Barbara Wilson Rowing Center, a venture brought to fruition through the efforts of LaRiviere and former WSU women's rowing coach Tammy Crawford. The facility features a state-of-the-art moving water indoor rowing tank, and will serve as part of LaRiviere's legacy at WSU.

With an eighth-place overall team finish, the 2008 NCAA appearance marked the Cougars' fourth such outing under LaRiviere's direction. Leading out was the varsity eight's ninth place finish, with the second varsity eight and varsity four coming in eighth in their respective races.

Leading up to their reemergence to the NCAA Championships in 2008, LaRiviere led the Cougars to match their second best Pacific-10 Championship finish all-time, placing third overall. Several key races built the Cougars' success in the 2008 campaign, including varsity eight and second varsity eight finishing second and third respectively at the Head of the Oklahoma, wins at the Head of the Lake and against Oregon State, varsity eight placing third at the San Diego Crew Classic, and the fourth consecutive victory over cross-state rival Washington.

The Cougar varsity and second varsity eight recorded victories over UW in 2007, highlighting a season that ended with a seventh place finish at the Pac-10 Championships.

In 2006, LaRiviere's rowing team made history by achieving the highest NCAA finish for any women's athletic program in WSU history. At the 2006 NCAA



Division I Rowing Championship Regatta in West Windsor, N.J., all three WSU varsity boats posted top five finishes, earning the Cougars a fourth-place team standing.

At the 2006 Pac-10 Championships the WSU varsity eight and varsity four finished second in their respective grand finals, placing the team second overall, and marking the best Pac-10 finish in school history. Other top finishes included the varsity eight's 10th-place overall standing at the prestigious Head of the Charles Regatta in Boston and a victory at the Head of the Lake Regatta in Seattle. The Cougars also recorded wins against Stanford, Tennessee, and Clemson along with two spectacular wins against Washington, only the second and third in program history.

LaRiviere received professional recognition from her coaching peers for her outstanding coaching success in 2006. The Collegiate Rowing Coaches Association named her the West Region Coach of the Year and the Pacific-10 Conference voted her the Women's Rowing Coach of the Year.

In the 2004 season (her second at WSU), LaRiviere guided the Cougars to a ninth overall finish at the NCAA Championships. The Cougars' NCAA appearance was highlighted by the second varsity eight's third-place finish. At the Pac-10 Conference Championships, WSU placed third overall underscored by a runner-up effort from the second varsity eight squad.

During LaRiviere's first year with the Cougars (2002-03), third-place finishes by the varsity eight

and varsity four crews led WSU to a tie for third at the Pac-10 Championships. Those results helped secure the program's first team bid to the NCAA Championships in school history. The Cougars' inaugural trip to the national championships resulted in a 12th-place team finish, which featured a top 10 performance by the varsity four crew.

LaRiviere came to the Palouse after spending eight years at Oregon State University where she served as the recruiting coordinator as well as the women's freshman and novice coach. While at OSU, LaRiviere guided the Beavers' novice eight to a 2002 Pac-10 Conference Championship and the varsity four to a second-place finish. In addition, LaRiviere directed the Beavers' novice eight to respective second and third-place finishes at the Pac-10 Championships in 2000 and 2001 and the varsity four to a second-place effort at the 2001 conference championships.

During LaRiviere's tenure at Oregon State, the women's rowing program posted third-place overall finishes at the Pac-10 Championships in 1998, 2001 and 2002. In addition, the Beavers' varsity eight placed 13th and 15th at the NCAA Championships in 1999 and 2000, respectively.

LaRiviere began her coaching career in 1989 while attending graduate school at the University of Oregon. A native of Alberta, Canada, she went on to coach at the University of Western Ontario and for the London (Ontario) Rowing Club. While in Ontario, she assisted with the Canadian Women's National Team development camps. During the summer of 2001, LaRiviere was an apprentice national rowing team coach in Canada.

A U.S. Rowing Level III certified coach, LaRiviere earned a bachelor's degree in physical education from the University of Calgary (1986), a master's degree in athletic therapy from Oregon (1990), and her Ph.D. in biomechanics from Oregon State (2002).

Her daughter Alice Jean LaRiviere was born in August, 2003.

## assistant coach Tara Medina

Fourth Season • Michigan '06

Tara Medina enters her fourth season as assistant coach for the Washington State women's rowing program. Medina is responsible for the varsity four, which placed seventh at the 2009 Pacific-10 Conference Championships.

Under Medina's direction the 2008 Cougar varsity four finished fourth at the Pac-10 Championships and second in the petite final at the NCAA Championships, contributing to an eighth-place team finish. Medina also co-coached the novice eight to win the Korholv Perpetual Trophy by finishing first at San Diego Crew Classics.

In 2006-07, Medina guided the varsity four to a sixth-place finish at the Pac-10 Championships, inching into the final over California. The varsity four also earned victories over nonconference opponents UCF and Tennessee during the season.



During the summer of 2009, Medina hosted the second U.S. Rowing U-23 Development Camp at WSU. Athletes trained primarily in pairs and competed at the British Columbia Championships in Canada.

Before coming to the Palouse, Medina coached the University of Michigan varsity four during the 2005-06 season. At the 2006 Big Ten Championships the Wolverines' varsity four finished fourth overall followed by a sixth place finish at the South/Central Region Sprints.

A 2006 Michigan graduate, Medina earned four varsity letters in rowing while pursuing a bachelor's degree in physical education and health. As a coxswain, she was named Second Team All-Big Ten and Second Team All-Central Region in 2004.

Medina was part of a Michigan team that competed at the NCAA Championships all four years. In 2004, she coxed the varsity eight to a third-place finish, helping Michigan secure the third-place team finish. Medina also contributed to the Wolverines' BigTen Championship victories in 2003 and 2004.

## novice coach Corrie McGrath

Second Season • Washington State '03

A former standout rower for Washington State University, Corrie McGrath begins her second season on the Cougar coaching staff as the head novice coach. McGrath returned to the Palouse in 2008 after a year as the head novice coach and assistant varsity coach at Clemson University in Clemson, S.C.

In her first season at WSU, McGrath led the Cougar novice eight to finish third at the San Diego Crew Classic, defeat Ohio State in Columbus and place fourth at the 2009 Pacific-10 Championships.

In 2007, the Tigers' novice eight crew finished first in the ACC Championships under McGrath's direction. On top of her duties as novice coach at Clemson, McGrath was the director of recruiting and oversaw the graduate assistant and volunteer staff.

Prior to her work with the Tigers, McGrath served as the varsity lightweight coach at the University of Central



Florida in 2005-06 and as an assistant coach for UCF, which placed 16th at the NCAA Championships in 2007.

Returning to her former high school rowing club, McGrath started her coaching career with the Everett Rowing Association from 2003-05. She was the masters recruiting coordinator, and coached the lightweight varsity and novices.

McGrath rowed at Washington State from 2000-03 where she earned four letters and served as team captain. A two-time Collegiate Rowing Coaches Association (CRCA) second team All-American, four-time CRCA West Region First Team and two-time Pacific-10 All-Conference honoree, McGrath led the Cougars to NCAA Championship appearances in 2002 and 2003.

Academically, McGrath was twice named to the Pacific-10 Conference All-Academic Team. She earned a degree in psychology, with minors in sociology and sport management from WSU in 2003.

Starting her second season, Crystal Culp joined the Washington State coaching staff as the graduate assistant coach in 2008-09. Culp spent the previous four years coaching in the Great Lake region, and now enters the sixth year of her career.

In 2008, Culp coached the South Niagara Rowing Club's junior B men's team eight and four crews to second-place finishes at Henley. Also last year she coached the E.L. Crossley (Fonthill, Ontario) junior women's rowing lightweight eight and lightweight four boats to victory at the CSSRA Championships.

Prior to her stint in Canada, Culp served as novice women's coach at Pioneer High School (Ann Arbor, Mich.) from 2006-07. Her novice eight crew finished second at the state championships and third in the mid-west region. Culp launched her coaching career at the Ann Arbor Rowing Club as the Adult Rowing Coach from 2005-07.

## graduate assistant coach Crystal Culp

Second Season • Michigan '06

A 2006 graduate of the University of Michigan, Culp earned four letters in rowing and was a two-time All-Big Ten Second Team honoree, as well as a CRCA All-Central Region Second Team All-American. She was a member of four Big Ten Boats of the Week. In Culp's four seasons at Michigan, the Wolverines captured two Big Ten titles and made four NCAA Championship appearances, with a third-place finish in 2004.



Culp graduated from Michigan in 2006, earning a bachelor's degree in elementary education. She is a native of Ontario, Canada.

## Elson S. Floyd



### President

Elson S. Floyd is Washington State University's 10th president. He took office in May of 2007 after serving as president of the four-campus University of Missouri System during 2002-2007.

"Excellence, quality, and accountability" are keystones to his administration leading WSU. He puts high priority on WSU being a research leader and having a global presence. Furthermore, he endorses diversity of thought, opinion, perspective, viewpoints, race and ethnicity as characteristics of a world-class university.

Floyd served as president of Western Michigan University from 1999 to 2002, and held several administrative positions at the University of North Carolina Chapel Hill, including deanships in student affairs and the College of Arts and Sciences.

Previously, he spent two years as executive director of the state of Washington Higher Education Coordinating Board, the agency responsible for statewide coordination, planning, oversight, policy analysis and student financial aid programs for Washington's post-secondary education system. From 1990 to 1993, he served as vice president for student services, vice president for administration and executive vice president at Eastern Washington University.

He began his career in 1978 at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, where he held deanships in the Division of Student Affairs, the General College and the College of Arts and Sciences. From 1988 to 1990, he was assistant vice president for student services for the UNC system office, where he helped develop and articulate student affairs and academic affairs policy for the 16-campus university system.

A native of Henderson, N.C., Floyd holds a bachelor of arts degree in political science and speech, a master of education degree in adult education, and a doctor of philosophy degree in higher and adult education, all from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill.

Floyd and his wife, Carmento Floyd, have two grown children.

## Anne McCoy



### Senior Associate Director Of Athletics/SWA

Veteran intercollegiate athletics administrator Anne McCoy has served Washington State University since 2001 and was promoted from associate director to senior associate director of athletics in 2004. Her appointment to senior woman administrator came in the summer of 2007.

In her capacity as senior associate director of athletics, she is charged with overseeing all aspects of WSU's athletic budget and supervises several areas with the department including the business office, equipment, computer and football operations, and event management and facility operations. She also serves as a liaison for men's and women's basketball.

McCoy serves on several Pacific-10 Conference committees, including the Senior Woman Administrator and Television Committees and on the Budget and Finance, Compliance and Enforcement, Diversity Leadership Initiative Review, Awards Review, Medical Care, and Student-Athlete Advisory committees. She also been appointed to the NCAA Women's Rowing Committee and is a past vice president of the Pac-10 Conference.

A Wisconsin native, McCoy earned a bachelor's degree in sports management in 1989 from the University of Massachusetts. While an undergraduate, she worked for the Pittsburgh Penguins professional hockey organization, expanding the club's season ticket base. McCoy also served an internship as the assistant athletic business manager at the University of Connecticut, and was instrumental in designing and implementing a comprehensive computerized budget-tracking system.

McCoy served in several capacities at the University of Maine from 1989-1995, lastly as associate director of athletics and senior woman administrator. At Maine, she supervised men's basketball, men's and women's soccer, men's and women's swimming and softball in addition to the athletic business office, ticket office, retail store and cheerleading staff and operations. She took a similar administrative positive at St. Louis University from 1995-96.

In 1996, McCoy moved west, joining the staff at Portland State University as associate director of athletics and senior woman administrator, and was promoted to senior associate director of athletics in 1998. At PSU, she managed all internal staff and the daily operations of the department, representing the director of athletics as needed. McCoy also supervised men's and women's golf, cross country/track and field, and women's volleyball, soccer, tennis and softball.

McCoy and her husband Brian have two children, daughter Taylor and son Jake.

## Jim Sterk



### Director of Athletics

Washington native James M. Sterk was appointed Washington State University's director of athletics in June of 2000. In his nine years, Sterk has seen unprecedented growth and success by the Cougars' 17 intercollegiate teams and 450 individuals who compete for WSU annually.

On the academic front, WSU earned 114 selections to Pacific-10 Conference All-Academic teams in 2007-08. That figure represented the most student-athletes to earn such an honor during an academic year in school history, all student-athletes maintained a 3.01 cumulative GPA in 2008-09 and for 10 consecutive semesters WSU student-athletes have averaged at least a 3.00 cumulative GPA.

On the field, Cougar Athletics has enjoyed extraordinary achievements. In the past three years, 12 sports have been represented in NCAA postseason play. Among the many highlights achieved by the programs are the men's basketball team three consecutive postseason appearances including back-to-back appearances in the NCAA Tournament (2007 & 2008). The football program put together three consecutive 10-win seasons from 2001 to 2003 and the women's rowing program earned five NCAA Championship appearances including a fourth-place finish in 2006, the highest finish ever by a WSU women's team in NCAA postseason competition.

Facility improvements have also been among projects Sterk has tackled. Following the 2006 football season, the initial phases of a renovation to Martin Stadium, the home of Cougar football, began with Phases I and II which were completed in time for the 2008 football season. Completed in the fall of 2008 were a state-of-the-art rowing tank and a hydrotherapy complex to further meet the needs of student-athletes. In addition, plans are underway for an ambitious capital improvement plan that will enhance many other WSU athletic facilities.

A 1980 graduate of Western Washington University, Sterk received his master's degree in sports administration from Ohio University. His professional career has included positions at North Carolina, Maine, Seattle Pacific, Tulane and Portland State, the latter as director of athletics for five years before joining the Cougar staff.

The foundation of Sterk's leadership plan is based on five areas: the student-athlete experience, resource acquisition, personnel, political dynamics, and facilities. All five areas have enjoyed growth in his first nine years at Washington State University.

Sterk currently is the chair of the Pac-10 Athletic Directors committee and has served on numerous Pacific-10 Conference committees during his tenure at WSU.

## Ken Casavant



### Faculty Athletics Representative

Professor Ken Casavant, a member of the Washington State University family since 1967, currently serves as WSU's Faculty Athletics Representative to the Pacific-10 Conference and the National Collegiate Athletic Association. He is a past president of the Pac-10 and most recently served on the NCAA Division I Management Council.

Casavant came to WSU as a graduate research assistant in the Department of Agricultural and Resource Economics. He was named an assistant professor in 1971, an associate professor in 1975 and a full professor in 1980.

In 2004, Casavant received the Shalin Excellence award for Leadership for the University, having had the honor several years earlier of giving the Distinguished Faculty Address, the University's oldest award and also receiving the Sahlin Excellence in Public Service award for the University. In 1979, Casavant received the R.M. Wade award for outstanding teacher in the college of agriculture at WSU, and in 1990, he earned the distinguished WSU Faculty of the Year award. Casavant was elected vice-chair (1991-92) and chair (1992-93) of the WSU Faculty Senate and has been accorded the Distinguished Teacher award by the American Agricultural Economics Association. He was named Distinguished Scholar by the Western Agricultural Economics Association in 2003 for his nationally recognized work as a transportation economist.

During his tenure at WSU, Casavant has served as associate director for the Washington State Transportation Center (1984-87) and the interim Vice-Provost for Academic Affairs and interim Vice-Provost for Research (1998).

The North Dakota native is a 1965 graduate of North Dakota State University, where he earned a bachelor's degree in agricultural economics. He received his master's degree from NDSU, followed by a Ph.D., from WSU in 1971.

Ken and his wife Dorothy have two grown daughters, Michele and Colette and one grandson, Raphael.

Wulff has assembled a 55-51 in his nine-year head coaching career, including three postseason appearances.



**VOLLEYBALL**

**Andrew Palileo, 2nd Year**

Dedicated to rebuilding the Cougar volleyball program back to national prominence, Andrew Palileo ended his first season at WSU with the team winning three of the final four matches in the Pac-10 schedule. The WSU volleyball coaching staff has tirelessly hit the recruiting trails and the results will soon be evident on the court.



**SOCCER**

**Matt Potter, 7th Year**

Matt Potter, in his seventh season, has led Washington State to five-straight winning seasons, an unprecedented feat for Cougar soccer since joining the Pacific-10 Conference. His 55 victories are a school record. Last season, he led the Cougars to their first postseason berth since 2002. He has coached 19 all-conference honorees and 72 Pac-10 All-Academic award recipients.



**SWIMMING**

**Erica Quam, 8th Year**

During her seven years at Washington State, three Erica Quam coached teams have scored points at the NCAA Championships. Last season, the Cougars sent three student-athletes to the NCAA Championships, a first for the program. Under her leadership, WSU swimmers have set 19 school records, and garnered 75 Pac-10 All-Academic honors, including 25 first team accolades.



**MEN'S BASKETBALL**

**Ken Bone, 1st Year**

The 17th head coach in Cougar Basketball history, Ken Bone brings 17 years of head coaching experience with him to the Palouse, including the last four at Portland State. A Washington native, Bone took PSU to consecutive NCAA Tournaments his last two seasons with the Vikings (2008 and 2009), marking the only appearances in school history.



**WOMEN'S BASKETBALL**

**June Daugherty, 3rd Year**

June Daugherty, in her third season leading the Cougars, brought a wealth of experience in building winning programs. In her first season Daugherty brought in one of the nation's top-ranked recruiting classes and more than tripled home attendance. Last year she orchestrated one of the nation's top 30 turnarounds, measured in both wins and jump in RPI. Daugherty is looking to take her third different school to the NCAA Tournament.



**MEN'S GOLF**

**Walt Williams, 12th Year**

Since taking over the WSU men's and women's golf programs in 1998, Walt Williams' teams have re-written the record books and crowned two All-Americans. Both the men's and women's teams have competed in the NCAA West Regionals during his tenure. Williams is the winningest coach in school history, compiling a total of 27 team titles, including one in 2008-09.



**WOMEN'S GOLF**

**Kelli Kamimura, 1st Year**

Kelli Kamimura is in her first season as the head women's golf coach at WSU. A native of Burlington, Wash. (Sedro Woolley HS), she was also a two-time All-American during her collegiate playing days at Washington.



**TENNIS**

**Lisa Hart, 7th Year**

The Cougar tennis program, under the direction of seventh-year head coach Lisa Hart, has been nationally ranked each of the last six seasons and has recorded 14-plus wins in three of the last four years. In 2008 the Cougars reached the NCAA tournament for the first time since the 2002 season.



**BASEBALL**

**Don Marbut, 6th Year**

Don Marbut, is in his sixth year as WSU's head coach and seventh with the program. In 2009, he skipped the Cougars to their first NCAA postseason since 1990. He has mentored 14 Major League Baseball draft picks and led the Cougars to a national ranking in three of the last four seasons.



**ROWING**

**Jane LaRiviere, 8th Year**

Jane LaRiviere has led her teams to four NCAA Championships in her seven years at WSU, including twice in the last four seasons. In 2008 the Cougars finished eighth at the NCAA Championships, only bettered by her squad's fourth-place finish in 2006. LaRiviere was awarded Pac-10 and CRCA West Regional Coach-of-the-Year honors in 2006.

**Rick Sloan, 16th Year**

Rick Sloan is the dean of WSU coaches, having been with the program for 36 years, including the last 14 as head coach of both the men's and women's programs. He has directed 38 WSU athletes to NCAA Outdoor All-America status 67 times and mentored 29 Cougar athletes to NCAA Indoor All-America status 44 times.

Russell earned her Bachelor of Science degree in 1990 from Brigham Young University and served as a graduate assistant trainer there for two years. She was the head trainer and instructor at Brigham Young University - Hawaii for a year before returning to Utah



and working at Utah Valley Physical Therapy & Sports Medicine in Provo.

She received her Master of Science from BYU in 1995 and worked at Physical & Sports Therapy in Payson, Utah for the next year.

Russell earned a National Athletic Trainers' Association Clinical Instructor Educator certification in 2002 and has been a member of NATA since 1989. She has had two "pearls" published in *The Physician and Sportsmedicine* (December 2000, and February 2001).

Our 93 percent graduation rate for those seniors who have exhausted their eligibility (over the past 10 years), second among all Pacific-10 Conference schools in that time, reflects our consistent commitment to academic success while striking a balance between academics and athletics.

# Pacific-10 Conference

## The Conference of Champions

Entering the 2009-10 season, the Pacific-10 Conference continues to uphold its tradition as the "Conference of Champions."® Pac-10 members have claimed an incredible 166 NCAA team titles over the past 19 seasons, 11 in 2008-09, for an average of nearly nine championships per academic year.

Even more impressive is the breadth of the Pac-10's success, as those 166 team titles have come in 26 different men's and women's sports. The Pac-10 has led the nation in NCAA Championships 43 of the last 49 years and finished second five times.

Participation in the postseason was a common occurrence for the Conference in 2007-08. Of the 22 sports sponsored by the Pac-10, 18 witnessed at least half its teams participating in NCAA or other postseason action. The men sent 63 of a possible 93 teams into the postseason (67.7 percent), while the women sent 65 of a possible 101 teams (64.4 percent).


*On the women's side, the story is much the same. Since the NCAA began conducting women's championships 27 years ago, Pac-10 members have claimed at least four national titles in a single season on 20 occasions, including 2008-09. Overall, the Pac-10 has captured 119 NCAA women's crowns, easily outdistancing the SEC, which is second with 74. Pac-10 members have dominated a number of sports, winning 21 softball titles, 18 tennis crowns, 13 of the last 19 volleyball titles, 13 of the last 20 trophies in golf and 11 in swimming and diving.*

*Pac-10 women athletes shine nationally on an individual basis as well, having captured an unmatched 525 NCAA individual titles, an average of more than 18 champions per season.*




