





THE COUGAR HEAD LOGO

In 1936, student Randall Johnson, class of 1938, designed the original Cougar head logo for Washington State College. It was used on the side of college trucks. In 1959, when the institution changed from college to university, he re-created the logo to incorporate the "U" in place of the "C." In 2002, WSU developed a new graphic identity. It employs the Cougar head within a crest, an internationally recognized symbol for higher education.

THE COUGAR NICKNAME

Washington State University students officially adopted the nickname "Cougars" October 28, 1919, three days after a reference to "cougars" was used in a football game story following WSU's upset 14-0 win at California. In the story, a Bay Area writer said the Pacific Northwest team "played like cougars" in upsetting the Bears.

THE VICTORY BELL

ALUMNI CENYE

In the late 1800s, the victory bell was mounted on the ground in the center of campus; it rang to start and dismiss classes in those early days. Today, it is located at the Lewis Alumni Centre. A member of the Student Alumni Connection rings it after a WSU football win.


THE COUGAR MASCOT

In 1927, Governor Roland Hartley presented a cougar cub to the students of the University. This first cougar mascot was called Butch, to honor Herbert "Butch" Meeker of Spokane, who was WSU's football star at the time. Butch II was presented to the students by Governor Clarence D. Martin in 1938. Butch III and IV were twin cubs, presented by Governor Arthur B. Langlie in 1942. Governor Langlie presented Butch V in 1955. Butch VI, the last live mascot on campus, died in the summer of 1978. He had been presented to WSU by Governor Albert Rosellini in 1964 from the Seattle Zoo. Today, WSU students in a "Butch the Cougar" mascot costume rally school spirit at athletic contests, including football games and other events.

STUDENT RECREATION CENTER







The student recreation center opened spring of 2001. Its 150,000 square feet contains seven gymnasiums, a four-lane indoor track, 17,000 square feet of fitness training area, five-lane lap pool, leisure spa, three multi-purpose rooms (aerobic/martial arts), four racquetball courts, a wellness center, and a fireplace lounge.


Cynthia Prieto Academic Counselor

Jackson L. Coots, M.S., C.S.C.S., S.C.C.C. Assistant Strength and Conditioning Coach



PRESIDENT



V. Lane Rawlins, a noted economist and academic leader, is the ninth president of Washington State University.

Under his leadership, WSU is recognized as one of the top 50 public research universities in the United States, according to U.S. News & World Report.

A strategic plan he implemented solidifies the university's commitment to undergraduate education, research and scholarship, as well as providing quality education in a caring community. The university's motto -- World Class. Face to Face. -- reflects that commitment.

His association with WSU started more than 30 years ago when he joined the Department of Economics faculty. Later, he became department chair and, for four years, he was WSU's vice provost.

He returned to WSU in 2000 after serving nine years at the president of the University of Memphis. Before that, he was academic affairs vice chancellor of the University of Alabama system.

Rawlins is the coauthor of two books, has published widely, and has taught labor economics and the economics of education.

He has received many awards, including those recognizing him as a communicator, humanitarian and educator.

He earned his bachelor's degree in economics from Brigham Young University in 1963 and earned his Ph.D. in economics from the University of California, Berkeley, in 1969.

An avid fan of WSU athletics, he cheers on the Cougars at many sports events and enjoys fly fishing, golf, history and literature.

Rawlins and his wife, Mary Jo, have three children and 11 grandchildren.

JIM STERK

DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS



Washington native James M. Sterk was appointed Washington State University's director of athletics in June of 2000. In his four years, he has overseen unprecedented growth and success by the Cougars' 17 intercollegiate athletics teams and the 450 individuals who compete for WSU annually.

In the last five years, WSU has scored its best finish and highest point total in the history of the Athletic Directors Cup competition among NCAA schools.

WSU's success on the gridiron in the 21st century three consecutive 10-win seasons - has more than done its part to draw national attention to the Cougar sports programs. In the past four years, 13 Cougar teams have

been represented in postseason competition.

Facility improvements have also been among projects Sterk has tackled. WSU recently completed a major baseball field renovation and became the first collegiate program to have FieldTurf as its playing surface. An ambitious capital improvement plan is underway to enhance many other WSU sport facilities, including major changes to Martin Stadium, the home of Cougar football.

A 1979 graduate of Western Washington, Sterk received his master's degree in sports administration from Ohio University. His professional career has included positions at North Carolina, Maine, Seattle Pacific, Tulane and Portland State, the latter as director of athletics for five years before coming to Pullman.

The foundation of Sterk's leadership plan is based on five areas, the student-athlete experience, resource acquisition, personnel, political dynamics and facilities. All five areas have enjoyed growth in Sterk's arrival in Pullman.

Sterk currently is a member of the prestigious NCAA Championship/Competition cabinet and has served on numerous Pacific-10 Conference committees during his tenure at WSU.

Sterk and his wife, Debi, have three children, Ashley, Amy and Abby.

MARCIA SANEHOLTZ

SENIOR ASSOCIATE DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS/SWA



Marcia Saneholtz has been an integral part of Cougar athletics for more than two decades, has been instrumental in the improvement of facilities since her appointment in 1982. She was the driving force in attaining the 1997 NCAA Division I Women's Volleyball Championships, 2001 Women's Basketball West Regional and 2003 and 2007 Men's Basketball First and Second Rounds for Washington State to host at the Spokane Arena.

From March 6 until July 1, 2000, Saneholtz served as the interim Athletic Director at WSU. Saneholtz was named a WSU Woman of Distinction in 2003.

Originally from Napoleon, Ohio, Saneholtz received her bachelor's degree from Bowling Green State University and taught in the Los Angeles public schools for three years. She moved north, taught in the Shoreline (Wash.) public school system as a substitute and coached in the CYO and Seattle Parks Department programs. She was active in the Washington, Northwest, and national officials associations from 1973-82.

After earning her master's degree in sports administration at the University of Washington, Saneholtz was appointed the assistant women's athletic director at Washington State.

Sane-holtz was promoted to associate athletic director in 1982 and currently serves as senior associate directors of athletics and is the Senior Woman Administrator at WSU.

She served on the National Association of Collegiate Women's Athletic Administrators (NACWAA) Board of Directors from 1987-94, including a term as president in 1992-93. She was selected the NACWAA National Administrator of the Year in 1997.

Saneholtz has been a strong presence on several NCAA committees. She has served as the chair of the NCAA Women's Division I Volleyball Committee. Other NCAA memberships include the Committee on Athletic Certification (1993-99), chair of the Peer Selection Subcommittee (1992-99), President's Commission Liaison Committee (1992-96), and the Women's Committee on Committees (1989-92). She has also served on numerous Pacific-10 Conference committees including two terms as vice president (1988-89 and 1998-99). Currently, she is a member of the NCAA Committee on Women's Athletics.

Saneholtz and her husband, Byron, have two grown daughters, Jennifer and Amy.

Ken Casavant, a member of the Washington State University family since 1967, currently serves as WSU's Faculty Athletic Representative to the Pacific-10 Conference and the National Collegiate Athletic Association.

Casavant, who in past years has served as the president of the Pacific-10, came to WSU as a graduate research assistant in the Department of Agricultural and Resource Economics. He was named an assistant professor in 1971, an associate professor in 1975 and a full professor in 1980.

In 1979, Casavant received the R.M. Wade award for outstanding teacher in the college of agriculture at

WSU, and in 1990, he earned the distinguished WSU Faculty of the Year award. Casavant was elected vice-chair (1991-92) and chair (1992-93) of the WSU Faculty Senate and has been accorded the Distinguished Teacher award by the American Agricultural Economics Association. He was named Distinguished Scholar by the Western Agricultural Economics Association in 2003 for his nationally recognized work as a transportation economist.

During his tenure at WSU, Casavant has served as associate director for the Washington State Transportation Center (1984-87) and the interim Vice-Provost for Academic Affairs and interim Vice-Provost for Research (1998).

The North Dakota native is a 1965 graduate of North Dakota State University, where he earned a bachelor's degree in agricultural economics. He received his master's degree from NDSU, followed by a Ph.D., from WSU in 1971.

Ken and his wife Dorothy have two grown daughters, Michele and Colette.

assistant for the U-12 Eastside FC girls B-team out of Bellevue, Wash. Jorgensen has worked several soccer camps including serving as the director of the Seattle Sounders Girls Soccer Camp in 2003 and as a camp coach in 2000 and 2001. She was the goalkeeper director for the Washington State University Women's Soccer Camp from 2000-2005.

Jorgensen was the starting goalkeeper for Washington State from 1998-2001, and a captain of the 2000 NCAA tournament team. She holds the WSU all-time career records in saves (392), solo-shutouts (18) and minutes in goal (6,461). She is fifth in single-season shutouts (6 in 1998) and tied for third in single-season goal against average (.89 in 2000).

Jorgensen earned numerous accolades while at Washington State including; Verizon/CoSIDA District VIII Women's Fall/Winter At-Large First Team All-American (2000), Veri-

zon/CoSIDA At-Large Women's Fall/Winter National Third Team All-Academic (1999, 2000), WSU Athletics Top 50 Student Athlete Award (2000, 2001), Pac-10 All-Academic First Team (1999, 2000), Pac-10 All-Conference Second Team (2000, 2001). Jorgensen was also well-respected by her teammates, earning the team awards of; co-MVP (1998-2000), Team captain (1999-2001) and most inspirational player (2000).

Jorgensen was a member of the founding Seattle Sounders (W-league) women's soccer team (1999-2002). She also played for the Hibernian and Caldonian Saints (Seattle, Wash.) from 2000-2002 and was invited to tryout for the San Jose Cyberrays of the WUSA in 2002.

Jorgensen graduated with a BS in Math Education in December of 2002 and loves teaching. She

had great experiences student-teaching/coaching at the high-school level but enjoys the challenges and rewards of coaching at the collegiate level.



ntering the 2005-06 season, the Pacific-10 Conference continues to uphold its tradition as the "Conference of Champions."® Pac-10 members have claimed an incredible 90 NCAA team titles over the past 11 seasons, for an average of more than eight championships per academic year.

Even more impressive is the breadth of the Pac-10's success, as those 90 team titles have come in 21 different men's and women's sports. The Pac-10 has led the nation in NCAA Championships 39 of the last 45 years and finished second five times.

Spanning nearly a century of outstanding athletics achievement, the Pac-10 has captured 342 NCAA titles (248 men's, 94 women's), far outdistancing the runner-up Big Ten Conference's 201 titles.

The Conference's reputation is further proven in the annual United States Sports Academy Directors' Cup competition, the prestigious award that honors the best overall collegiate athletics programs in the country. STANFORD continued its remarkable run in the 2004-05 season, winning its 11th consecutive Directors' Cup. In the 2004-05 competition, seven of the top-20 Division I programs were Pac-10 members: No. 1 STANFORD, No. 3 UCLA, No. 10 USC, No. 11 ARIZONA STATE, No. 14 WASHINGTON, No. 15 CALIFORNIA and No. 18 ARIZONA. The Pac-10 landed six programs in the top-15, twice as many as any other conference, with the ACC and SEC at three each.

The Pac-10 captured six NCAA titles in 2004-05, third-most in the nation. It should be noted that the Pac-10 total does not include USC's national championship in football or CALIFORNIA's in rugby, as they are not counted as NCAA titles. The Pac-10 tied the Big 12 for the most NCAA titles in women's sports with four.

NCAA team champions from the Pac-10 in 2004-05 came from UCLA (men's tennis, men's water polo and women's water polo), STANFORD (women's volleyball and women's tennis) and CALIFORNIA (women's rowing). The Pac-10 also had runner-up finishes in eight NCAA Championship events: women's golf (UCLA), soccer (UCLA) softball (UCLA), track and field (UCLA) and water polo (Stanford) and men's water polo (Stanford), swimming (Stanford) and volleyball (UCLA). Overall, the Conference had 20 teams finish in the top three at NCAA Championship events.

Participation in the postseason was a common occurrence for the Pac-10 in 2004-05. Of the 22 sports sponsored by the Pac-10, 19 witnessed at least half its teams participating in the postseason. The men sent 55 of a possible 89 teams into the postseason (61.8 percent), while the women sent 68 of a possible 98 teams into NCAA Championship action (69.4 percent).

On the women's side, the story is much the same. Since the NCAA began conducting women's championships in 1981-82, Pac-10 members have claimed at least four national titles in a single season 16 times. Overall, the Pac-10 has captured 94 NCAA women's crowns, easily outdistancing the Southeastern Conference, which is second with 63. Pac-10 members have dominated a number of sports, winning 18 softball titles, 16 tennis crowns, 10 of the last 15 volleyball titles, 11 of the last 16 trophies in golf and eight in swimming and diving.

Pac-10 women athletes shine nationally on an individual basis as well, having captured an unmatched 439 NCAA individual titles, an average of more than 19 champions per season.

COUGARS FAIR WELL AGAINST RANKED OPPONENTS

Washington State faced seven nationally ranked teams this year, finishing 4-1-2 and highlighted by the 3-2 victory over No. 12 Washington Oct. 29. The Cougars upset No. 8 UCLA and No. 22 USC the weekend of Oct. 15-17 to record first their conference wins of the season. The Cougar notched a 1-0 win against No. 12 Pepperdine Sept. 17 and recorded ties against No. 8 Tennessee (0-0, Sept. 5) and No. 11 Stanford

(0-0, Nov. 7) The only loss against a ranked opponent came against the 2002 NCAA Champions No. 6 Portland 2-0 Oct. 3. Nine of the Cougars 2004 opponents made it to the NCAA Division I Women's Soccer Tournament, including all of the afore mentioned teams and California, Utah and Arizona.

WSU KNOCKS OFF NO. 12 WASHINGTON 3-2

Washington State upset No. 12 Washington 3-2, Friday, Oct. 29 at Lower Soccer Field for WSU's annual Dad's Weekend. The Cougars took three shots and notched three goals for an early 3-0 lead with each of WSU's three leading scorers providing a goal. Alix Rustrum scored at the 1:36 mark with a cross-goal shot that found the upper-right corner of the Husky goal. Senior Cailan McCutchan gave WSU a two goal lead six minutes later, heading in a Megan Cecchini corner kick. McCutchan then provided the assist on Haley Thompson-Miller's game-winning goal at the 15:44 mark. The win marked the first Cougar win over their cross-state rivals since 2000 and improved WSU's series record to 5-7-2 against the Huskies.



COUGARS CLAIM HISTORIC WINS AGAINST BRUINS AND TROJANS

WSU's victories over No. 8 UCLA (Oct. 15) and No. 22 USC (Oct. 17) marked the first time in the history of the Washington State women's soccer program that a Cougar squad beat both Southern California squads in the same season. The 1-0 shutout victory over UCLA was the first WSU win since 1993. The Bruins are the highest-ranked opponent the Cougars have beaten since defeating No. 2 Washington in 2000. The Cougars blanked USC

2-0, recording the first WSU shutout against the Trojans 1998.

The Maple Valley, Wash. native was named to the Soccer Buzz 2004 Elite Team of the Week and to Soccer America's Team of the Week for Oct. 25-31 after scoring a goal and provided an assist on the game-winning goal against the Huskies. McCutchan finished

her WSU career with 38 starts in 56 appearances, scoring seven goals, including three game winners, and recording two assists. She took 56 shots as a Cougar, placing 19 on-goal.

Denver, Colo. native was also named to Soccer Buzz's Elite Team of the Week and Soccer America's Team of the Week for Oct. 12-18. Hultin garnered 2004 Academic All-District VIII Women's Soccer University Division Second Team accolades and collected her second Pac-10 All-Academic honorable mention honor.

TEAM GPA IS EIGHTH BEST AMONG DIVISION I PROGRAMS
