MARTIN STADIUM HISTORY

NAME: Clarence D. Martin Stadium and Academic Center CAPACITY: 32 760

HISTORY

1892—Built as Soldier Field.

1895 (November 9)—WSU defeated Idaho 10-4 in the first football game on Soldier Field.

1902—The field was renamed Rogers Field in honor of the Governor of the State of Washington, John R. Rogers.

1936—Washington State College built a completely new football stadium, but retained the same name; the new stadium was an all-wood structure built on concrete pilings. The field also featured new stands, an enlarged press box and an electronic scoreboard

1970 (April)—Fire destroyed the south stands; a one-million dollar fund drive began after the decision was made to rebuild the stands rather than relocate or build an entirely new stadium; Dan Martin, a Los Angeles businessman, gave \$250,000 to the project with the stipulation the stadium be renamed after his father, Clarence D. Martin. Clarence Martin was Governor of the State from 1933-40.

1972 (summer)—first artificial turf (Astroturf) was installed.

1972 (Sept. 30)—WSU met Utah in the first game played in refurbished Martin Stadium; 1975—New north (student) stands were built.

1978 (fall)—Work began on the academic portion of the complex on the south side with the computer center relocating to the complex upon completion of the project in

1979 (January)—Another renovation of the stadium began to increase the seating capacity from 27,600 to 40,000; the floor of the stadium was excavated 16 feet to add 12,400 seats; the track was removed from the stadium and relocated to the Bailey Baseball Stadium area directly north of the football complex, while a new baseball stadium was then built just south and east of Friel Court, home of Cougar basketball; the entire project, like the one in 1970, was funded through contributions; gift-in-kind and the purchase of "stadium builder" seat options; it marked the first time a collegiate football stadium had been enlarged by digging down rather than building up; the project was also funded in part by the Martin family, with Charlotte Martin, widow of Dan Martin, giving \$250,000 to the project; a SuperTurf artificial surface was installed

1979 (October 13)—WSU celebrated Homecoming by defeating UCLA 17-13 before a record crowd of 32,651 in the first game played in the enlarged Martin Stadium.

1990 (summer)—Installed the sand-filled Omni-Turf playing surface.

2000 (summer)—Installed FieldTurf in Martin Stadium and on Rogers Field.

2006 —Current stadium renovation began.

2006 (summer)—Replaced FieldTurf in Martin Stadium.


2008 — Phase I and II completed.

2012 (summer) — The \$80 million Cougar Football Project, which began in Nov., 2011, replaces the old press box on the south stands with a new structure that includes a new press box, club seats, loge boxes, luxury suites and a club room.

2013 (winter) — Construction began on the \$61 million, 84,000-square-foot Football Operations Building. Improvements will provide a home for the Cougar football program, including new weight room, lockers, equipment and training rooms for players, in addition to position meeting rooms and coaches' offices. It will also feature a WSU Football heritage area and a game-day home for Gray W former letter winners.



MIKE LEACH Head Coach Second Season

Washington State University announced Nov. 30, 2011 that Mike Leach had been named the Cougars' head football coach.

In his first season in Pullman, Leach's high-powered offense led the Pac-12 Conference in passing, averaging 330.42 yards per game. That figure ranked ninth nationally and marked the second-highest average in school history. Seven times the Cougars threw for more than 350 yards, including the season-ending, 31-28, overtime win against Washington. In a season that produced a 3-9 overall record, the Cougars saw a bit of a youth movement as 17 freshmen played and only four seniors started regularly. Academically, nine Cougars received Pac-12 All-Academic honors while the 2012 fall semester football GPA of 2.66 marked the first time the football team had been over a 2.60 GPA for fall semester.

Leach brought a proven record of winning to Pullman. In 10 seasons as a head coach, all at Texas Tech (2000-09) his program earned 10 bowl bids. In addition, the Susanville, Calif., native who was raised in Cody, Wyo., recorded a school-record 84 victories during his tenure.

Leading the most prolific passing offense in the country, Leach received three national coach of the year awards in 2008 - the Woody Hayes Award, Howie Long/Fieldturf Coach of the Year, and George Munger Award. His offense spreads the field with his exciting brand of football and guided Texas Tech to six NCAA passing titles and three total offense titles during his 10 seasons in Lubbock. Leach's offense produced school records in nearly every passing category in 2000, his first season with the Red Raiders, but surpassed those numbers in each of his next nine seasons.

During Leach's time in Lubbock, Texas, the Red Raiders increased their yards per game by more than 150 and averaged nearly 20 points more per outing. In the passing game, Texas Tech threw for about 300 yards more per game in the decade Leach was at the helm.

Leach led Texas Tech to one of the most memorable seasons in school history in 2008 as the team set a program record with 11 regular-season wins en route to an 11-2 record. The win total tied the mark, set previously by the 1953 and 1973 Red Raider squads. Numerous accolades poured in from across the country as an unprecedented four players earned first-team All-America status, in addition to Leach's three coach of the year honors. Quarterback Graham Harrell, offensive tackle Rylan Reed and offensive guard Brandon Carter each garnered first-team honors, while wide receiver Michael Crabtree was honored as a unanimous consensus All-American for the second-straight season.

On the field in 2008, the Red Raiders led the nation in passing for the sixth time in Leach's ten seasons and ranked among the top five in total offense. Harrell finished his storied career second on the NCAA career passing yardage list with 15,793 yards. Harrell also broke the career NCAA passing touchdowns mark with 134.

The Texas Tech program has established itself as one of the nation's leading producers of productive quarterbacks since the 2000 season. Harrell threw for 4,555 yards in his debut as the starter in 2006 and became the sixth player and third Red Raider in NCAA history to throw for 5,000 yards in a season with his 5,705-yard effort in 2007 and 5,111 yards last season. He also is the third quarterback under Leach to win nine games in a season and the first Red Raider in history to win 11 in a regular season. Former quarterback Kliff Kingsbury in 2002 and Cody Hodges in 2005 each posted nine-win seasons during their careers, while 2003 and 2004 signal callers B.J. Symons and Sonny Cumbie each won eight games in their respective seasons as the starter.

The Red Raiders improved their total offensive numbers from 324.8 yards per game to 531.0 yards per game since Leach's arrival. Leach's first nine seasons at Tech rank as the top nine all-time in total offense, while scoring went from 23 points per game in 1999 to a school-record 43.8 points in 2008. The most significant increase was in the passing game, where the Red Raiders averaged 475.3 yards per game in 2008 compared to 175.4 yards in 1999.

The running game flourished under Leach as well. Former Red Raider Taurean Henderson holds the NCAA career record for receptions by a running back. The Red Raiders' 28 total rushing scores in 2008 were the most for a Tech team since the 1993 team scored 30. Despite Tech's offense revolving around the pass, Leach did a tremendous job of incorporating the running back position into the mix. Henderson finished his career with 303 receptions, which ranks first in NCAA history among running backs and fourth overall.

The Red Raiders were not known solely for their play on the scoring side of the ball. The Texas Tech defense also flourished during Leach's 10 seasons. Texas Tech held opponents without an offensive touchdown a dozen times under Leach, including seven shutouts. Three of the whitewashes came in 2000 when the Red Raiders tied for the national lead.

The play of the special teams also improved with each season. Former placekicker Alex Trlica holds the NCAA record with 233 career extra points and another record for extra points

made without a miss. He finished with 377 career points, which ranks among the top 10 in NCAA history among kickers. While leading the Red Raiders to 76 wins in his nine seasons, Leach is the only coach in school history to lead ten teams to bowl games.

Although Leach's presence was felt throughout the team, it also was beneficial for the players individually. In addition to picking up the Sammy Baugh Trophy in 2007, Harrell was the recipient of the National Football Foundation and College Football Hall of Fame's Post-Graduate Scholarship and was one of 15 players selected as a candidate for the prestigious Draddy Award, the academic Heisman. Harrell also ranked fourth in the 2008 Heisman voting, while Crabtree was fifth. Symons was the second Tech quarterback to receive The Touchdown Club of Columbus' Sammy Baugh Trophy (Kingsbury in 2002).

Kingsbury, a 2002 All-Big 12 first-team quarterback and sixth-round draft pick of the New England Patriots, led the Big 12 Conference in several passing categories during his final three seasons and was a Heisman Trophy candidate in 2002. He also was named the Verizon Academic All-American of the Year for football and was awarded an \$18,000 postgraduate scholarship by the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame.

In 2004, inside receiver Trey Haverty became Tech's first Associated Press All-American since Montae Reagor in 1998, when he was selected to the third team. Free safety Dwayne Slay earned first-team All-America honors from Sports Illustrated in 2005, marking the first in seven seasons. Slay was one of the country's most punishing tacklers that year and led the conference and finished second nationally with eight forced fumbles.

Leach has coached several players who have gone on to the NFL. While at Tech, 18 players have been drafted and 21 others have signed free agent contracts. In the spring of 2009, four players were selected among the first four rounds of the NFL Draft, marking the most successful draft for Texas Tech in the Leach era. Crabtree became the highest draft pick at No. 10, since Gabe Rivera in 1983. Crabtree, selected by the San Francisco 49ers, is the highest drafted Tech receiver since Dave Parks went No. 1 overall in 1964.

Safety Darcel McBath was selected by the Denver Broncos in the second round, while offensive lineman Louis Vasquez was taken in the third by San Diego. Defensive end Brandon Williams went to the Dallas Cowboys in the fourth.

The program made strides academically as well under Leach. During his 10 years, Tech was recognized as one of the nation's top institutions for consistently being above a 70 percent graduation rate, according to the American Football Coaches Association.

Prior to coming on board at Texas Tech, Leach, in just one season at Oklahoma, directed a Sooner offense that went from one of the worst in the Big 12 Conference to one of the best. Under Leach's tutelage, Josh Heupel was named 1999 Big 12 Offensive Newcomer of the Year. For his efforts, Leach was nominated for the 1999

Broyles Award as the top assistant coach in the country.

Leach guided an Oklahoma offense that went from 11th in the Big 12 in 1998 to first in 1999 and 101st in the nation to 11th. In just one year, OU's total offense numbers improved from 293.3 to 427.2 yards per game.

The rise in passing and scoring offense categories is just as impressive. Oklahoma went from last to first in the Big 12 in passing offense in one year, from 107th in the country to ninth. Under Leach, the Sooners improved from 109.9 yards passing per game to 321.7 yards per game.

In 1998, Oklahoma was last in the Big 12 and 101st in the country in scoring offense at 16.7 points per game. In 1999, the Sooners improved to second in the league and eighth in the country in scoring at 36.8 points per game, an increase of just over 20 points per game.

Under Leach, the Oklahoma offense set six Big 12 Conference and 17 0U records. The Sooners were one of only two schools in the nation to have six players with 20 or more receptions in 1999.

Prior to joining Bob Stoops' Oklahoma staff, Leach served as offensive coordinator for Hal Mumme at the University of Kentucky and Valdosta (Ga.) State University. For two years at Kentucky under Mumme, Leach coached the Kentucky "Air Raid" offense that was one of the most explosive in Southeastern Conference history. Under Mumme and Leach, the Kentucky offense set six NCAA records, 41 Southeastern Conference records and 116 school records in 22 games.

Leach's Kentucky offense featured the talented Tim Couch, who passed for 4,275 yards and 34 touchdowns as a senior and was the top pick of the 1999 NFL Draft.

Named 1996 Division II Offensive Coordinator of the Year by American Football Quarterly magazine, Leach helped Mumme lead Valdosta State to a 40-17-1 record. The 1993 Blazer offense smashed 66 school records, 22 conference records and seven national records. In 1994, Valdosta State advanced to the Division II playoffs with Leach's offense shattering 80 school records, 35 conference records and seven more national marks.

Leach and Mumme first teamed up at Iowa Wesleyan College in 1989. From 1989 to 1991 Leach served as offensive coordinator and line coach for an offense that led the NAIA in passing yardage one season and finished second the other two. Iowa Wesleyan quarterbacks passed for more than 11,000 yards in Leach's three seasons and broke 26 national records.

Leach also has made coaching stops in Pori, Finland, where he served as a head coach in the European Football League (1989), as well as one-year stints at College of the Desert (1988) and Cal Poly-San Luis Obispo (1987).

After graduating with honors from BYU in 1983, Leach earned a master's degree from the U.S. Sports Academy and his law degree from Pepperdine University, where he graduated in the top one-third of his class.

The oldest of six siblings, Leach and his wife, Sharon, are the parents of four children; Janeen, Kim, Cody and Kiersten.

Defensive Coordinator Defensive Backs

Second Season

Mike Breske, a coaching veteran with more than three decades of experience, joined Mike Leach's coaching staff when he was named defensive coordinator/defensive backs coach in January, 2012.

Last season Breske guided an aggressive, youthful defense that gained valuable experience throughout the season. Six players made their first career start in the season opener yet the Cougar defense finished the season ranked No. 8 nationally in tackles-for-loss (7.67 per game) and No. 11 in sacks per game (2.92). The Cougars also recorded 15 interceptions, the most by a WSU defense since the 2006 season. Strong safety Deone Bucannon was a second-team All-Pac-12 Conference selection while two redshirt freshmen, defensive tackle Xavier Cooper and linebacker Darryl Monroe, earned honorable mention honors.

Breske arrived at Washington State after completing his second season at the University of Montana, where he served as defensive coordinator and worked with the safeties. It marked the second time in his long and successful career Breske served on the Montana staff, having been the assistant head coach/defensive coordinator/secondary coach for the Grizzlies under head coach Joe Glenn from 2000-02

In 2011 the Grizzlies defense ranked 26th in total defense, surrendering 327.14 ypg. They were also 18th in scoring defense (19.93 ppg) and 19th in pass efficiency defense (111.08) en route to reaching the FCS semifinals and finishing the season 11-3.

Breske made an immediate impact in 2010 as Montana was ranked 10th in the nation in total defense, giving up just 289.82 yards per game. The defense also ranked 14th in tackles-for-loss (7.64 pg) and 18th in sacks (2.64 pg). Strong safety Erik Stoll was an All-America selection 2010 and a First-Team All-Big Sky selection, while free safety Jimmy Wilson was an honorable mention All-Big Sky pick. Additionally, he coached Jimmy Williams, who is currently playing for the Miami Dolphins.

Breske has more than 30 years of coaching experience in the collegiate ranks under his belt. Prior to his second stint at Montana, he served a one-year stint as the defensive coordinator/ secondary coach at North Dakota State in 2009.

From 2003-08 he served as the assistant head coach/defensive coordinator and secondary coach for Glenn at the University of Wyoming. In 2006 the Cowboys were ranked ninth in the nation in total defense, while they were 22nd in 2007 and 43rd in 2008

During his first stint at Montana (2000-02), the Grizzlies prospered, winning the Football Championship Subdivision (I-AA) national championship in 2001, finishing as runner-up in 2000 and advancing to the quarterfinals in 2002. In 2000 Montana finished eighth in total defense (265.00 ypg), second in rushing defense (76.64 ypg) and 33rd in scoring defense (19.27 ppg).

During that three-year stretch he coaching two players to All-America status, Vince Huntsberger (2000) and Trey Young (2001-02).

Prior to Montana he was the defensive coordinator for Northern Colorado's powerhouse teams from 1987-99. He was also the defensive coordinator at Wayne State College (Neb.) from 1983-87; the secondary coach at Yankton (S.D.) College in 1982-83, and was a graduate assistant coach at Northern Iowa from 1981-82.

Breske was an all-conference cornerback and team captain at South Dakota State, playing there from 1976-80.

He earned a bachelor's degree at South Dakota State in 1981 and a master's at Northern Iowa in 1982. Mike and his wife Tami have three children, Cari, Adam, and Taylor. They have five grandchildren: two granddaughters, Mikayla, Katelyn and Layla, and two grandsons, Bryson and Dylan.

Jim Mastro, a veteran in the collegiate coaching ranks for more than two decades, begins his second season as running backs coach on Mike Leach's staff.

Prior to WSU Mastro coached tight ends and F-backs at UCLA in 2011 and also played a key role in UCLA's running attack, which averaged more than 190 yards per game, third in the Pac-12 Conference in 2011.

Mastro, 47, spent the previous 11 seasons at Nevada (2000-10), building one of the top running attacks in the nation. In five of those seasons, a Wolf Pack running back led the Western Athletic Conference in rushing. In his last four years, he has helped Nevada running backs produce five 1,000-yard seasons.

In 2010, senior Vai Taua recorded his third consecutive 1,000-yard season, finishing seventh nationally with an average of 123.9 yards per contest. As a team, Nevada ranked No. 3 nationally with an average of 292.2 yards per game. The Wolf Pack led the nation in 2009 and ranked third nationally in 2008.

Mastro's 1,000-yard rushers at Nevada included: Taua (2008, 2009, 2010); Luke Lippincott (2007, 2009); B.J. Mitchell (2005); Chance Kretschmer (2001, 2003); and Matt Milton (2002). Five of those running backs also led the WAC in rushing: Taua (2008 and 2010); Lippincott (2007); Mitchell (2005); and Kretschmer (2001).

The success in the Nevada backfield began in Mastro's second season (2001), when he developed Kretschmer, a walk-on redshirt freshman, into the nation's leading rusher. The following year, with Kretschmer out with injury, Mastro guided Milton to 1,000-yard season.

The creation of the Pistol offense by head coach Chris Ault began the latest onslaught by Nevada backs. Beginning with Mitchell in 2005, Nevada has had at least one 1,000-yard rusher and a first-team All-WAC selection in each season since with the exception of 2006. That year, Robert Hubbard came four yards short of the 1.000-yard mark.

Mastro also served as Nevada's recruiting coordinator and oversaw several top recruiting classes. He enjoyed tremendous success recruiting the Bay Area during most of his tenure and had recently been focused on Orange County.

Prior to coaching at Nevada, Mastro was on the staff at Idaho for two years (1998-99). During his tenure in Moscow, he coached the 1998 Big West Player of the Year and Idaho's career rushing leader. Joel Thomas.

Prior to that, Mastro was a linebackers and special teams coach at San Jose State in 1995. He spent one season (1994) as the defensive run game coordinator at Cal Poly San Luis Obispo and was the running backs coach for five years (1989-93) prior to that at his alma mater. His coaching career started at Cal Poly SLO in 1989, while he was completing his undergraduate degree.

Mastro, who earned his Bachelor's degree in Physical Education at Cal Poly in 1994, earned two letters as a running back at Cal Poly (1987-88). During the 1987 season one of Mastro's coaches was Mike Leach, who began his coaching career that year as Cal Poly's offensive line coach. Prior to that, he was a starting running back at San Jose City College (1985-86), earning All-America honorable mention as a sophomore.

Mastro married his wife Terri in 2002. Mastro has one son, Michael.

Clay McGuire begins his second season as offensive line coach at Washington State University and sixth season working on a Mike Leach-coached staff. McGuire played for Leach at Texas Tech then later served four seasons on the Red Raider staff.

Last season McGuire guided an offensive line that saw just two players start all 12 games and a total of seven players take a snap. Junior center Elliott Bosch, the only player to start every game in the same position, earned All-Pac-12 Conference honorable mention honors.

McGuire arrived in Pullman having spent the previous two years as running backs coach and special teams coordinator on Ruffin McNeill's staff at East Carolina. He was initially hired to solely direct the Pirates' rushing game, but added special teams duties prior to the 2010 fall camp.

In addition to guiding Jonathan Williams and Giavanni Ruffin to single-season career-highs in ground and reception totals in 2010, McGuire also provided direct oversight to special teams units which ranked among the Top 35 nationally in punt return average (30th), punt return defense average (31st) and kickoff return defense average (29th).

The Pirates also broke a single-game record which had stood since 1980 under McGuire's watch when ECU racked up 303 kickoff return yards against Southern Miss.

Prior to East Carolina, McGuire enjoyed a total of nine bowl appearances as a player and staff member at his alma mater, Texas Tech. McGuire had spent four seasons on the Texas Tech staff before his move to East Carolina. The 2009 campaign however, marked his first heading the running backs corps - a position he lettered in for four years. His move to the backfield followed service as special teams coordinator in 2008, an offensive graduate assistant in 2007 and a video intern in 2006.

McGuire's three primary running backs, which included two freshmen, all averaged over 5.0 yards a carry in 2009. Junior Baron Batch was Texas Tech's offensive MVP after racking up a team-high 1,279 all-purpose yards and 15 touchdowns.

He assumed the special teams coordinator role early in 2007 on an interim basis, after McNeill moved over to the defensive coordinator position before the fifth game.


McGuire experienced an interesting first season as, midway through, Matt Williams joined the kicking unit after winning an in-game promotion during the Massachusetts game. Williams perfectly hit a 30-yard field goal to win a year's free rent at a local apartment complex, but opted to join the Red Raiders when former head coach Mike Leach summoned the Weatherford, Texas native after the kick and invited him to join the team. Williams proved to be one of the bright spots in McGuire's first season, connecting on all 33 of his PAT attempts.

The special teams units responded to McGuire immediately when he took over in 2007 as Tech opponents averaged a mere 6.7 yards per return. The kickoff coverage unit was also second in the Big 12.

McGuire appeared in 45 games at the H-Back position for the Red Raiders during the course of four seasons from 2000 to 2004. A big, physical player, he was noted for his effectiveness as a blocker in Tech's offense, and also factored into the passing game, catching 32 passes for 320 yards and two touchdowns during his career.

McGuire earned a bachelor's degree in history from Texas Tech in 2004 before following with a master's in secondary education in 2007.

McGuire, 30, is a native of Crane, Texas, where he lettered in both baseball and football at Crane High School. He and his wife, Jeri, are the parents of two children, Jorja and Addison.

Assistant Head Coach
Special Teams Coordinator

Second Season

Eric Russell returned to the Pacific Northwest when he joined Mike Leach's staff as assistant head coach, special teams coordinator at Washington State University prior to the 2012 season.

Last season the Cougars' special teams saw improvement across the board as WSU improved in three of four categories over 2011. The Cougars Kicker Andrew Furney earned second-team All-Pac-12 Conference honors while freshman All-Pac-12 honorable mention kick returner Teondray Caldwell was third in the conference in kickoff return average at 25.0 per game.

Russell, who previously worked on Leach's staff at Texas Tech, had spent the previous two years as tight ends/special teams coach at Tennessee.

Tennessee head coach Derek Dooley welcomed a familiar face when he named Eric Russell to his assistant coaching staff. Russell coached two seasons under Dooley at Louisiana Tech before moving to the Texas Tech staff.

In 2011 the Volunteers ranked in the upper half of the Southeast Conference in three of four special teams categories, ranking fourth in kickoff returns and sixth in both punt returns and kickoff coverage.

During his first season in Knoxville, Russell sparked improvement in UT's special teams units. The kickoff return teams averaged 21.5 yards while allowing only 19.0 yards per return. The Vols also successfully pulled off two fake punts for first downs and a kickoff reverse that sent true freshman Da'Rick Rogers on a 78-yard runback.

The 44-year-old Russell has a reputation as one of the top special teams coaches in the country and was special teams coordinator at Texas Tech in 2009 under Leach. For his efforts, Russell was a nominee for the 2009 Frank Broyles Awards honoring the nation's top assistant coaches.

The St. Maries, Idaho native arrived in Lubbock after two highly successful seasons in the same position at Louisiana Tech under Derek Dooley. In 2008, he helped make the Bulldogs the No. 1-ranked special teams unit in the entire nation in the accumulation of net punting, punt returns, kickoff return defense and kickoff returns. Tech scored five times on special teams in 2008, and during Russell's two seasons the Bulldogs scored via the punt return, kickoff return, blocked field goal return and blocked punt return.

Prior to Texas Tech, Russell spent 13 seasons at North Texas, including five as the special teams coordinator. During his tenure at North Texas, Russell helped lead the program to four consecutive Sun Belt Conference titles and four consecutive appearances in the New Orleans Bowl from 2001-04.

During his tenure, North Texas blocked 14 punts, including seven during the 2003 season. Prior to joining the North Texas staff in 1994, Russell served as a graduate assistant at New Mexico in 1993 and at Idaho in 1991.

An all-state quarterback at St. Marie's High School, Russell was named the Idaho Offensive Player of the Year as a senior before earning all-conference honors at Spokane (Wash.) Falls Community College in 1986-87. He earned his bachelor's degree in public relations from Idaho in 1991.

Russell is married to the former Shannon Cook of Tyler, Texas, and the couple has a son, Hayden, and a daughter, Hadleigh.





JOE SALAVE'A Defensive Line Second Season

Nine-year National Football League veteran Joe Salave'a begins his second season on Mike Leach's Washington State coaching staff as the defensive line coach

Last season Salave'a guided a young group that included only four players who had taken snaps at the Division I level. The youthful line led WSU to its most tacklesfor-loss (92) since the 2003 season and most sacks (35) since 2006. Both figures ranked among the nation's best, finishing eighth in tackles-for-loss and 11th in sacks. Defensive end Xavier Cooper finished the season as one of the top freshmen in the conference, earning All-Pac-12 honorable mention honors.

Salave'a spent the 2011 season at Arizona after returning to his alma mater as a defensive line coach on Mike Stoops' staff in time for December preparations for the 2010 Valero Alamo Bowl.

Salave'a began his coaching career as defensive line coach for Dick Tomey at San Jose State in 2008 and 2009. Tomey served as head coach at Arizona when Salave'a played in Tucson.

Salave'a made an immediate impact in his first coaching venture after a noteworthy pro football career. In 2008, he mentored San Jose State Spartans' tackle Jarron Gilbert, the NCAA leader in tackles for loss and the Chicago Bears' first pick in the 2009 NFL Draft.

Salave'a was drafted in the fourth round by Tennessee in 1998 and spent five seasons with the Titans, one split year with the Baltimore Ravens and San Diego Chargers (2003) and his final three years in the NFL with the Washington Redskins from 2004-06.

He recorded 157 career tackles at Arizona, all as an interior lineman, with 43.5 tackles for loss and 21.5 sacks. He led the team in sacks and tackles for loss in both 1996 and 1997, and in fumbles caused in 1994 and 1996.

Salave'a lettered at Arizona as a defensive tackle from 1994-97, serving as team captain in 1996. He earned honorable mention All-Pacific-10 Conference honors in 1995, second-team honors in 1996 and was a first-team selection in 1997.

Salave'a was recruited by Tomey in 1993 and became one of the mainstays of the Arizona defenses of the mid-1990s at defensive tackle. He was selected team captain and named the team's Most Valuable Player for the 1996 season. Salave'a has the unique distinction of being invited to the East-West Shrine and Hula Bowl All-Star Games after both his third and fourth seasons because he was awarded an additional year of playing eligibility.

His Arizona career was an academic success story as well, capped by NCAA eligibility restoration after he graduated within four years. He enrolled at UA in 1993-94, but was ineligible for football as a partial qualifier, losing the year of eligibility. After his senior year in 1996-97, the NCAA changed its rules in spring 1997, and as a May graduate he was afforded a fourth year of playing eligibility (fifth year in residence), one of the first such student-athletes to benefit under the new rule.

A native of Leone, American Samoa, Salave'a has been one of the territory's foremost football ambassadors promoting the game among Samoan youth, including founding a foundation to help introduce the game and strengthen its appeal.

His NFL career spanned 100 games, 28 as a starter, where he totaled 82 tackles, 7.5 sacks and two forced fumbles.. He was the 107th overall draft selection and a member of the Titans' Super Bowl XXXIV team that lost to St. Louis, 23-16.

He founded the Joe Salave'a Foundation in 2001. The foundation specializes in free football clinics for youngsters in American Samoa and Hawai'i. His work was recognized by Congressman Eni Faleomavaega in a 2005 White House ceremony hosted by President George W. Bush to celebrate Asian-Pacific American Heritage Month.

Salave'a and his wife, Josephine, have a daughter, Katalina Elizabeth, and a son, Joseph Fatuimoana Jr.







Dennis Simmons, who spent 10 seasons at Texas Tech under head coach Mike Leach, returned to a familiar role as Leach's outside wide receivers coach prior to the 2012 season and begins his second year at Washington State University.

In 2012 Cougar receivers posted the second-most receiving yards in school history (3,965). The Cougar offense threw for 330 yards per game, ninth nationally, with four of the top five receivers being underclassmen, including three freshmen.

Prior to WSU, Simmons had served two seasons as East Carolina's outside receivers coach. Simmons' impact on the Pirates' offensive unit quickly became visible through the play of Lance Lewis who, in 2010, became only the third ECU pass-catcher in school history to reach the 1,000-yard milestone. The All-Conference USA performer contributed 89 receptions for 1,116 yards and topped the unit with 14 touchdowns. In 2011 Simmons' coached a pair of receivers, Lewis and Justin Hardy, who ranked among the Top 10 in Conference USA.

At Texas Tech, his wide receivers' coaching appointment in 2008 followed a twoyear stint as Leach's chief of staff from 2005 to 2007.

After accepting the Red Raiders' on-the-field assignment, Simmons stepped into a vital role on the offensive side and inherited the nation's leading receiver and Biletnikoff Award winner Michael Crabtree. Crabtree repeated as Biletnikoff winner under Simmons' watch and was a consensus All-America choice for the second-straight season. Crabtree was drafted No. 10 overall in the 2009 NFL Draft by the San Francisco 49ers.

Simmons' '08 group, led by Crabtree's 97 receptions, 1,165 yards and 19 touchdowns, accounted for 31 of the team's 47 receiving touchdowns. The 31 scores by the wide receivers alone were more than 107 Division I teams' total receiving touchdowns a year earlier.

In 2009, he, along with inside receivers coach Lincoln Riley, transformed walk-on Alex Torres into a Freshman All-America selection after a team-leading 67-catch, 806-yard, six-touchdown performance.

A former three-year starter at BYU, Simmons initially arrived at Texas Tech as the assistant athletics director/quality control for the football program.

Simmons' previous responsibilities included scheduling, coordinating recruiting visits and spearheading the Texas Tech Football Camps. He also handled player personnel issues and ran the Texas Tech Football Outreach Program and community service initiatives. Simmons remained as the staff huddle leader for the Fellowship of Christian Athletes chapter and served as the academic liaison after returning to the field. Additionally, Simmons was involved on campus with President's Select, the Saddle Tramps, Goin' Band from Raiderland and spirit squads when it pertained to recruiting, and also served on the Student-Athlete Opportunity Fund Board.

Simmons came to Texas Tech from Cornell University, where he coached the running backs and was assistant athletics director and chief of staff. Prior to Cornell, he served as an assistant coach at his alma mater, BYU, in 1997, working with the offensive line and special teams.

Simmons graduated from BYU in December 1996 with a bachelor of arts degree in broadcast communications. Twice named to the dean's list, Simmons earned four letters and was a three-year starter at outside linebacker. He helped the Cougars win four-straight Western Athletic Conference titles and was a part of four bowl games, including the Cotton Bowl, Copper Bowl, Holiday Bowl and Aloha Bowl.

A native of Memphis, Tenn., Simmons earned his master's degree in educational leadership in August 1999 from BYU. He served as an NFL Minority Fellowship intern with the Buffalo Bills during the summer of 1999.

Simmons and his wife LaTosha were married in the summer of 2012. He has one daughter, Kendyll.

PAUL VOLERO Outside Linebackers Second Season

Paul Volero begins his second season at WSU after joining Mike Leach's staff in January, 2012. Volero will work with the outside linebackers.

Last season Volero worked with senior All-Pac-12 honorable mention honoree Travis Long, who led the team in sacks (9.5) and tackles-for-loss (13), while also mentoring young players Logan Mayes and Kache Palacio.

Prior to WSU, Volero spent two years in Key West, Fla., where he was the defensive coordinator at Key West High School. Prior to that he spent three seasons as a member of the Central Michigan University coaching staff (2007-09). He joined the staff as the defensive line coach in 2007 and in 2009 served as special teams coordinator while continuing to work with the defensive tackles.

Volero coached the entire defensive line during his first two seasons at CMU. In 2008, CMU's defensive linemen combined for 32 sacks, more than the team total of every other program in the Mid-American Conference and the third-most of any defensive line in the country. Three defensive linemen earned All-MAC accolades under Volero's watch.

Frank Zombo, who also earned academic all-conference and academic all-district honors, was an All-MAC first team selection after leading the conference in tackles for loss (15.5) and ranking second in sacks (nine) in 2008. Volero also worked directly with All-MAC third team selections Sean Murnane (2008) and Steven Friend (2007)

Antonio Brown was named Mid-American Conference Special Teams Player of the Year in 2009, while Murnane was an All-MAC third team selection for the second straight season.

Volero spent the 2004-06 seasons as the special teams quality control coach and academic graduate assistant at West Virginia. He was a part of the staff that led the Mountaineers to Big East Conference championships in 2004 and 2005 and victories in the Sugar Bowl and Gator Bowl during his final two seasons.

In his role at WVU, Volero assisted with special teams breakdown and scheme implementation, along with monitoring the Mountaineers' production on special teams.

Volero began his coaching career at Glenville State College in West Virginia, coaching the defensive line during the 1996 season. Volero helped Glenville State to an NAIA national runner-up finish as a player in 1993.

Volero then served as the defensive coordinator at Miami Senior High School, North Miami Senior High School and Booker T. Washington High School in Florida from 1997-2002 before moving to the University of South Florida in 2003. He spent one season as the assistant strength coach and working with the defensive linemen at USF before assuming his post at West Virginia.

Volero played collegiately at both Arizona Western College and Glenville State. He earned his bachelor's degree from Nova Southeastern University in 2004 and his master's from West Virginia in 2006.

Volero and his wife, Nersa, have two children, son Henry and daughter Amy.

Wilson joins Washington State after spending the past 23 years at the University of Nevada, 19 on the Wolf Pack coaching staff, including the last five seasons as the associate head coach/linebackers coach. Wilson has worked six seasons with linebackers, one with safeties, one with defensive ends and a total of three seasons as the defensive coordinator.

Wilson, who worked with current Cougars running backs coach Jim Mastro for seven seasons at Nevada, helped the Wolf Pack appear in 11 bowl games and claim nine conference championships during his 13 seasons on the sidelines.

Wilson has seen 16 of his former players sign professional contracts including six linebackers who were under NFL contract in 2012. Wilson mentored first team All-WAC selection Dontay Moch, who was taken by the Cincinnati Bengals with the 66th overall pick in the 2011 NFL Draft. He put another defensive end into the NFL after the 2011 season as Kaelin Burnett signed with the Oakland Raiders.

In 2009, Wilson headed up the linebacking corps and oversaw the development of a youthful group that included second-team All-WAC selection James-Michael Johnson in 2009. He also coached current NFL linebacker Joshua Mauga (New York Jets) and former New York Giant and St. Louis Ram, Jerome Johnson. During the 2007 season, Wilson served as the defensive coordinator and was also the safeties coach. Nevada's starting safeties, Uche Anyanwu and Justin Jackson, combined for 144 tackles. Overall, the defense was fourth in pass defense and fifth in total defense.

Prior to that, Wilson headed up the Pack's inside linebacking corps while also serving as the team's assistant head coach. In 2006, two of Wilson's pupils - Jason DeMars and Joshua Mauga - finished second and third on the team in tackles, tallying over 110 tackles combined.

Prior to going back to coaching when Ault took over the program in December 2003, Wilson had served as an assistant athletics director/sports services at Nevada the previous four and half years. He oversaw football, men's basketball, baseball, track and tennis while coordinating grant-in-aid for all student-athletes in Nevada's 19-sport athletics program.

Wilson spent six seasons working with Ault from 1989-92 and 1994-95. He was also an assistant coach for Jeff Horton in 1993 and Jeff Tisdel from 1996-98, spending those final three seasons as defensive coordinator. As the nation's youngest Division I defensive coordinator, he directed the 1996 defense to the top of the conference in every defensive category and was part of the Las Vegas Bowl victory over Ball State.

The North Central (III.) graduate (1986) has coached six players who signed professional contracts, three of them in the NFL, including Nevada's all-time tackles leader, DeShone Myles, as well as Mike Crawford and Steve Bryant. Two of his pupils - Mylwa and Matt Clafton - were named to Nevada's All-Century team at linebacker.

Wilson has coached defensive line, linebackers and secondary during his career, which also included stints at his alma mater (1986) and at New Mexico (1987-88).

Wilson and his wife, Heather, have a son, Tyler, and a daughter, Baylie.







David Yost begins his first season as the Cougars' inside receivers coach after joining Washington State in January, 2013.

Yost brings a wealth of experience to the position, having spent the past 12 years with Head Coach Gary Pinkel at the University of Missouri. He began in 2001 as the quarterbacks coach and recruiting coordinator, and added the duties of offensive coordinator in 2009. Since 2011 he also held the title of assistant head coach.

While at Missouri Yost coached three of the top quarterbacks in school history, and are currently in the National Football League, in Brad Smith (Buffalo Bills), Chase Daniel (New Orleans Saints) and Blaine Gabbert (Jacksonville Jaguars). The trio earned 12 different all-conference honors between them, and Daniel emerged on the national stage in 2007 when he was a Heisman Trophy finalist, eventually finishing fourth in the voting. Smith became the first quarterback in NCAA FBS history to throw for 8,000 yards and rush for 4,000 yards in a career. Gabbert followed Daniel and became an eventual first-round NFL Draft pick.

In 2011, Yost guided the Tigers offense to a Big 12 Conference rushing title and finished the season ranked ninth nationally after averaging 244.0 yards per game. Missouri was one of only two schools in the country to average at least 230 yards rushing and passing on the year.

Yost assumed the added role of offensive coordinator prior to the 2009 and oversaw a Tiger offense that ranked No. 14 in the nation in passing at 285.4 yards per game. The Tigers followed that season with a 10-win campaign in 2010, finishing No. 35 nationally in yards per game (409.62).

Yost was instrumental in the development of MU's renowned spread attack. The Tigers broke numerous offensive school records in 2008, putting together only the third 10-win season in school history. The Tigers established records for points (591), points per game (42.2) and passing yards (4,625).

Yost is considered one of the top quarterback coaches in the nation, based on his work in helping develop Gabbert, Daniel, and his predecessor Smith. Daniel had an amazing three-year run as a starter come to a close in 2008, and he left holding virtually every major passing and total offense record on the books. The 22 wins amassed over the 2007 and 2008 seasons ranked third nationally during that stretch, trailing only Oklahoma and USC.

During the early stages of Yost's tenure, he helped Smith to become the first player in NCAA D-IA history to reach the 2,000/1,000 mark twice in a career, accomplishing the feat in 2002 and 2005.


From 1997 to 2000, Yost held the same responsibilities for Pinkel at Toledo. He spent four seasons coaching two of the most productive quarterbacks in Toledo history in Tavares Bolden and Chris Wallace. Yost came to Toledo from Tiffin University, where he coordinated the offense along with coaching quarterbacks and receivers in 1995. During the 1994 season, he coached wide receivers.

A native of Carrollton, Ohio, Yost spent time coaching his former high school team after graduating from Kent State University. A graduate of Kent State, Yost earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in early childhood education in 1992.

Yost and his wife, Carrie have three children; daughter, Kennedy and sons, Keaton and Kamden.

When Mike Leach was named head coach at Washington State University, he wasted no time in naming David Emerick as his chief of staff, a position similar to what Emerick held while he and Leach were at Texas Tech.

Emerick, in his second year at Washington State, has taken on additional responsibilities since joining the Cougar staff and was recently promoted to Senior Associate Director of Athletics/Chief of Staff for football.

Emerick is no stranger to the Pac-12 Conference, having spent the 2010-11 seasons at the University of Arizona, where he oversaw Arizona's recruiting efforts as assistant director of operations and director of oncampus recruiting. In 2010 the Wildcats reached the Alamo Bowl against Oklahoma State.

Emerick joined the Arizona football staff in February 2010 after six years working with Leach as a member of the Texas Tech Red Raider staff. During his final two years in Lubbock he was chief of staff and assistant athletics director. There he oversaw the entire recruiting process for the football program and assisted in the organization and execution of football camps.

Additionally, Emerick served as the liaison between the football program and the Texas Tech overall department, specifically in academics, compliance, media relations and marketing areas.

Emerick began his Texas Tech stint in 2004 as he served as unit coordinator during his first season and Director of Player Personnel his next three seasons, before assuming the chief of staff position.

A 2002 political science graduate of the University of Kentucky, Emerick was a college scouting intern with the Houston Texans during the franchise's first season in 2002. Prior to his stint with the Texans, Emerick was the recruiting and football operations intern at Kentucky while in school during the 1997 through 2001 seasons. As such he was part of the 1998 Outback Bowl and 1999 Music City Bowl appearances by the Wildcats.

Emerick is a graduate of Catholic Memorial High School in his hometown of Waukesha, Wis., and lettered in football, basketball and baseball. He received his master's degree in interdisciplinary studies with an emphasis in sport management in May of 2007 from Texas Tech.

He and his wife, Sara, have one son, Cristian.



Antonio Huffman begins his second season as director of football operations at Washington State University, joining Mike Leach's staff in January, 2012.

Huffman arrived in Pullman following two seasons at East Carolina University, where he served in a similar role on Ruffin McNeill's staff.

Prior to his appointment at ECU, Huffman served as director of player personnel for two seasons at his alma mater Texas Tech, where he was the chief liaison officer between the football program and the athletics department's NCAA compliance division. He also held the title of Tech's assistant recruiting coordinator, setting up and executing official and unofficial prospect visits, campus tours and summer camps.

In addition to managing the Red Raiders' eligibility and procedural matters, Huffman also handled housing responsibilities and worked closely with players in academic and community relations activities that prompted the founding of the popular "Huff's Huggables" charity drive. He gained added experience assisting with NFL scouting, team travel and logistical elements of bowl game operations.

Huffman was also charged with providing oversight of Texas Tech's new Football Training Facility (FTF) in 2009. He supervised both the presentation of the building as well as the maintenance of aesthetics that enabled the FTF to rank as one of the premier training facilities nationally.

A three-year starter as a defensive back for the Red Raiders, Huffman completed his career with 189 tackles, four interceptions and 25 pass breakups. In his final collegiate contest, he was named Defensive MVP of the 2006 Insight Bowl after a game-changing interception helped Texas Tech to a 44-41 overtime victory over Minnesota that completed an improbable comeback.

Huffman played one season for the Lubbock Renegades (AFL2) in 2007 before accepting a sales position at Chrysler Motors LLC and then rejoining the Big 12 Conference member a year later.

During his academic tenure at Tech, Huffman earned selection to prestigious honors such as the John Wooden Leadership Cup (2007), NCAA Leadership Conference (2006), Draddy Award (semifinalist in 2006), President and Dean's List (2005-06). He graduated in 2006 with a bachelor's degree in human development and family studies and is currently working on completing a master's degree in sociology.

Before enrolling at TTU, he attended Garden City (Kan.) Community College in 2001-2003 where he was a member of Phi Theta Kappa National Honor Society and elected freshman class president.

A highly-recruited athlete out of Lovejoy (Ga.) High School, Huffman also was active in the school's ROTC program as group commander in 1999, 2000 and 2001.

Huffman is married to the former Shelley Bartley of Lubbock, Texas, and they are the parents of a son, Aeson Deon, and daughter, Aniyah Jordan.



Jason Loscalzo begins his second season as the Cougars head strength and conditioning coach after spending the previous five seasons working in the same capacity at Boston College. At WSU, Loscalzo is responsible for all aspects involved in the development, coordination, implementation and supervision of the strength and conditioning programs for the Cougar football team.

Loscalzo served as the director of strength and conditioning for football at BC from January 2007 – January 2012. Loscalzo helped the Eagles claim back-to-back ACC Atlantic Division titles in 2007-08, a win at the 2007 Champs Sports Bowl, and trips to the Music City Bowl in 2008, the Emerald Bowl in 2009 and the Kraft Fight Hunger Bowl in 2010.

The Cool, Calif. native spent four seasons as the top assistant strength and conditioning coach and director of sports nutrition for the Auburn University football team. He also served as the head strength and conditioning coach for baseball and softball. Loscalzo helped the football team to four straight bowl games including a Nokia Sugar Bowl win and No. 2 final season ranking in 2005.

Prior to Auburn, Loscalzo served as the assistant strength and conditioning coach and sports nutrition professional consultant at Marshall University from August 2001-May 2003, helping the Thundering Herd to consecutive GMAC Bowl titles in 2001-02. He was an assistant strength and conditioning coach and athletic sports nutritionist at the University of Nevada, Reno from August 1999-August 2001. Loscalzo was a graduate assistant strength and conditioning coach at University of Arkansas from May 1999-August 1999 and began his career as a strength and conditioning student assistant at Humboldt State University from January 1996-May 1999.

Loscalzo, a fullback for Sierra College and Humboldt State, received his bachelor's degree in kinesiology in 1999, and master's in athletic administration from Nevada in 2001. Loscalzo has been certified by CSCS, SCCC, SPN and USAW Level I.



Casey Kramer begins his second year as the assistant football strength and conditioning coach after previously working as a military tactical strength and conditioning specialist for the U.S. Army and as the assistant strength and conditioning coach at Boston College.

Kramer spent the previous two years in Fort Carson, Colo. with the U.S. Army, designing and implementing a multi-faceted performance training program for elite special forces soldiers. He also developed a year-round periodized program for soldiers that could be done regardless of location.

Prior to the U.S. Army, Kramer worked at Boston College for three years, assisting with the design and administration of strength training and conditioning workouts for football under the direction of current WSU Head Strength and Conditioning Coach Jason Loscalzo.

Jarrail Jackson begins his second season at Washington State and his first as the Director of Player Relations, assisting with recruiting and operations after spending the previous six seasons working with the wide receivers at Dartmouth University where coached two different second team All-Ivy League selections.

Jackson was a wide receiver and punt returner at the University of Oklahoma from 1996-99, earning All-Big 12 Conference honors at both positions. As a senior, playing under offensive coordinator Mike Leach, he had 54 receptions for 659 yards and seven scores. He set eight receiving and return school records, left OU second in career all-purpose yards and first in punt return yards (1,238) and caught an Independence Bowl record 10 passes against Ole Miss in 1999. Jackson also played centerfield for the Sooners baseball team.

From 2000-02, the Houston native was a member of the practice squad for the Buffalo Bills. Additionally, he spent six seasons playing the ArenaFootball2 League.

Jackson's coaching career began in 2004 at Chichasha High School in Oklahoma before moving on to University of Central Oklahoma where he served as a volunteer assistant coach in 2005.

A native of Sacramento, Lose was a three-year letterwinner at Oregon State University appearing as an offensive and defensive lineman 2000, 02-03.






Mike Bethea joined the Cougars coaching staff as a defensive graduate assistant in January, 2013.




Chris Keagle begins his second season working with special teams as a Cougars graduate assistant.



PROVO, Utah — Riley Nelson threw for two touchdowns and third-string quarterback Taysom Hill added another on his first collegiate pass as Brigham Young beat Washington State 30-6 on Thursday night to spoil Mike Leach's return to coaching. Washington State finished with 224 yards total offense. Washington State came out passing as expected, with Tuel starting 8 of 9. But his 10th pass was intercepted by Uona Kaveinga, and the momentum shifted to BYU before a "white-out" crowd. It was Leach's coaching debut for WSU, coaching against his alma mater. Leach never played football at BYU, but he gained inspiration for his spread passing attack from LaVell Edwards, for whom BYU's stadium is named. At one point in pre-game interviews, Leach said his team looked more like BYU of old than BYU. The BYU Cougars rolled up 426 yards offense, nearly twice that of Washington State. Andrew Furney's 47-yard field goal put Washington State on the board with 10:42 left in the second quarter and he added a 41-yarder just before halftime after a TD pass to Marquess Wilson was nullified by holding. BYU found one way to keep Leach's offense off the field - long drives. BYU's three first-half scoring drives were all 10 plays or longer, the third going for 16 and capped by Riley Stephenson's 28-yard field goal. BYU's defense, meanwhile, played up to its billing, holding Washington State to just 3 yards rushing in the first half, and limiting Tuel to 108 yards passing.

EASTERN WASHINGTON AT WASHINGTON STATE

PULLMAN, Wash. – Jeff Tuel threw a pair of touchdown passes to Isiah Myers as Washington State hung on to beat Eastern Washington 24-20 on Saturday in the home debut of Cougars coach Mike Leach. Washington State (1-1), which lost at BYU in the season opener, also unveiled a \$65 million upgrade of Martin Stadium in front of the first sellout crowd here since 2007. Eastern Washington (1-1), an FCS power coming off a victory over Idaho of the FBS, kept it close behind a pair of touchdown receptions by Brandon Kaufman. This was the first meeting since 1908 between the two programs, located 60 miles apart. Washington State scored first when Tuel connected with Myers in the back of the end zone on a 2-yard scoring pass with 5:42 left in the first quarter. Eastern replied on the next series when quarterback Kyle Padron hit Kaufman with a 93-yard touchdown pass to tie the score. But Washington State drove 75 yards on its next series, with Carl Winston rushing over from the 1 to take a 14-7 lead. Winston's 27-yard run was the key play of the drive. Eastern Washington drove 80 yards on its next series, half coming on a reception by Zack Gehring, before Jordan Talley ran over from the 5 to tie the score at 14 early in the second quarter. Washington State's Cyrus Coen intercepted a scrambling Padron and ran the ball down to Eastern's 17. On the first play, Tuel passed 17 yards to Myers for a touchdown that put WSU up 21-14. A 60-yard field goal by WSU's Andrew Furney as time expired gave the Cougars a 24-14 halftime lead. It was the second longest field goal in team history after Jason Hanson's 62-yarder against UNLV in 1991. The Eagles went on a penalty-filled 99-yard drive late in the fourth quarter that ended with a 17-yard touchdown pass from Padron to Kaufman. The extra point was blocked to leave WSU with a 24-20 lead with 2:17 remaining. Washington State recovered the onside kick, had two touchdown plays called back because of penalties, and had to punt. Eastern got a last chance with 1:29 left from its 17, but could

LAS VEGAS — Backup quarterback Connor Halliday threw four first-half touchdown passes to help Washington State beat UNLV 35-27. Halliday completed 26 of 45 passes for 378 yards and Isiah Myers on first-half scoring strikes. Halliday completed 26 of 45 passes for 378 yards and had two interceptions. Washington State (2-1) held off UNLV (0-3) after the Rebels regained possession with 40 seconds left in the game. UNLV was unable to advance past the Washington State 42. Marks led the Cougars with six catches for 126 yards, and Wilson had five receptions for 110 yards. Nick Sherry completed 33 of 49 passes for 351 yards and three touchdowns for UNLV. Washington State took a 7-0 lead when Halliday threw a 4-yard touchdown pass to Wilson with 8:17 left in the first quarter. The eight-play, 70-yard drive was highlighted by a 47-yard pass from Halliday to Marks that put the ball on UNLV's 4-yard line. The Cougars increased their lead to 14-0 with 4:25 left in the first quarter, when Myers caught an 18-yard TD pass from Sherry with 2:36 remaining in the first quarter. The second quarter featured three long TDs. Marks caught 52-yard pass that made it 21-7. After a field goal made it a 11-point game, Wilson caught an 81-yard TD pass with 5:27 left in the period. Just 13 seconds later, Sullivan caught his second TD pass from Sherry + this one for 75 yards - to cut the Cougars' lead to 28-17. COLORADO AT WASHINGTON STATE

PULLMAN, Wash. — Jordan Webb scored on a 4-yard run in the final seconds, the last of three Colorado touchdowns in the final 7 minutes, to beat Washington State 35-34 on Saturday in the Pactor 2 Conference opener for both teams. Connor Halliday threw four touchdown passes for Washington State (2-2), which was looking for its first three-game winning streak since 2006. Washington State was ahead 34-28 when Colorado took over on its 30 and marched to the WSU 4. On fourth down, Webb bootlegged up the middle for a touchdown to tie the score. Will Oliver's extra point gave Colorado its first lead, 35-34, with 9 seconds left. The game was played in air thick with smoke from wildfires 200 miles away in central Washington. Washington State was coming off wins over Eastern Washington and UNLV. Washington State scored on its first possession, when a scrambling Halliday hit Gabe Marks in the end zone with a 32-yard pass for a 7-0 lead. Colorado replied with a crisp 75-yard drive that ended when Webb connected with Nelson Spruce on a 16-yard touchdown to tie the score. Webb completed all five of his passes on the drive. Halliday was intercepted near the Colorado goal line by Jered Bell on WSU's next possession. Colorado's drive stalled at WSU's 13 and Will Oliver missed the 30-yard field goal attempt. Marquess Wilson caught a 23-yard scoring pass from Halliday as WSU took a 14-7 lead early in the second quarter. Colorado fumbled the ball away at its own 39 on its next possession. Halliday's 15-yard touchdown pass to Isiah Myers put WSU ahead 21-7 with 11:48 left in the first half. The drive was kept alive when Halliday hit Myers on fourth-and-8 for an 11-yard gain. In the third, Carl Winston fumbled deep in WSU territory on the Cougars' first possession, and Terrel Smith picked the ball up on the 10 and ran it down to the 1. Webb ran the ball over on the next play as Colorado closed to within 21-14. Furney missed a 53-yard field goal attempt for WSU on their next series, and Halliday threw a short pass to Wilson, who turne

2012 GAME RECAPS

SEATTLE — No. 2 Oregon used a third-quarter scoring blitz to shake Washington State for a 51-26 win on Saturday night. Playing for the first time outside the Eugene city limits, the Ducks (5-0, 2-0 Pac-12) looked shaky at times in the first half and led just 23-19 at the break, but put together a nearly flawless third quarter to run away from the Cougars. Thomas capped an 18-play drive to start the half with a 4-yard TD, then Patterson stepped in front of Connor Halliday's pass for Oregon's third interception return for a TD in two games. After Washington State (2-3, 0-2) went three-and-out, Barner scored on a 10-yard nuc cap the 21-point spurt in just over 4 minutes. Barner finished with four total touchdowns, including scoring runs of 22 yards in the first quarter and an 80-yarder in the fourth to go along with a 30-yard touchdown reception in the first half. His 195 yards rushing was the second-best rushing game of his career behind the 201 yards he had against Fresno State earlier this season. The Ducks started the second-half with their longest scoring drive - by plays - of the season, a methodical 18-play march that ate up more than 6 minutes. They ran nine times and threw nine times on the drive and only three times faced third down. The last came from the Cougars 4 when Barner went in motion and the middle opened for quarterback Marcus Mariota to hand off to Thomas, who plowed in for his fifth rushing TD of the season. Before Washington State got a chance to answer, Patterson was stepping in front of a pass intended for Gabe Marks and racing untouched the other direction for a score. Patterson joined Ifo Ekpre-Olomu and Troy Hill with returning interceptions for touchdowns this season. After another three-and-out by the Cougars and a short punt, Oregon needed just seven plays for Barner to find the end zone for the third time and a 44-19 lead. Barner put a cap on his night and an explosive second half when he escaped a pileup near the Oregon sideline and skirted free to run 80 yards early in the fourth

CORVALLIS, Ore. — Jordan Poyer had three interceptions, Sean Mannion passed for 270 yards and No. 14 Oregon State survived a shaky start with a 19-6 win over Washington State. Markus Wheaton had 95 yards receiving and a touchdown but it was the Beavers defense which kept the Cougars at arm's length on the day when Mannion, who threw three interceptions, was more down than up. Jeff Tuel was 11 of 17 for 126 yards after replacing Connor Halliday, who threw three interceptions in just over one half of action. Marquess Wilson had four catches for 54 yards to lead the Cougars (2-4, 0-3). Halliday was 9-for-20 passing. Turnovers kept the Cougars from gaining a foothold as they continue to implement new coach Mike Leach's pass-happy offense. Oregon State kept both Halliday and Tuel on the run, forcing four interceptions and a fumble. Defensive end Scott Cricthon tallied three sacks. Mannion was named Pac-12 offensive player of the week after throwing for 433 yards last week in a 38-35 win over Arizona, but he was not sharp to start the game, throwing two interceptions early. The Beavers had another promising drive stopped when they failed to convert a fourth-and-2 at the Washington State 24. The Beavers had to settle for Trevor Romaine's two field goals and a 6-3 half-time lead. Mannion showed more poise in the second half. He marched the Beavers down the field for a 75-yard scoring drive to start the third quarter, hitting Wheaton for a 12-yard touchdown pass. In the fourth, he generated an efficient time-consuming 86-yard drive that Tyler Anderson capped with a one-yard run. Helped out by two 15-yard Oregon State penalties, Tuel completed 5 of 7 passes on a drive early in the fourth, but the drive ended in an Andrew Furney 32-yard field as Wazzu never did get in the end zone. Furney also connected from 24 yards in the second quarter.

PULLMAN, Wash. - Quarterback Zach Maynard threw for a touchdown and ran for another as California beat Washington State 31-17. C.J. Anderson rushed for two touchdowns as the Golden Bears (3-4, 2-2 Pac-12) earned their eighth straight win over the Cougars. The Bears scored first, after Michael Lowe's interception gave Cal the ball on its own 25. On the third play, Maynard connected with his brother, Keenan Allen, on a short pass that turned into a 69-yard touchdown reception and a 7-0 Bears lead late in the first quarter. On its next possession, Cal drove to WSU's 10 before Maynard was intercepted by Anthony Carpenter. Jeff Tuel, who replaced Connor Halliday at quarterback after Halliday was intercepted twice, then led WSU 86 yards to the 3. But two incomplete passes and a short run made them settle for Andrew Furney's 20-yard field goal to cut Cal's lead to 7-3 in the sec-ond quarter. Cal responded with a 75-yard drive, and Anderson ran over from the 4 to give the Bears a 14-3 lead that they held at the end of the first half. WSU receiver Marquess Wilson, who caught four passes for 87 yards in the first half, was injured late in the half and did not return. Cal marched 71 yards on the opening drive of the second half, with Maynard running over from the 1-yard line for a 21-3 lead. Washington State came back with a 75-yard drive, with Tuel passing 8 yards to Brett Bartolone for a touchdown to narrow Cal's lead to 21-10 with 6:42 left in the third. That broke a string of six quarters in which WSU had not scored a touchdown. Vincenzo D'Amato hit a 52-yard field goal to lift Cal to a 24-10 lead with 2:02 left in the third. Furney missed a 43-yarder for WSU early in the fourth quarter. Anderson added a 29-yard touchdown run for a 31-10 lead. Bartolone caught a touchdown pass from Tuel midway through the fourth quarter to complete the scoring.

WASHINGTON STATE AT NO. 19 STANFORD

STANFORD, Calif. - Jeff Tuel threw for 401 yards and two touchdowns, but No. 19 Stanford (6-2, 4-1) STANFORD, Calif. – Jell Tuer threw for 401 yards and two touchdowns, but No. 19 Stanford (6-2, 4-1) sacked Tuel 10 times - including on the game's final play - to overcome a sloppy offensive effort in a 24-17 victory over Washington State (2-6, 0-5) on Saturday. If not for its defense, Stanford's Pac-12 North Division hopes might be dashed. Tuel led a 12-play, 75-yard drive capped by a 10-yard touchdown pass to Kristoff Williams with 6:29 to play to bring Washington State within a touchdown. Stanford managed two first downs before punting the ball back to Washington State. Marquess Wilson made a leaping 42-yard catch to give the Cougars the ball at the Stanford 23. And on fourth-and-21, Bobby Ratliffe caught a 25-yard pass from Tuel at the Stanford 9. Then Usua Amanam pressured Tuel as the quarterback threw the ball into the ground for a 15-yard intentional grounding penalty and an automatic 10-second runoff. With Washington State looking for one final heave to the end zone, Henry Anderson planted Tuel into the ground for a final sack as time expired. Tuel threw for 401 yards and two touchdowns. He completed 43 of 60 passes - mostly short outs that Stanford allowed - but needed one more. Then again, both teams had few offensive highlights in this one. Tuel hit Dominique Williams for a 43-yard completion, then went to him again when he floated a 3-yard TD pass to the corner of the end zone that put the Cougars ahead 7-3 midway through the second quarter. The lead for Washington State this season didn't last long. Just 47 seconds later, Nunes found Jamal-Rashad Patterson on a broken play with the cornerback blitzing and no safety help over the top. Patterson caught the short pass and sprinted down the sideline for a 70-yard touchdown that put Stanford back in front 10-7 on its longest play of the season. Gabe Marks caught seven passes for 52 yards for Washington State before getting sandwiched by two defenders in the second quarter and limping off the field. The Cougars patiently dinked-and-dunked the ball down field to set up Andrew Furney's tying 24-yard field goal on the final play of the first half. The momentum never carried over. Stanford took advantage of a pass interference call on Anthony Carpenter that extended the opening drive of the third quarter. Hewitt bulldozed through the line for a 1-yard TD run - the fullback's first of the season - on third down to give the Cardinal a 17-10 lead, the only drive all game they looked in rhythm. Reynolds intercepted Tuel's pass and returned it for a score to put Stanford ahead 24-10 with 10:43 remaining. With the offense struggling to control the clock, Washington State made one final charge until the Cardinal defense again flexed its muscles.

SALT LAKE CITY — Reggie Dunn returned a kickoff 100 yards for the third time in two weeks and John White rushed for 101 yards and two touchdowns as Utah defeated Washington State 49-6 Saturday. The loss was the sixth straight for Washington State (2-7, 0-6 Pac-12), assuring coach Mike Leach of his first losing season. Utah freshman Travis Wilson completed 17 of 21 passes for 171 yards, with two touchdowns and an interception. Washington State's Jeff Tuel was 23 of 45 for 232 yards, with a 5-yard TD pass to Kristoff Williams on the game's final play. Tuel was intercepted, fumbled and sacked six times. Tuel, who set a school passing mark with 43 completions last week as Washington State took it down to the wire against nationally ranked Stanford, completed three of his first five passes for 41 yards Saturday, but was just 1 of 9 for 6 yards the rest of the quarter. Leach pulled Tuel in the third quarter and inserted Connor Halliday, but Tuel finished the game, engineering the late TD drive to avoid a shutout. Utah held a 453-255 advantage in total yards, limiting the nation's 120th-ranked rushing attack to minus-4 yards. Marquess Wilson entered the game with 184 career receptions and needed 12 to set the school record of 195. He finished with five catches for 73 yards.

The Bruins' defense blocked two WSU field goal attempts, returning one for a touchdown. They also returned a fumble for a score and knocked WSU quarterback Jeff Tuel out of the game. Washington State took the opening kickoff and drove to the UCLA 23, where the drive stalled. Andrew Furney's field goal attempt was blocked by Datone Jones, and the ball was picked up by UCLA's Sheldon Price, who ran it back 68 yards for a touchdown. On the next drive, the Cougars got to the 1-yard line before a penalty pushed them back to the 16. Furney's 33-yard field goal attempt was blocked by Cassius Marsh. Washington State finally scored on its third deep drive of the first quarter, when Halliday hit Dominique Williams with a 6-yard touchdown pass to tie the score at 7-7. Halliday had just gone into the game in place of injured starter Tuel. Washington State outgained UCLA 167 yards to 22 yards in the first quarter. But it was all UCLA in the second quarter. The Bruins took a 14-7 lead on Hundley's 16-yard scoring pass to Johnathan Franklin. Teondray Caldwell fumbled on the ensuing kickoff return, and UCLA took possession on the WSU 24. Joseph Fauria caught a 9-yard pass from Hundley to give UCLA a 21-7 lead. Halliday was sacked in the end zone, with the safety giving UCLA a 23-7 lead. The Bruins also got the ball back, and scored on Hundley's 10-yard pass to Devin Fuller for a 30-7 lead with 6:40 left in the first half. Halliday fumbled after a hit from Marsh and the ball was picked up by UCLA's Eric Kendricks, who ran 40 yards for a touc

WASHINGTON AT WASHINGTON STATE

PULLMAN, Wash. - Andrew Furney kicked a 27-yard field goal on Washington State's first possession of overtime, and the Cougars overcame an 18-point deficit in the fourth quarter to stun rival Washington 31-28 in the Apple Cup, snapping an eight-game losing streak. Washington quarterback Keith Price threw an interception on the first play of overtime that defensive lineman Kalafitoni Pole nearly returned for a game-ending touchdown, but he was caught at the 5. The Cougars (3-9, 1-8 Pac-12) took possession and, after picking up a first down, Furney kicked a 27-yard field goal, leading to a crush of crimson and gray fans storming and celebrating at midfield. Washington (7-5, 5-4) had a chance to win on the final play of regulation, but Travis Coons' 35-yard field goal attempt at the same end of the stadium was wide right after a bad snap. In a rivalry known for unpredictability, the 2012 version will rank among the tops in Apple Cup lore. Washington led 28-10 after Bishop Sankey's second touchdown run late in the third quarter, but the Huskies wilted under a siege of self-inflicted mistakes with turnovers and penalties coming back in favor of the Cougars. Carl Winston ran for three touchdowns for Washington State, matching the Cougars entire season total of touchdowns rushing entering Friday's game. His third TD with 7:26 left, combined with Jeff Tuel's 2-point conversion pass to Brett Bartolone pulled the Cougars within 28-25. Washington was then forced to punt with 5:25 left after Price was forced to throw it away on third down. Tuel hit Gino Simone for 18 yards, his first catch of the game, to get into Washington territory and later a 9-yard reception to get inside the Huskies 30. The Cougars stalled after missing on third-and-1, but Furney connected on a 45-yard field goal to pull the Cougars even at 28-28 with 1:59 left. Washington started at its 25 with all three timeouts. Price scrambled for a 7-yard run, and the Huskies were aided by a 15-yard personal foul call against Casey Locker moving the ball to the 47. Price hit Austin Seferian-Jenkins for 7 yards into Cougars' territory and found DiAndre Campbell for consecutive 11-yard throws to get to the Washington State 24 with 59 seconds left. Sankey then carried twice to the 15, forcing Washington State to use its final timeout with 47 seconds left and the Huskies facing a third-and-1. Washington's school record-tying 18th penalty backed them up, and Sankey came up short on third down. Washington coach Steve Sarkisian ran the clock down to 5 seconds before calling timeout. Coons was 3 of 4 inside 40 yards this year, but the snap back to holder Cody Bruns was low and the timing was off. Washington State elected to go on defense first in overtime. Price was pressured by Logan Mayes on the first play of the extra session and he tried to throw for Sankey, but the pass landed in the arms of Pole. The big defensive lineman tried to end the game with the interception return, but was caught at the 5 by Bruns. Because Pole didn't score, Washington State took possession at the 25 and on third-and-4, Tuel found Bartolone for 10 yards to the 9 and Mike Leach decided to end it there. Furney lined up and the kick was true, giving the Cougars their first win over their rivals since 2008. Tuel finished 33 of 53 for 350 yards and two interceptions. The Cougars made plenty of mistakes, especially during Washington's 21-point third quarter, but showed resolve in the fourth quarter that was absent for most of Leach's miserable first season as coach at Washington State. Price was 20 of 34 for 194 yards and two touchdowns, but also committed two costly turnovers. He had a fumble in the fourth quarter that led to Winston's third TD run. Sankey rushed 84 yards, seeing his streak of 100-yard rushing games snapped at three, but had two touchdowns bringing his season total to 15. Washington saw its four-game win streak snapped and failed in its shot at its first 8-win season since 2001.







WSU 14, BROWN 0

A crowd of 10,000 was on hand at the Pasadena Rose Bowl January 1 to watch as undefeated Washington State took on eastern power Brown University in the first of the continuous Rose Bowls. WSU used third and fourth quarter touchdown runs by Ralph Boone and Carl Dietz to shutout the Bruins 14-0. Brown entered the game a two-to-one favorite, despite a modest 5-3-1 record. The Bruins' 3-0 win over Yale was the key accomplishment that earned the Rhode Island team an invitation to play in the Rose Bowl. A cold spell, followed by a heavy rain and some snow for three days prior to the game, turned the

playing field into a sea of mud that slowed both teams. Brown came close to scoring twice

in the first half, but each time Washington State's defense, which had allowed just one field goal and one touchdown all season, rose to the task and halted the Bruins short of the goal line, once at the four yard line. Bruin star Fritz Pollard gained just 47 yards in 13 carries. Pollard later became the first black named to a Walter Camp All-America team and was the first black head coach in the National Football League. In the second half WSU's size advantage began to pay off as the Cougars took command, scoring once in each quarter. WSU's preparation for the game had been, to say the least, odd. Coach William "Lone Star" Dietz, out of the Carlisle Indian School, and his Cougar squad served as extras in the football film "Tom Brown of Harvard" each morning, then practiced for the bowl game during the afternoon. Each WSU player earned \$100 for the 14 mornings of movie work. During practice sessions, Dietz appeared in his "classic" coaching attire: a silk hat, Prince Albert cutaway coat, striped pants, vellow gloves, and a walking stick. Originally known as the Pasadena Tournament of Roses East-West game (it was 1923 when the real Rose Bowl facility was completed that the name changed), the WSU-Brown game was played at Tournament Park.

Alabama's coach was Wallace Wade, who had been a member of the Brown University team that lost to WSU in the 1916 Rose Bowl. Wade, during his career, coached in five Rose Bowls.

"Babe" Hollingbery's fifth Cougar team went a perfect 9-0-0 to earn a Rose Bowl berth in 1930, including a 6-0 mark during the Pacific Coast Conference schedule. Two members of the WSU team later earned recognition in the College Football Hall of Fame, Mel Hein and Glen "Turk" Edwards.



Three games in one was more than the 52,000-plus fans at San Diego's Jack Murphy Stadium paid for, but three games is what they saw as the Brigham Young Cougars held on to defeate the Washington State Cou-gars 38-36. The BYU squad won the first game, a 31-minute affair that generated a 31-7 lead for the team from Provo. The next 25 minutes just as convincingly belonged to WSU 29-7. In the end, however, the game belonged to BYU as much for defense as any-thing. They stopped the Pullman team with just over three minutes to play by forcing a punt, then ran out the clock to preserve the win. Jim McMahon, in his last collegiate game, completed 27 of 43 passes for 342 yards and three touchdowns. More importantly, he did not throw an interception. The



WSU Cougars used the running of Don LaBomme and quarterback RickyTurner to baffle the BYU team, especially in the second half.Turner gained 92 yards in 12 carries and scored twice, while LaBomme added 79 yards in 14 carries and scored once. Robert Williams and Mike Martin also scored for the Cougars. WSU's failure on a two-point conversion late in the third quarter, an interception BYU's Ron Holmoe returned 35 yards for a touchdown on the third play of the third quarter, and a key sack of Casper on WSU's last possession loomed big in a game that had numerous turning points.



Washington State scored 24 secondquarter points and forced a lastsecond Houston turnover in notching a 24-22 win over the Texan Cougars Christmas Day. The bowl appearance was WSU's second of the 1980s and was WSU's second of the 1980s and evened the Cougars bowl record to 2-2. In a close game there are many heros, but for WSU, none stood out more than senior Victor Wood. He picked up a fumble early in the second quarter and zipped five yards for a touchdown that put his Cougars ahead 7-3. On WSU's next possession, Wood caught a 15-yard scoring pass from Timm Rosenbach to put WSU up 14-3 and well on its way to a bowl victory viewed by a national ABC-TV audience. Wood's heroics were catching as WSU added a Jason Hanson 33-yard field goal and another

touchdown, this one by Rosenbach, before halftime to put Washington State in command 24-9. WSU limited the Texas visitors to just five first half firstdowns, 46 yards rushing, and 77 yards passing before intermission. The Cougars picked off two Houston passes, one each by Shawn Landrum and Vernon Todd. In the end, however, it was Tuineau Alipate's hard hit that forced a Houston fumble recovered by Artie Holmes at the WSU five yard line. James Dixon was the recipient of Alipate's jarring tackle after catching a David Dacus pass over the middle that appeared for a moment to set up a potential game-winning score by Houston. The Cougars then controlled the ball for the final 2:44, with a key six-yard Rosenbach to Tim Stallworth pass giving WSU the much-needed first down just before the game ended.



1992 COPPER BOWL

#18 WSU 31, UTAH 28

Perhaps no college bowl game following the 1992 gridiron season was more offensive minded than the Copper Bowl matchup between WSU and Utah, but after all the running and passing that accounted for more than 1,100 yards, the deciding play was a 22-yard field goal by WSU's Aaron Price. The Cougars scored 21 unanswered points in the first quarter and one additional score just before halftime for a 28-14 lead. WSU then held on until Price gave them their final lead with 5:08 to play. Even then, they had to watch anxiously as Chris Yergensen's 20-yard chip shot sailed wildly to the left with 3:18 remaining. Though the 40,000-plus fans left the stadium talking about the offensive plays that stood out, it was WSU's defense in the fourth quarter that made this win possible. The Utes scored twice in the second quarter and added



two more scores to pull even with a quarter to play. Both teams then turned to their defenses. The key play came with 6:29 to play when Utah's Frank Dolce avoided a strong WSU rush and hooked up with Henry Lusk on a short sideline pass. John Rushing then stripped Lusk of the ball and Singor Mobley scooped it up at the Utah 36 yard line. Fifteen yards later, at the Utah 21, Mobley was dragged down, setting up the Cougars with great field position. Drew Bledsoe immediately drove the Cougars to the Utah five yard line before turning the scoring chores over to Price. Like he did the closing seconds of WSU's 23-20 win over Arizona in the same stadium early in the season, Price came through with the kick. Bledsoe completed 30 of 46 passes for a school record 476 yards. Phillip Bobo caught TD passes of 87 (equalling a school record) and 48 yards, and Shaumbe Wright- Fair picked up 123 yards rushing and scored on a pair of three-yard line smashes.



1994 ALAMO BOWL

#24 WSU 10, BAYLOR 3

The Washington State offense scored on the opening drive of the game and on the last play of the second quarter to provide all the points the Cougar defense needed as WSU held off Baylor's late challenge in a 10-3 win at the second annual Builders Square Alamo Bowl before a crowd of 44,106. Despite some anxious moments in the closing seconds of the game, the Cougar defense made those 10 points stand up by limiting the record-setting Bear offense to eight first downs, 151 yards in total offense and just one field and. The total offense and just one field goal. The Cougars did something against Baylor they had not done all season, take the opening kickoff and drive the length of the field for a touchdown. The drive totaled 91 yards, equalling the longest scoring drive of the season, and ended when Kevin Hicks busted through the



left side of the line from one yard out to put WSU on top 7-0. The score came six minutes, 32 seconds after the kickoff. WSU's offense provided three more points just before halftime to give the Cougs a 10-0 lead at intermission. Taking the ball after Baylor's Jarvis VanDyke missed his second field goal attempt of the first half, WSU drove from its own 30 yard line to the Baylor 20 yard line, where Tony Truant banged home a 37-yard field goal with two seconds left in the first half. A sideline pass to Jay Dumas for a key first down, then another similar pass to Albert Kennedy put the ball in perfect position for Truant. Davis, named the game's most valuable offensive player, hit six of eight passes on the drive. Davis, who completed 27 of 35 passes for 286 yards, gave Cougar fans a few anxious minutes in the third quarter when he took a hard blow to the back while scrambling out of the pocket. He was able to return one play later and finished the game. Defensively WSU was especially tough in the first later and finished the game. Defensively WSU was especially tough in the first half. Baylor came into the game averaging nearly 33 points per game and 382.4 yards per contest. In the first half WSU's defense, led by the game's most valuable defensive player, Ron Childs, limited the Bears to just 41 net yards, 24 rushing and 17 passing. Childs had 10 tackles in the game, including eight solo, of which two were for negative yardage. Only on its last possession did Baylor come close to the WSU endzone, where Todd Jensen, a senior who backed up John Rushing all year, picked off a Jeff Watson pass to halt any Baylor hope of scoring. The bowl victory was WSU's second in the last three years and third in seven years. Joining Childs defensively were Chris Hayes with seven tackles, Mark Fields with six and Chad Eaton with five.

1997 ROSE BOWL

#1 MICHIGAN 21, #8 WSU 16

January 1, 1998, Pasadena, Calif. - The Washington State Cougars, making their first Rose Bowl appearance in 67 years, pushed national champion and number one ranked Michigan to the last play of the game before falling to the Wolverines 21-16 before 101,219 fans and a world-wide television audience. The victory left Michigan a perfect 13-0 for the season, bumping the Cougars to a 10-2 record. After Michigan thwarted two WSU drives to start the game, the Cougar defense forced a Wolverine punt that would set up WSU's first scoring drive. The Cougs took over on the Michigan 47-yard-line with 6:26 to play in the first quarter. Ryan Leaf completed two passes during the drive, including a 15-yard touchdown toss to Kevin McKenzie with 3:17 left in the first quarter. Rian Lindell's point-after gave WSU the early 7-0 advantage. WSU came close to taking a 14-point lead, but Heisman Trophy winner Charles Woodson halted a WSU drive in the Michigan endzone when he intercepted a Leaf pass from the 12 yard line. The Wol-



verine's answering scoring drive began from their own 34-yard-line at the 8:04 mark in the second quarter and ended with a 58-yard pass from Bob Griese to Tai Streets that completed the first half scoring. Early in the second half, WSU took over 99 yards from the endzone after Michigan's Jason Vinson dropped a perfect punt just outside the endzone. Shawn Tims put the finishing touches on WSU's 99 yard drive in nine plays, taking a reverse handoff the final 14 yards. Leaf hit four of five passes in the drive that amassed 73 yards. Lindell's PAT attempt was blocked by Michigan's James Hall, leaving the WSU advantage at 13-7. The Wolverines responded immediately, moving the ball on their next possession to their 39 yard-line to set up another Griese-to-Streets touchdown combination, this time 58 yards. Baker's point-after gave Michigan their first lead, 14-13 with 6:07 left in the third quarter. Michigan then padded their lead with a 14-play, 77-yard drive that ended in Griese's third touchdown pass of the game, a 23-yarder to Jerame Tuman. Baker's extra-point kick increased the Michigan advantage to 21-13 with 11:21 to play. Washington State responded immediately with an eight-play, 49-yard drive that set up a 48-yard field goal by Lindell, cutting Michigan's lead to five points, 21-16 with 7:25 remaining. The Wolverines then put together a 51-yard drive that consumed almost seven minutes off the game clock. When Jay Feely's pooch punt rolled dead at the WSU seven-yard-line, the Cougars' victory hopes were 93 yards and 29 seconds away. After two incomplete passes, the Cougars faced third-and-10 with only 16 seconds left. Leaf then found Nian Taylor along the sideline for a gain of 46, to the Michigan 47-yard-line. After a delay of game penalty, Leaf hit Love Jefferson at the Michigan 25 and the Coug tight end lateraled to a streaking Jason Clayton, who managed nine more yards before being brought down in bounds at Michigan's 16 yard line with 0:02 on the game clock. Out of timeouts, WSU was forced to try and spike the ball on first-down, but officials ruled that the final two seconds slipped away before the ball was effectively downed, thus preventing WSU's one final shot at a major upset.





#8 OKLAHOMA 34, #7 WSU 14

January 1, 2003, Pasadena, Calif. – Oklahoma's vaunted defense stifled Washington State's high-flying passing attack and captured the 89th Rose Bowl Game 34-14 in front of 86,848 fans New Year's Day. The Sooners broke the game open with a pair of touchdowns inside the twominute mark of the first half. The first came on a 12-yard touchdown pass from Nate Hybl, the game's most valuable player. Antonio Perkins extended OU's lead to 17-0 with a 51-yard punt return just :42 seconds later. Hybl connected on 19 of 29 passes for 240 yards and two touchdowns. Sooner running back Quentin Griffin carried the ball 30 times for 144 yards. WSU guarterback Jason Gesser finished his career by completing 17 of 34 passes



for 240 yards and a touchdown. Sammy Moore provided the game's final highlight, returning an OU kick 89 yards for a score with just 1:15 remaining. Linebacker Teddy Lehman led the Big XII Champions with six tackles, including two sacks, while free safety Erik Coleman recorded 10 tackles and recovered a fumble for the Cougars.



Kegel lined up under center, but instead of taking the snap, ran in motion to the right sideline, leaving running back Jonathan Smith alone in the


NATIONAL AWARD WINNERS

Elson S. Floyd is Washington State University's 10th president. He took office in May of 2007 after serving as president of the four-campus University of Missouri System during 2002-2007.

"Excellence, quality, and accountability" are keystones to his administration leading WSU. He puts high priority on WSU being a research leader and having a global presence. Furthermore, he endorses diversity of thought, opinion, perspective, viewpoints, race and ethnicity as characteristics of a world-class university.

Floyd served as president of Western Michigan University from 1999 to 2002, and held several administrative positions at the University of North Carolina Chapel Hill, including deanships in student affairs and the College of Arts and Sciences.

Previously, he spent two years as executive director of the state of Washington Higher Education Coordinating Board, the agency responsible for statewide coordination, planning, oversight, policy

analysis and student financial aid programs for Washington's postsecondary education system. From 1990 to 1993, he served as vice president for student services, vice president for administration and executive vice president at Eastern Washington University.

He began his career in 1978 at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, where he held deanships in the Division of Student Affairs, the General College and the College of Arts and Sciences. From 1988 to 1990, he was assistant vice president for student services for the UNC system office, where he helped develop and articulate student affairs and academic affairs policy for the 16-campus university system.

A native of Henderson, N.C., Floyd holds a bachelor of arts degree in political science and speech, a master of education degree in adult education, and a doctor of philosophy degree in higher and adult education, all from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill.

Floyd and his wife, Carmento Floyd, have two grown children.







William H. (Bill) Moos began his duties as Washington State University Athletics Director April 15, 2010. Moos, a WSU Distinguished Alumnus Award recipient, was named athletics director by WSU President Elson S. Floyd Feb. 24, 2010.

Since arriving in Pullman Moos has wasted no time in making his impact felt in Cougar Athletics, spearheading a department-wide rebranding effort with Nike while securing a 10-year, \$35 million marketing rights agreement with IMG College. In addition he gained Regents approval for a nearly \$126 million addition and remodel of Martin Stadium, featuring a remodeled press box with luxury seating, including suites, loge boxes and club room. Also included in the project is an 80,000-square-foot football operations building which will serve as the stadium's showpiece, which broke ground in January, 2013.

As the dean of Pac-12 athletic directors, Moos was at the forefront of the conference's procurement of a 12-year, \$3 billion television contract with FOX and ESPN, a landmark agreement in college athletics. In the three years under Moos' direction, the Cougar Athletic Fund's Annual Giving program has seen an 81 percent increase in gifts while CAF donor members have risen from nearly 4,000 to more than 6,000. Additional facility enhancements under Moos include a center hung video board in Beasley Coliseum which was installed prior to the 2011-12 season, giving Cougar Basketball one of the premier fan experiences in the conference. An indoor golf hitting facility was also completed in early 2013.

Moos has enjoyed a long and distinguished career in collegiate athletics, serving as the University of Oregon director of athletics from 1995-2007. While at Oregon he oversaw a 17-sport athletic department that grew to national prominence during his tenure.

Oregon's annual athletic department budget grew from \$18.5 million in his first year to more than \$40 million by 2007, becoming 100 percent self-sufficient during that time. Under his direction the Duck Fund donor base increased from 4,930 to 12,290, resulting in an annual gifts increase from \$4.1 million to \$15.3 million.

Moos initiated more than \$160 million in facility improvements while at Oregon. Included in that was the \$90 million Autzen Stadium renovation in 2002, which added 12,000 new seats, 32 new suites, a new Club at Autzen and a new press box to the stadium. In his 12 years the Ducks ranked first in Pac-10 football attendance 11 times, reaching 100 percent capacity in each of those seasons.

Additional facility improvements included the opening of the \$14.6 million Ed Moshofsky Sports Center and Papé and Kilkenny Fields project, as well as an expansion of the varsity athletic weight room, indoor and outdoor tennis facilities, and renovations to McArthur Court and Hayward Field.

During Moos' tenure, Oregon athletics captured 13 Pac-10 championships across six different sports. He increased opportunities for women by adding two intercollegiate programs, soccer and lacrosse, and negotiated an all-inclusive shoe and apparel contract with Nike, one of only 14 in the country at the time.

From an academic standpoint during Moos' tenure, Oregon student-athletes collected 722 academic all-conference selections, 34 Academic All-America selections, nine NCAA post Graduate Scholars and one NCAA Top VIII Award. Moos assumed the duties of director of athletics in July

1995, after five years in the same position at the University of Montana. During his Montana tenure, he created an academic support program and hired its first athletic academic coordinator, developed a facility enhancement plan that created more than \$4 million in improvements, and lifted the school's fund-raising efforts to show a 300 percent increase in private and corporate gifts.

raising efforts to show a 300 percent increase in private and corporate gifts.

Academically, Montana student-athletes were equally successful as the athletic department achieved a graduation rate 20 percent higher than the general university enrollment. Under Moos' watch Montana garnered 269 academic all-conference selections, five Academic All-Americans and two NCAA Post Graduate Scholar winners.

Moos began his athletics career in 1982 as assistant athletics director at Washington State University and also served as the school's associate director (1988-90). At Washington State, he was director of development for more than five years and associate director for nearly two years, supervising all external operations. Prior to that, he managed and owned private businesses in Washington and Oregon for eight years.

He was a student assistant football coach at Washington State for the 1973 season, then spent part of 1974 in Washington, D.C., serving as a government intern.

Raised on a wheat and cattle ranch in eastern Washington, Moos attended high school in Olympia when his father served in the governor's cabinet.

Moos earned his bachelor's degree in history from WSU and was a threeyear letterman in football before concluding his collegiate career by representing Washington State in the 1972 East-West Shrine all-star game in San Francisco. He served as co-captain on the Cougars' 1972 squad and garnered All-Pac-8 Conference First Team honors.

Moos and his wife Kendra have three daughters: Christa, Brittany and Kaiti; and two sons, Bo and Benjamin.



MIKE MARLOW

Deputy Director of Athletics

When Bill Moos was named Washington State's Director of Athletics in the spring of 2010, he did not wait long to offer Mike Marlow the opportunity to return to his alma matter. As deputy director of athletics, Marlow oversees the marketing, fundraising, ticket operations and communication efforts, as well as serving as the department's liaison to IMG College and the Pac-12 Networks. Additionally, he serves as the athletic director's day- to -day administrator for the WSU football program.

Prior to returning to Pullman, Marlow served for more than 12 years at the University of Oregon as the senior associate athletic director. Starting as a regional fundraiser in 1998, Marlow eventually was promoted to serve as senior associate athletic rirector for external operations. From 1998-2010 Marlow served in a leadership role for a team that produced attendance records in football and men's and women's basketball, tripled annual fundraising numbers, secured major donations necessary for an expanded football stadium, a new basketball arena and a new baseball stadium when the program was reintroduced in 2007.

Before arriving at Oregon, Marlow was the assistant atheltic director at the University of Idaho from 1995-98. While at Idaho he oversaw all fundraising, donor ticketing and supervised regional offices in Boise and Couer d' Alene.

Marlow earned his start in intercollegiate athletics in 1991 when he accepted the position of assistant director of the Grizzly Athletic Association at the University of Montana.

A 1990 graduate of Washington State, Marlow and his wife Barbara Ann have three children: Courtney and Haley, and son Jeffrey.



ANNE McCOY

Deputy Director of Athletics/SW/

Veteran intercollegiate athletics administrator Anne McCoy has served Washington State University since 2001 and was promoted from associate director to senior associate director of athletics in 2004. Her appointment to senior woman administrator came in the summer of 2007 and this past year she was named deputy director of athletics.

In her current capacity she is charged with supervising all aspects of WSU's day-to-day operations along with several areas within the department, including human resources, equipment and computer operations. She also oversees 16 of WSU's 17 athletic programs.

McCoy currently serves on several Pac-12 Conference committees, including Vice President Elect of the Executive Committee, Women's Basketball Tournament, Liaison to Rowing Coaches and the Diversity Leadership Initiative. She is the past chair of the NCAA Women's Rowing Committee and is a past vice president of the Pac-10 Conference.

A Wisconsin native, McCoy earned a bachelor's degree in sports management in 1989 from the University of Massachusetts. While an undergraduate, she worked for the Pittsburgh Penguins professional hockey organization, expanding the club's season ticket base. McCoy also served an internship as the assistant athletic business manager at the University of Connecticut, and was instrumental in designing and implementing a comprehensive computerized budget-tracking system.

McCoy served in several capacities at the University of Maine from 1989-1995, lastly as associate director of athletics and senior woman administrator. At Maine, she supervised men's basketball, men's and women's soccer, men's and women's swimming and softball in addition to the athletic business office, ticket office, retail store and cheerleading staff and operations. She took a similar administrative positive at St. Louis University from 1995-96.

In 1996, McCoy moved west, joining the staff at Portland State University as associate director of athletics and senior woman administrator, and was promoted to senior associate director of athletics in 1998. At PSU, she managed all internal staff and the daily operations of the department, representing the director of athletics as needed. McCoy also supervised men's and women's golf, cross country/track and field, and women's volleyball, soccer, tennis and softball.

McCoy and her husband Brian have two children, daughter Taylor and son Jake.



KEN CASAVANT

Faculty Athletics Representative

Professor Ken Casavant, a member of the Washington State family for 46 years, currently serves as WSU's Faculty Athletics Representative to the Pac-12 Conference and the National Collegiate Athletic Association where he serves as student/athlete advocate. Casavant came to WSU as a graduate research assistant in the Department of Agricultural Economics. He was named an assistant professor in 1971, an associate professor in 1975 and a full professor in 1980.

Casavant currently serves as chair of the Legislative committee for the Pac-12 Conference in addition to serving on the Athletic Directors T.V. committee. For the 2010-11 academic year he served as president of the Pac-10, a role he also served in 2000-01, and recently was on the NCAA Division I Management Council, now serving on the Championship/sports management council.

In 2004, Casavant received the Sahlin Excellence award for Leadership for the University, having had the honor several years earlier of giving the Distinguished Faculty Address, the University's oldest award and also receiving the Sahlin Excellence in Public Service award for the University. In 1979, Casavant received the R.M. Wade award for outstanding teacher in the college of agriculture at WSU, and in 1990, he earned the distinguished WSU Faculty of the Year award. Casavant was elected vice-chair (1991-92) and chair (1992-93) of the WSU Faculty Senate and has been accorded the Distinguished Teacher award by the American Agricultural Economics Association. He was named Distinguished Scholar by the Western Agricultural Economics Association in 2003 for his nationally recognized work as a transportation economist.

During his tenure at WSU, Casavant has served as associate director for the Washington State Transportation Center (1984-87) and the interim Vice-Provost for Academic Affairs and interim Vice-Provost for Research (1998), currently serving as Director of the Freight Policy Transportation Institute.



In addition, a WSU section and archived game podcasts will be highlighted on the 710 Sports page of MyNorthwest. com. The 25-station football network - one of the largest in the Pac-12 - reaches from British Columbia to Oregon and can be heard worldwide via the internet and XM Satellite radio.

IMG College produces the Washington State IMG College Sports Network, which also features radio coverage of WSU men's basketball, baseball, women's basketball and women's volleyball, and the Cougar Coaches Show in the fall and winter seasons.

IMG College, founded in 1992 in its corporate home of Winston-Salem, NC, manages corporate marketing opportunities and on-site promotions at WSU football and basketball games as well as oversees sales for all signage at Martin Stadium, Friel Court at Beasley Coliseum and all Cougar competition sites.

COUGAR FOOTBALL BROADCAST TEAM

BOB ROBERTSON

Hall of fame announcer Bob Robertson Sr. is in his 47th season calling Cougar football action. When Cougar fans gather and talk about Saturday afternoons in the fall on the Palouse, football and Robertson just naturally become part of the conversation. The long-time Cougar broadcaster began his association with WSU football in 1964 and with the exception of a three-year period in 1969-71, he's been calling the Cougar action ever since.

Robertson's peers have selected him Washington Sportscaster of the Year 12 times, validating what Cougar fans have known for years - he is simply the best. In 1995 he was named the State Broadcaster of the Year.

Robertson was inducted into both the WSU Athletic Hall of Fame and the Inland Empire Hall of Fame in 2001-02, and in August 2004 received the prestigious Chris Schenkel Award at ceremonies held at the College Football Hall of Fame in South Bend, Ind. At the same time he became the first broadcaster west of the Mississippi to be inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame - broadcaster division. He is also a member of the Pierce County Hall of Fame.

caster division. He is also a member of the Pierce County Hall of Fame.

Bob's association with WSU runs deeper than just football broadcasts. For 23 years he was the voice of Cougar Basketball, including several NCAA tournament teams. In 1978-79, he was named WSU's Dad of the Year and he also worked with the WSU Cougar Club on the west side in the 1980's.

Robertson was born in Fullerton, Calif., during spring training of the Seattle Indians of the Pacific Coast League. At the time his father was a player for the Seattle club.

After graduating from Blaine (Wash.) High School, he attended Western Washington University in Bellingham, where he launched his broadcasting career. His first broadcasting exposure came as a young actor for the Canadian Broadcasting Company in Vancouver, B.C., then bloomed while attending college.

In 1948 Robertson signed to play professional baseball, but a year later gave up playing to become the voice of the Wenatchee Chiefs of the Western International League, his first full-time broadcasting opportunity.

Among his many accomplishments, Robertson has:

- Spent 25 years calling Pacific Coast League baseball in Seattle and Tacoma
- Broadcast professional soccer in Seattle, Tacoma and Portland; he was Washington's Soccer Man of the Year in 1983
- Broadcast hockey, boxing, wrestling and hydroplane races
- Had his "cup of coffee" in major league baseball, broadcasting some Seattle Mariner games in the late 1990's
- Served as television sports anchor in the Seattle market for 25 years, including time with KSTW (called KTNT 1956-70, then KSTW 1976-83) and KMO (he helped put them on the air)
- Currently voice of the Spokane Indians baseball team and Pacific Lutheran University basketball
- Served as the television voice of Notre Dame football and basketball for two years in the 1950's.

In the spring of 2011, Bob's wife, Joanne, passed away after 59 years of marriage. They have four children, Hugh, Janna, John and Rebecca, and seven grandchildren. The Robertsons have resided in Tacoma since 1950, with the exception of his stint with Notre Dame.

As much as Robertson is part of Cougar Football Saturday, so is his closing broadcast signature, "Always be a good sport, be a good sport all ways."

BUD NAMECI

Once Cougar football sideline reporter, KXLY's Bud Nameck transitioned to the booth to call the action for Washington State football in 2012. Bud also handles the network's play-by-play duties during the Cougar men's basketball season. He served as sports director for at KXLY for 13 years, 1982-95, and was the voice of Cougar football for FOX Sports Northwest for 14 years, 1988-2001.

He is currently the Cougars Sports Radio Network Director and resides in Spokane with his wife Diane and daughter Kelsey.

JESSAMYN MCINTYRE

Jessamyn McIntyre returns for her second season as a sideline reporter for Cougar football. Jessamyn serves as executive producer for 710 ESPN Seattle and The Kevin Calabro Show.

SHAWN MCWASHINGTON

Shawn McWashington also returns for his second season in the booth and will provide game analysis for Washington State football in 2013. McWashington was a member of WSU's "Fab Five" receiving corps on the 1997 Rose Bowl team.
