Super Sunday Trilogy: For the second consecutive year, and the third time in the last five years, the Cougars will play on Super Bowl Sunday...last year, WSU fell to UCLA at Los Angeles (68-63) Feb. 6 in a game that was also televised nationally on FSN...the New England Patriots defeated the Philadelphia Eagles 24-21 in Super Bowl XXXIX that day...back in 2002, WSU also played at L.A., Super Sunday, this time against USC, Feb. 3...the Cougars lost to the Women of Troy 79-38 while in Super Bowl XXXVI, the Patriots defeated the St. Louis Rams 20-17.

About Washington: Cameo Hicks leads the Huskies in scoring with a 14.7 points a game average...Washington is coming off a 67-61 loss to Arizona State at Seattle, Jan. 28...the Huskies have alternated between a loss and a win the last five games.

Series With UW: Washington leads the all-time series with WSU 52-17...the Huskies have won the last 21 in the series...the Cougars have captured two wins in last 49 meetings dating back to 1982...WSU defeated UW 75-72, Jan. 9, 1993 at Seattle and the Cougars took a 72-67 win over UW, Feb. 25, 1995 at Pullman.

Last Time Out: The last Cougar-Husky match-up was one of the closest in recent years, when UW escaped with a 73-70 victory at Pullman, Jan. 7...the margin of victory was the closest in nearly six years (Feb. 6, 2000; UW defeated WSU 56-55 at Seattle)...both teams had four players in double figures...Charmaine Jones poured in a game-high 18 points while the Huskies were led by Andrea Plouffe's 16 points...the Cougars out-shot the Huskies 56 percent to 39 percent for the game, but Washington won the rebounding battle 33-29 and had fewer turnovers (11) than WSU (18).

Seeing Double: Senior Keisha Moore and junior Kate Benz each scored a double-double in the Cougars' 84-77 victory over Arizona, Jan. 28... Moore had 28 points and 12 boards, both WSU career-bests, while Benz scored a career-high 24 points while also adding 11 rebounds... the duo led an offensive attack that scored the most points in a game since a 93-86 victory over, coincidentally, Arizona, Feb. 10, 2001 at Beasley... Benz has four double-doubles on the season and Moore has two... coincidentally, the other time the tandem of Moore and Benz tallied double-doubles in the same game this season came against Arizona at Tucson, Dec. 29... in that game, Benz had 11 points and 11 rebounds and Moore added 11 points and 10 rebounds.

Lucky Seven: WSU surpassed its win total from each of the past two seasons after beating Arizona to earn its seventh victory... the Cougars won six games each of the two previous seasons... the last time the Cougars won more than seven games in a season was the 2000-01 campaign (11).

Stratton Ends Career: Due to a right foot injury that occurred during the 2003-04 season, redshirt sophomore Nikki Stratton has decided to end her collegiate basketball career... Stratton redshirted the 2004-05 season for medical reasons and played 13 games this season, averaging 4.2 points a game... Stratton has an injury to a sesamoid bone on her right foot... she will remain with the team, possibly in a student-assistant capacity.

Injury Update: Senior guard Charmaine Jones sustained a right high ankle sprain versus USC, Jan. 12 and is expected to be out another 2-4 weeks... sophomore Brynn Bemis sustained a left ankle injury at practice Tuesday and is out indefinitely... junior guard Adriane Ferguson, who missed 12 games with a broken right

Benz Moves Up: Junior Kate Benz has already made her way into the school's career top-10 rebounding list...currently, Benz has 628 career boards, which is seventh all-time in school history, and is 18 rebounds behind sixth position (Karen Brown, 1979-1983)...the all-time career rebounding leader in WSU history is Cassandra Overby, who pulled down 875 rebounds from 1981-84...Benz, the defending Pac-10 rebounding champion, leads the conference in rebounds (9.4/game) this season...she also leads the conference in defensive rebounds (6.75).

20/20: Freshman Amanda DuRocher has scored in double figures six of the last seven games...during the stretch, DuRocher tallied a season-high 20 points against UCLA, Jan. 14...DuRocher shot 7-of-13 from the field, including three treys, en route to posting the second 20-point performance by a Cougar freshman this season (Katie Appleton scored 20 at Boise State, Dec. 4)...DuRocher's previous season-best scoring effort came at Boise State (19 points)...is seventh in the conference in 3-point field goals made (1.89/game).

Moore Points: Keisha Moore has scored in double figures in 10 games this season...highlighted among those games was a career-best 28-point performance versus Arizona, Jan. 28...also grabbed 12 rebounds against the Wildcats to secure her second double-double of the season...Moore reached double figures in four straight games from Dec. 29 to Jan. 7...during the stretch, Moore averaged 14.8 points and 7.3 rebounds a game...Moore secured her first double-double of the season, and her Cougar career, with 11 points and 10 rebounds at Arizona, Dec. 29...two days later at Arizona State, Moore poured in a game-

Coaching Staff: Sherri Murrell, who coached the University of the Pacific to four consecutive winning seasons, is in her fourth season as head coach of the Cougars...while at Pacific, Murrell coached the Tigers to a 68-46 record including a 40-20 mark in Big West Conference play...the Tigers' 19 wins in 2002 were the most wins by the program since 1995...assistant Mark Lewis brings 19 years of coaching experience to the program... Lewis, who is in his fourth season at WSU, spent five years (1996-2001) as an assistant at Arizona State...assistant Lisa Fisher also returns for her fourth season as a Cougar...Fisher served as an assistant on Murrell's staff at the University of the Pacific during the 2001-02 season...prior to coming to Pacific, Fisher coached at Northeastern in Boston, Mass., where she was an assistant during the 2000-01 season...preceding her coaching at Northeastern, Fisher was at Portland State from 1996-2000, where she also worked with Murrell from 1996 to 1998...assistant Tara Jones begins her first season at WSU... Jones was a four-year letterwinner as a guard at Indiana University from 1998-2002... Jones served as an assistant coach at the University of South Florida for two seasons... Scott Moore is in his first season as the director of basketball operations... Moore returns to WSU after spending last season as a graduate assistant coach at Eastern Washington... Moore served a student manager with WSU for three seasons (2002-04).

Cougar Notes: WSU has played two overtime games this season. The last time the team played multiple overtime games in a season was the 1991-92 campaign. WSU played three extra sessions that season, going 2-1... seven Cougars matched or bested their season or career highs in at least one category during last week's games with Arizona and Arizona State... with a 12-point effort at Eastern Washington, Jan. 3, Nikki Stratton became the ninth Cougar to score in double-digits in a game this season... 10 players have started at least one game for WSU... Benz is the only player to start every game... the 6-1 start was WSU's best since beginning the 1994-95 season with a 7-1 mark... freshman Ebonee Coates is 10th in the Pac-10 in blocks (.89/game).

Ranked Opposition: WSU has played four games against Associated Press ranked opponents thus far this season... WSU fell to No. 19 Arizona State, 75-65, at Pullman, Jan. 26... the Cougars played three AP top-25 opponents in December... WSU lost to No. 11 Arizona State 72-47 at Tempe, New Year's Eve... the Cougars fell to No. 14 Minnesota 83-57 at Minneapolis, Dec. 10... in the conference opener against No. 10 Stanford, WSU fell to the Cardinal 76-56 at Pullman, Dec. 20... the last ranked opponent the Cougars defeated was No. 22/19 (AP/USA Today) Arizona, 93-86, at Pullman, Feb. 10, 2001.

Double-Digit Jones: Prior to sustaining a high ankle sprain against USC, Jan. 12, senior Charmaine Jones returned to action in a big way by scoring a game-high 18 points (14 in the second half) in the 73-70 loss to Washington, Jan. 7...prior to the UW game, Jones missed the Cougars' last two games due to a concussion she sustained at Arizona Dec. 29...it was Jones' seventh double-digit scoring game of the season...Jones was as warm as the Hawaii weather at the Wahine Classic, Thanksgiving weekend...Jones scored in double figures in all three games of the tournament, averaging 14.7 points a contest.

Hawaii 21-B: Kate Benz pulled down a total of 50 rebounds (for a 16.7 per game average) en route to earning an all-tournament team selection at the 27th Hawaiian Airlines Rainbow Wahine Classic in Honolulu, Hawaii, Nov. 25-27...the junior from Portland, Ore., pulled down a career-best 21 rebounds — just one shy of the school record — in the Cougars' 74-51 win over Idaho State, Nov. 26...the WSU single-game school rebounding record is 22 - set by Jennifer Grey twice in 1975 and matched by Amy Saneholtz 20 years later...although Benz just missed the school's rebound mark, she did establish a WSU defensive rebound single-game standard with 17 (shattering the previous mark of 13 set by three players, including Benz) and the Wahine Classic record for rebounds in a game (previously 19)...Benz is just the third player to record 20 or more rebounds in a game in WSU history...along with Saneholtz's 1995 performance, Grey hit the 20-rebound barrier four times in 1975...Benz, whose previous career-high was 19 rebounds against San Diego State in 2003, had secured her 10th rebound just over 11 minutes in to the first half...Benz ended the first 20 minutes with 15 rebounds...with 12 points, Benz posted her 13th career double-double and her second of the season...sandwiched around the 21-rebound performance was a 15-rebound effort in a 68-63 loss to Hawaii, Nov. 25 and a 14-rebound game in a 65-64 win over Cal-State Northridge, Nov. 27.

Trifecta: The 66-57 victory over Pepperdine, Nov. 18 was the third consecutive season-opening victory for the Cougars...the last time the program strung together three straight season-opening wins was from the 1990-91 season through the 1992-93 campaign.

Third-Largest Attendance: The crowd of 6,532 at the Dec. 10 WSU-Minnesota game was the third-largest audience that the team has played in front of...the largest attendance figure at a WSU game was 6,746, Jan. 27, 1996 at Stanford...the second largest was 6,608, Feb. 26, 1994 at Washington.

Overtime Thriller: In the Cougars' 80-76 overtime win over Boise State, Dec. 4, the freshmen duo of Katie Appleton and Amanda DuRocher combined for 39 points...Appleton scored 20 points - including nine in overtime - while DuRocher contributed 19 points, a point total that was primarily accounted for by five 3-pointers...it was the program's first overtime win since Dec. 22, 1996 (coincidentally, defeated Boise State 79-78 at Boise).

Cougars Sweep Exhibition Slate: Propelled by a pair of 13-0 runs, the Cougars defeated Baden Sports 73-58 in an exhibition game Oct. 31 at Friel Court... junior Adriane Ferguson (Spokane, Wash.) led a quartet of Cougars who scored in double figures with 19 points... freshman Katie Appleton (14 points), junior Kate Benz (13 points) and senior Charmaine Jones (11 points) also reached double-digits in points... WSU made it two in a row with a 65-57 win over Lewis-Clark State Nov. 11 at Bohler Gym... Keisha Moore recorded a double-double of 15 points and 10 rebounds while Adriane Ferguson added 14 points for WSU... Ferguson completed the exhibition season averaging 16.5 points a game.
